25 Thank you so much, sir.

2 I would like to dispense with
3 the regular order of business at this
4 time to welcome all the guests and
5 visitors here today. We really
6 appreciate you taking time out of your
7 busy day to come down and watch your
8 government in action. We hope we do our
9 business in a way that you feel
10 comfortable with, and we hope that we do
11 it in a way that will make you want to
12 come back again. So, again, thank you
13 all so much for coming down.

14 At this time, the Chair
15 recognizes Councilman Johnson, who will
16 present a resolution honoring Mothers in
17 Charge.

18 Would Ms. Dorothy Johnson
19 Speight and those accompanying her please
20 join the Councilman at the podium.

21 COUNCILWOMAN BROWN:

22 Mr. President?

23 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Yes.

24 The Chair recognizes Councilwoman Brown.

25 COUNCILWOMAN BROWN: Yes,

2 Mr. President. While we await that
3 important citation saluting one of the
4 citizens in our city, I wanted to join
5 you in welcoming Ms. Bonnie Lucas, a
6 member of the Philadelphia More Beautiful
7 Committee for more than 20 years. She is
8 a block captain. She's on the ground, in
9 the trenches, doing good work in
10 Councilman Squilla's district, and she's
11 also a member of Mothers in Charge. So
12 we join you in welcoming Ms. Lucas to
13 City Council.

14 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

15 Thank you, Councilwoman. Thank you so
16 much.

17 Councilman Johnson is joined by
18 Councilman O'Brien, Councilman Goode,
19 Councilman Jones, Councilwoman Bass,
20 Councilman Henon, and Councilman Squilla.

21 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Good
22 morning.

23 (Good morning.)

24 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Thank you,
25 Mr. President.

2 Today I am truly honored and
3 privileged to have this opportunity to
4 honor and recognize a group of
5 passionate, committed, and courageous
6 women. They go out into the communities
7 throughout the City of Philadelphia day
8 by day addressing the issue of youth gun
9 violence. And so in my prior life as a
10 community organizer and my efforts
11 through Peace Not Guns, I have come to
12 know first and foremost the founder,
13 Ms. Dorothy Speight Johnson, but also the
14 members based upon their effort to do
15 solely nothing but bring a sense of peace
16 in the City of Philadelphia and
17 encouraging other mothers who suffer from
18 senseless acts of violence to be
19 courageous as they live their lives.

20 And so I am honored to present
21 a resolution to Mothers in Charge on
22 behalf of the members of City Council,
23 and I thank all my colleagues for
24 standing here with me today.

25 And the resolution reads:

2 Honoring, recognizing and commending
3 Mothers in Charge for its leadership in
4 providing community advocacy and support
5 in the fight to end violent crimes.

6 Whereas, Mothers in Charge is a
7 grassroots organization whose mission
8 focuses on violence prevention through
9 education and intervention for children,
10 young adults, families and community
11 organizations; and

12 COUNCILMAN JONES: Whereas,
13 after the murder of her
14 twenty-four-year-old son in 2003, Dorothy
15 Johnson Speight founded Mothers in Charge
16 as a support organization for families to
17 come together in the fight against gun
18 violence; and

19 COUNCILMAN O'BRIEN: Whereas,
20 most of the members of Mothers in Charge
21 have experienced the horror of having a
22 son, daughter or loved one murdered; and

23 Whereas, Mothers in Charge
24 works with elected officials on
25 legislation to support safe neighborhoods

2 and communities for children and families
3 and collaborates with community and
4 faith-based organizations; and

5 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Whereas,
6 the passion and drive exhibited by
7 Mothers in Charge comes from within,
8 because each one of these brave women has
9 found the strength to attempt to turn a
10 personal tragedy into a medium for
11 change; and

12 COUNCILMAN HENON: Whereas, as
13 Executive Director and Founder of Mothers
14 in Charge, Ms. Johnson Speight's work has
15 led to national appearances and
16 presentations throughout the United
17 States and abroad; and

18 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Whereas,
19 Mothers in Charge has received many
20 recognitions and awards for its work in
21 the community including the Philadelphia
22 Leadership Award Transformer of Grief,
23 the NAACP Exemplary Citizens Award, and
24 recognition from the Philadelphia 76ers;
25 now therefore

2 COUNCILMAN GOODE: Resolved, by
3 the Council of the City of Philadelphia,
4 that we hereby honor, recognize and
5 commend Mothers in Charge, Incorporated
6 for its leadership in providing community
7 advocacy and support in the fight to end
8 violent crime.

