10 International Airport, and as a
11 competitive city, all of us understood
12 the importance of the magnitude of such a
13 project and the economic growth and
14 development that will take place based
15 upon moving forward on this project. But
16 recognizing also the consensus was that
17 making sure that the workers receive fair
18 wages, the workplace environment in which
19 they work is conducive to their
20 well-being, as well as other aspects of
21 minority participation on the
22 construction side as well as professional
23 services are just as equally important as
24 the expansion and the growth that will
25 take place as a result of the expansion.

2 And so we will remain committed as a
3 committee, as a team.

4 I thank all the members as well
5 as Councilman Goode, who is not on the
6 Committee but engaged and raised some
7 very important and critical questions

11 in questioning how the Airport operates

17 (Witness approached podium.)

18 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good
19 morning.

20 MS. HEWKA: Good morning,
21 Mr. President and members of Council.
22 Thank you for the opportunity to speak to
23 you. My name is Nadia Hewka and I'm an
24 attorney at Community Legal Services in
25 Philadelphia, which represents City

2 residents from throughout the City. I
3 live in South Philadelphia myself in the
4 1st District.

5 I'm speaking about Bill 120054,
6 entitled "An ordinance amending Chapter
7