9 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Further
10 resolved, that an engrossed copy of this
11 resolution be presented to Mothers in
12 Charge as evidence of the sentiments of
13 this legislative body.

14 I'd like to also do an
15 honorable mention of Councilwoman Jannie
16 Blackwell, who always has been supportive
17 of Mothers in Charge as well, who isn't
18 up here, but I do know at the last
19 banquet we were at, we kind of both came
20 out and showed support.

21 But I wanted to sincerely thank
22 all of you for the work that you do on a
23 daily basis and thank you for ridding our
24 streets of gun violence. I want to
25 present this citation on behalf of the

4 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
5 Chair recognizes Ms. Speight for remarks.

6 MS. SPEIGHT: Good morning. I
7 want to, on behalf of members of Mothers
8 in Charge, thank you for this honor.
9 This truly is a true honor to Mothers in
10 Charge to receive this special
11 recognition.

12 We are on the front lines every
13 day working to make a difference with the
14 issue of violence in our city, but not
15 only in our city, across this country.
16 Mothers in Charge is now a national
17 movement. We're located in several
18 cities throughout this country, because
19 it's not just a Philadelphia problem.
20 And I just really want to thank the
21 courageous women that make up the
22 organization Mothers in Charge who are
23 working tirelessly every day to save
24 lives. We can't bring back our children,
25 but we're working every day to make a

3 the City and across this country. And,
4 again, I thank City Council for this
5 honor and this recognition.

11 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

12 Thank you.

13 At this time, the Chair
14 recognizes Councilwoman Blackwell, who
15 will present a resolution recognizing
16 November 12th to November 16th as Back on
17 My Feet National Sneaker Week.

18 Would Ms. Jill Fink and those
19 accompanying her please join the
20 Councilwoman at the podium. And joining
21 Councilwoman Blackwell is Councilman Jim
22 Kenney.

23 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL:

24 Resolution recognizing November 12th to
25 November 16th as Back on My Feet National

2 Sneaker Week.

3 Whereas, Back on My Feet is
4 encouraging all employees in the City of
5 Philadelphia to wear sneakers during the
6 week of November 12th to 16th for a \$5
7 contribution to the organization Back on
8 My Feet; and

9 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Whereas,
10 November 12th to 16th is also National
11 Hunger and Homeless Awareness Week; and

12 Whereas, in 2011, more than 300
13 companies and offices participated in
14 Sneaker Week and found Sneaker Week easy
15 to implement; and

16 Whereas, Back on My Feet is a
17 national non-profit organization that's
18 dedicated to creating independence and
19 self-sufficiency in the lives of those
20 experiencing homelessness and other
21 underserved populations by first engaging
22 them in running as a means to build
23 confidence, strength and self-esteem; and

24 Whereas, after launching in
25 Philadelphia in July 2007, the

2 organization has expanded to Baltimore;
3 Washington, DC; Boston; Chicago; Dallas;
4 Indianapolis; Atlanta; and New York City;

5 COUNCILWOMAN BROWN: And
6 whereas, Founder and CEO, Anne Mahlum,
7 has led the organization to grow to a
8 staff of over 40 professionals, with
9 thousands of volunteers and hundreds of
10 members; and

11 Whereas, the organization's
12 mission is not to create runners within
13 the homeless population, but to create
14 self-sufficiency in the lives of those
15 experiencing homelessness by using
16 running as a vehicle; and

17 Whereas, the program's success
18 is measured by how many members achieve
19 independence through employment and
20 housing; and

21 Whereas, 626 residential
22 members have obtained employment, and 421
23 residential members have obtained housing
24 since September 2008; and

25 Whereas, Back on My Feet takes

2 pride in promoting healthy lifestyles and
3 making a difference in the communities in
4 which they work and serve; now therefore

5 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL:

6 Resolved, that the Council of the City of
7 Philadelphia, recognizes the week of
8 November 12th to 16th as Back on My Feet
9 Sneaker Week.

10 Further resolved that an
11 engrossed copy of this resolution be
12 presented to Anne Mahlum, Jill Fink and
13 others, and Back on My Feet has a
14 profound expression of this Council's
15 appreciation for all that they do.

16 Let me note that this was
17 introduced by certainly Councilman Jim
18 Kenney, who told me about this
19 organization first off, Councilwoman
20 Blondell Reynolds Brown, and myself and
21 agreed to by each and every member of
22 City Council.

23 (Applause.)

24 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
25 Chair recognizes Ms. Fink for remarks.

2 MS. FINK: Good morning. Thank
3 you all for coming out for this
4 resolution and for recognizing the work
5 of Back on My Feet.

6 I do hope that all of you will
7 be showing up to work in your sneakers,
8 perhaps on that last Friday of Sneaker
9 Week or all week, should you choose to do
10 so. I think it actually makes employees
11 much more productive to wear your
12 sneakers. You're much more comfortable
13 throughout the day.

14 So if there is -- a couple
15 things that I can just tell you about
16 Back on My Feet in addition to running,
17 which is obviously the first and foremost
18 thing that we do. We do also provide job
19 readiness, workforce development skills,
20 financial literacy training. And two
21 things that I think that really set Back
22 on My Feet apart from other social
23 service agencies that are doing
24 tremendous work in the City are the
25 financial aid component of the work that

2 we do, where members have the ability
3 through participation in the program to
4 earn up to \$1,250 in financial aid that
5 they can use to remove the financial
6 hurdles that are preventing them from
7 moving their lives forward.

8 For the amount of money that
9 many of us would have in our pockets or
10 would easily be able to get from an ATM
11 machine can mean the difference between
12 someone being able to take a step forward
13 to get a uniform for a new job, to buy
14 sneakers or work clothing for employment.

15 And then the second thing is
16 really just the social engagement
17 component of the work that we do, working
18 with teams to help individuals to
19 overcome the isolation, despair, and
20 loneliness that they feel, to feel
21 confident in themselves to go out and to
22 be successful.

23 I hope that you will
24 participation in Sneaker Week for a small
25 contribution of \$5 and know that that

2 will go a very long way in supporting us
3 and helping Philadelphia's homeless
4 population.

5 Thank you.

6 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

7 Thank you.

8 (Applause.)

9 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
10 Chair would like to recognize Councilman
11 Kenney and then Councilwoman Brown.

12 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Thank you,
13 Mr. President.

14 As a symbol of our support for
15 the organization and a tangible show of
16 support for the group and their work,
17 we've asked -- Councilwoman Blackwell has
18 asked every Councilmember to bring a pair
19 of running shoes today to donate to their
20 cause. It's not all they need, but it's
21 certainly a symbol of what we believe is
22 a great organization doing great work in
23 the City. So I hope everyone has got
24 their sneakers here today.

25 COUNCILWOMAN BROWN: I join

2 Councilman Kenney and X number of years
3 going in 2007 when I first learned of
4 Back on My Feet, and then actually got
5 out and did -- I don't run. I did a
6 power walk with Anne. And you should
7 know that Anne was one of the young women
8 we saluted with our Next Generation of
9 Leaders effort that we do every March,
10 because she's under 40 doing enormously
11 wonderful work, and then the very next
12 year CNN picked up her great story and
13 she became one of the 25 finalists for
14 the CNN Heroes Program.

15 So the organization is
16 extraordinary, and Anne is just a
17 wonderful woman with vision and wanted to
18 give back and pay it forward at the same
19 time. We salute Back on My Feet.

20 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

21 Thank you.

22 (Applause.)

23 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

24 Council will be at ease.

25 (Council at ease.)

3 Thank you.

4 At this time, the Chair
5 recognizes Councilwoman Bass, who will
6 present a resolution supporting Bilal
7 Qayyum and the Fathers' Day Rally
8 Committee as they convene to present the
9 Call to Action: Black on Black Violence
10 Conference in Philadelphia.

11 Would Mr. Qayyum and those
12 accompanying him please join the
13 Councilwoman at the podium. And also
14 joining the Councilwoman is Councilwoman
15 Blackwell, Councilman Greenlee, and
16 Councilman Jones.

17 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Good
18 morning. It is such an honor to be able
19 to present this next resolution, and it's
20 in honor of Bilal Qayyum and the Fathers'
21 Day Rally Committee and the work that
22 they're doing starting actually tomorrow
23 with the Black on Black Violence
24 Conference here in Philadelphia. And as
25 black on black violence is just something

2 that's happening at an unbelievable rate
3 in our communities, it's something that
4 as the wife of an African American man
5 and the guardian of a young black male in
6 my household, there's not a day that goes
7 by that they leave the house that you
8 worry about their safety and their
9 return, and you hope that they won't fall
10 victim to any of the things that are
11 happening just by happenstance, just by
12 being in the wrong place at the wrong
13 time.

14 So I thought it was critical
15 that we bring attention to this
16 conference that's going to be happening.
17 We certainly hope that everyone can
18 either plan to attend or send someone to
19 attend.

20 And I know that Councilman
21 Jones as the Chair of Public Safety also
22 wanted to make a few opening remarks
23 before we present this citation.

24 COUNCILMAN JONES: Well, it's
25 truly appropriate that Bilal Qayyum be

2 here the same day that Mothers in Charge
3 are being recognized. It's not by chance
4 that the two are related one to the
5 other.

6 We hope sincerely as a part of
7 our reality that teddy bear memorials in
8 communities aren't the new normal, that
9 young people should look at those things
10 as things of compassion, things of
11 comfort as opposed to things of mourning
12 and as makeshift memorials to a tragic
13 death.

14 So we salute Mothers in Charge
15 today, but we salute the bold work that
16 Bilal Qayyum is doing to look deep into
17 the issue, peel down into the weeds to
18 find out what the causes are, but also
19 recommend the solutions, so...

20 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: So we're
21 going to go ahead and present this
22 resolution, and it reads: Supporting
23 Bilal Qayyum and the Fathers' Day Really
24 Committee, Inc., as they convene to
25 present the Call to Action: Black on

2 Black Violence Conference in
3 Philadelphia, Pennsylvania from October
4 26th through October 28th which will
5 explore methods to develop an action plan
6 to reduce violence and crime in the urban
7 areas of the country over a three year
8 period; and

9 Whereas, every year America
10 sees over 51,000 deaths as a result of
11 violence. Over 49 percent of those
12 murdered are Blacks in general and Black
13 males in particular. The U.S. Justice
14 Department determined that Black victims
15 of homicide are most likely to be male,
16 85 percent, and between the ages of 17
17 and 19 years of age, and that's 51
18 percent. The medical and
19 productivity-related cost of violence is
20 estimated to exceed \$70 billion each
21 year; and

22 COUNCILMAN JONES: Whereas, the
23 purpose of this conference is to develop
24 a network of collaborators,
25 communications, and create some action

2 among participants by sharing innovative
3 ideas and examining various preventive
4 models and strategies that are culturally
5 relevant for the Black community. The
6 conference will focus on alternatives to
7 violence among young and highlight
8 successful programs, projects,
9 initiatives that promote new ideas; and

10 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL:
11 Whereas, the goals of the conference are
12 to create a national movement to reduce
13 violence and shootings in the African
14 American communities nationally by
15 twenty-five percent; to study evidence
16 based information and crime prevention
17 programs regarding Black on Black
18 violence that are found to be effective
19 and disseminate this information to
20 cities across the country; and to create
21 a national network of individuals and
22 groups that are working to eradicate the
23 culture of violence and follow up on the
24 outcomes of the conference; and

25 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Whereas,

2 the goals of the conference are to create
3 a national movement to reduce violence
4 and shootings in the African American
5 communities nationally by twenty-five
6 percent; to study evidence based
7 information and crime prevention programs
8 on Black on Black violence that are found
9 to be effective and disseminate this
10 information to cities across the country;
11 and to create a national framework of
12 individuals and groups that are working
13 to eradicate the culture of violence and
14 follow up on the outcomes of the
15 conference; and

16 Whereas, in 1989, Bilal Qayyum
17 founded the Fathers' Day Rally Committee,
18 an organization of Black men that seeks
19 to promote positive images of the Black
20 male. The mission of the Fathers' Day
21 Rally Committee is to promote positive
22 action and interaction among individuals
23 to prompt more aggressive hands on action
24 toward resolving a range of problems
25 confronting African American communities

2 in Philadelphia and Delaware County; and

3 COUNCILWOMAN TASCO: Whereas,

4 Bilal Qayyum, as the President and

5 Founder of the Fathers' Day Rally

6 Committee, has worked tirelessly to

7 diffuse the senseless bloodshed on city

8 streets that lead to the death of Black

9 men throughout Philadelphia. Since 1989,

10 the FDRC has been committed to reducing

11 violence in the minority communities

12 affected by a myriad of social ills. Men

13 working together at the grassroots level

14 can launch a meaningful attack on the

15 negative attitude which contributes to

16 the destruction of families and

17 neighborhoods; now therefore be it

18 resolved

19 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: By the

20 Council of the City of Philadelphia, that

21 it hereby supports Bilal Qayyum and the

22 Fathers' Day Rally Committee,

23 Incorporated, as they convene to present

24 the Call to Action: Black on Black

25 Violence Conference in Philadelphia from

1 10/25/12 - STATED - PRESENTATIONS
2 October 26th through October 28th which
3 will explore methods to develop an action
4 plan to reduce violence and crime in the
5 urban area of the country over a three
6 year period.

7 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Further
8 resolved, that a copy of this resolution
9 be presented to Bilal Qayyum and the
10 Fathers' Day Rally Committee as evidence
11 of the strong support and sincere
12 sentiments of this legislative body.

13 Thank you. Congratulations.

14 (Applause.)

15 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
16 Chair recognizes Mr. Qayyum for remarks.

17 MR. QAYYUM: Good morning.

18 (Good morning.)

19 MR. QAYYUM: With me this
20 morning is Curtis Jones from Philadelphia
21 Safety Net, who is part of the Planning
22 Committee for this conference; Anthony
23 Murphy -- Ray Jones. I knew it was one
24 of the Jones's, since I grew up with them
25 both and I helped raise them. They're

2 like my sons -- (continued) Anthony
3 Murphy from Town Watch; Eric Grimes from

5 I gratefully appreciate
6 Councilwoman Bass and Councilman Jones,
7 Councilman Johnson, Councilwoman
8 Blackwell, Councilwoman Tasco, Councilman
9 Greenlee for joining and also the other
10 members of Council for this resolution
11 this morning.

12 I had been -- and a lot of
13 folks know -- on the front line in this
14 city for over 40 years trying to reduce
15 violence, and it's come to my attention
16 over the last couple years that it's not
17 only a Philadelphia problem, but a
18 national problem. And it's also -- even
19 though this is built as a Call for
20 Action: National Conference on Black on
21 Black Violence, black on black violence
22 is also an American problem.

23 So I had a radio interview I
24 was participating in Sunday at a radio
25 station in New York and I talked about

2 that, about how important this is an
3 American problem. And we have a tendency
4 as people, and particularly in the black
5 community, to think that America doesn't
6 care about black on black violence.

7 So part of this conference is
8 to put this issue on the front burner,
9 and we are calling for all Americans to
10 support this issue of reducing homicides
11 in America. When we look at 50 percent
12 of all citizens are black folks are dying
13 on the streets across America, it is an
14 American problem. It's just not a black
15 problem. It's a Latino problem,
16 Councilwoman, as you know. Councilman
17 Oh, it's an Asian problem. Councilman
18 Green, good friend Councilman Kenney,
19 it's a white problem. So it's all of our
20 problems, and we must work together
21 collectively to solve this issue.

22 I stood before this Council
23 when I got a resolution when I retired
24 from government and came to this great
25 body of folks, and I talked about the

2 number one problem in this city was
3 violence. Violence affects business, as
4 Councilman Goode knows. Violence affects
5 individuals. Violence affects the
6 medical culture. You heard this figure
7 of \$700 million spent -- billion
8 dollars -- \$70 billion spent annually to
9 reduce has to do directly to the acts of
10 violence in America.

11 So we could reduce violence.
12 We could reduce -- we could create an
13 environment better for jobs, for
14 businesses to come. We could reduce the
15 medical costs that we pay. So we all
16 have to work together.

17 So, once again, thank you for
18 this citation. We're honored, and the
19 conference is going to be great. We have
20 folks from Seattle, Washington; Detroit;
21 Chicago; Atlanta; New York; New Jersey;
22 Myrtle Beach, South Carolina; New Orleans
23 all will be coming in to the City of
24 Philadelphia tomorrow to participate in
25 this conference.

3 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
4 Chair recognizes Councilman Goode at this
5 time.

6 COUNCILMAN GOODE: Thank you,
7 Mr. President. Today I introduce a bill
8 which will double the amount of total
9 available credit for new job creation.
10 The total amount of tax credit that's
11 available in any year currently cannot
12 exceed one percent of all revenues
13 collected for the City's business taxes
14 during the previous year, approximately
15 \$4 million. This bill would increase the
16 program cap to two percent of all
17 revenues collected through those business
18 taxes.

19 Businesses can receive a 5,000
20 credit for each new job created for tax
21 years 2012 and 2013. The original tax
22 credit was only for \$1,000 for each new
23 job when the one percent cap was
24 establishment.

25 From 2003 to 2011, 81 firms

1 10/25/12 - STATED - INTRO. OF BILLS
2 were approved for participation in the
3 program, promising the creation of over
4 5,000 jobs. Through 2011, over 1,000
5 jobs have been verified, resulting in 1.5
6 million tax credits claimed. This year
7 the \$5,000 credit was established with
8 Bill No. 120012, the first bill approved
9 by this new Council. Since then, at
10 least ten companies have already applied
11 for the new credit and promised over 550
12 new jobs. If an additional 250 jobs are
13 proposed this year, the program would
14 exceed its cap because of the increase in
15 the tax credit amount.

16 Over 900 jobs were projected
17 each of the years 2003, 2005, 2008, and
18 2011. With the increase in the tax
19 credit amount from \$1,000 to \$3,000 to
20 \$5,000, it is wise to increase the
21 program cap at this point.

22 If employers seek help in
23 creating new jobs, we should be in the
24 position to favorably respond to that
25 demand.

13 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

17 CHIEF CLERK: To the President
18 and members of the Council of the City of
19 Philadelphia, the Committee on Finance,
20 to which was referred Bill No. 120009,
21 entitled "An ordinance amending Title 17

8 MS. GRAVAGNO: If I could
9 speak?

10 COUNCIL PRESIDENT: Good
11 morning.

12 MS. GRAVAGNO: Good morning.
13 My name is Carole Haas Gravagno and I'm
14 the Chair of the Stoneleigh Foundation,
15 but before I speak, I would like to thank
16 Councilman Jones for his leadership on
17 this effort and also the Committee on
18 Public Safety for accepting this report.

19 The Stoneleigh Foundation finds
20 fellows -- or gives fellowships that will
21 provide -- sorry. I can't see and speak
22 in this thing at the same time.

23 We provide fellowships to
24 individuals whose work has been -- has
25 the potential to inform our public

2 systems and improve outcomes for our
3 vulnerable youth.

4 In 2008, we learned that
5 Pennsylvania was the most populated state
6 without any Youth Courts. In 2009, we
7 gave a fellowship to learn more about
8 Youth Courts and to expand that concept
9 to the rest of the state.

10 The results are promising.
11 Youth Courts keep students in school
12 rather than expel or suspend them. They
13 engage youth in learning the democratic
14 process. They improve academic
15 performance. They blunt the pipeline
16 from school to prison. They also
17 increase graduation rates.

18 The students who have
19 participated fully in Youth Courts mostly
20 graduate. So that's another issue that
21 we need to be paying attention to.

22 Last May, I observed the Youth
23 Courts in Chester, and I watched the
24 seriousness and the competence of the
25 young people who were directing these

1 10/25/12 - STATED - PUBLIC COMMENT
2 courts. They served as judge, bailiff,
3 jury members. My understanding is that
4 some of the City Council staff was down
5 to visit and they also were impressed
6 with this.

7 I saw a young woman come in.
8 She had been accused of profanity in the
9 classroom. She sat on the chair
10 slouched, like, What do you want me for?
11 And they treated her very respectfully.
12 They asked her very pointed questions.
13 They got at things that you and I might
14 not have been able to do. Before the
15 session was over, she was sitting up in
16 her chair paying attention to what they
17 were saying.

18 I think something that we -- is
19 that telling me I'm almost done?

20 We as adults need to understand
21 that sometimes peers know more about
22 what's going on in the youth community
23 than we do, and they can have a much
24 bigger influence on what happens.

25 I encourage you to all vote for

1 10/25/12 - STATED - PUBLIC COMMENT
2 this resolution. It really gives our
3 young people a chance at real justice,
4 and it helps them understand that we
5 respect them and we care about them.

6 I got a lot more I'd like to
7 say about it, but I appreciate your
8 listening and, again, thank you,
9 Councilman Jones and the Committee on
10 Safety.

15 Mr. President. I want to particularly
16 thank all my colleagues on the Committee
17 of Public Safety that passed the Youth
18 Court resolution and report. It was a
19 significant report, looking into best
20 practices of peer mediation courts,
21 holistic justice courts. We have
22 advocates in the audience that swear by
23 this as an intervention method, an
24 empowering method for young people. And
25 some of us might think it's a drop in the

2 bucket towards real crime issues, until I
3 had the opportunity to look at a YouTube
4 message that was sent to me about the
5 subject from another one of my colleagues
6 that I grew up with. A lot of people
7 made a lot about Ray-Ray. Well, I'm
8 going to tell you about Piddy. Piddy
9 sent me this, and he's a new guy. He's
10 matured and he's doing good things, and
11 I'm fortunate to have friends that had a
12 wayward past that have gotten their self
13 together.

14 But this individual sent me a
15 long conversation he had with other young
16 people, and it chronicled his 26 years in
17 prison. I'll say it again, 26 years in
18 prison, two escape attempts, one
19 successful, his number of armed
20 robberies, non-armed robberies. He went
21 back to the first time he ever snatched
22 money out of a cash register.

23 But before that, before he was
24 on this path to crime, he talked about
25 his first real disruptive incident that

2 was in a public school classroom. When
3 he was disruptive, got thrown out of
4 class, and it began. That 26-year path
5 began. At the time, no one intervened,
6 could not see the warning signs, could
7 not help him through some of his
8 challenges personally to keep him from
9 that path of crime.

10 So I say to you today, I say to
11 my colleagues today, this Youth Court is
12 more than what we tend to know on its
13 surface. It has the potential of setting
14 a lot of young people on the right path
15 from the classroom, averting the path to
16 prisons, and if we can do that in any
17 small way, we do a number of things. We
18 create citizens, good citizens. We
19 create taxpayers, and, more importantly,
20 we relieve, as important, we relieve the
21 burden of the taxpayer to \$35,000 a year
22 that we spend to incarcerate individuals,
23 if we could just steer them to that right
24 path.

25 So thank you all for the

2 support, and we're going to use that as a
3 ruling guide as we look at how to
4 implement that in our public schools.
5 It's one of your critical concerns about
6 public education, and I know you can't
7 talk, so I said it for you,
8 Mr. President.

12 good work.

13 (Applause.)

18 announcements. Many of us know Oscar
19 Robinson, African American jeweler, one
20 of the first on Jeweler's Row, and he did
21 a lot of Masonic items for many of those
22 who are in masonry. Well, he passed away
23 yesterday, and certainly we offer
24 condolences to his son and his family.

25 The other notice is that

6 a KYW story about Spanish billboards that
7 I heard last week. In 12 days,

10 vote. In 12 days, Philadelphians will
11 have the opportunity to exercise their
12 constitutional right to vote without
13 voter ID. Thanks to an October 2nd
14 decision by Judge Robert Simpson, voters
15 are now able to vote without showing a
16 state-approved photo identification.

17 Why then, I ask, are voters in
18 Philadelphia still seeing advertisements
19 on websites, billboards, and television
20 that read or depict a person holding up a
21 photo ID wherein the script says, "If you
22 have it, show it"?

23 A spokesman for the
24 Pennsylvania Department of State told our
25 Daily News Jan Ransom that their ads,

2 concentrated primarily in urban areas,
3 will not be removed. I wonder why.
4 These ads are confusing and for sure they
5 are misleading.

6 We need to salute the many who
7 have taken leadership on this issue;
8 namely, Commissioner Stephanie Singer,
9 Councilmembers Maria Quinones-Sanchez,
10 Councilman Jones, and Councilman Oh and
11 former City Councilman Juan Ramos, who
12 actually heads up the Delaware Valley
13 Voter Registration Education Project.

14 Despite the advocacy of these
15 leaders, there still may be a large
16 segment of the Philadelphia population
17 who continue to believe that they must
18 provide photo ID. We can never assume
19 that voters follow every judicial case
20 that is handed down. People are busy,
21 working multiple jobs, taking care of
22 their children and grandchildren. These
23 same citizens rely on leaders to provide
24 clear, factual information that allows
25 the voting process to be not only easy

2 and accessible but honest. This
3 advertising campaign does not pass the
4 test.

5 So, Mr. President, we all know
6 that every vote counts. One of my horror
7 memories is 2000 when George W. Bush was
8 elected President because of 537 votes in

10 Were these advertisements
11 crafted to intentionally suppress the
12 vote in Philadelphia? We do not know.
13 Do we believe that it can suppress
14 voters? Absolutely yes. Therefore, I
15 rise to respectfully ask the Pennsylvania
16 Department of State to take down their
17 billboards, stop running the ads, put
18 their energy into educating all voters
19 that, yes, they are indeed able to vote
20 without a voter ID.

21 My second ask goes to those
22 watching, reading or listening. Mahatma
23 Gandhi said it best: Be the change you
24 wish to see in this world. Given current
25 technology, young people, citizens, we

3 have to wait for a news media story to be
4 reported. You actually have the power to

6 Remember those 537 votes in
7 Florida in 2000. Ask yourself, can I

10 colleagues can you send an e-mail to over
11 the next 12 days? How many neighbors,
12 how many doors can you knock on on the
13 block where you live? If you knew that
14 you could change the world by reaching
15 out to 537 people, would you do it?

16 Trust that I will be posting on
17 Facebook and Twitter to alert all
18 Philadelphians you do not need a voter ID
19 to exercise your right to vote. Spread
20 the word. I ask and encourage all my
21 colleagues to do the same.
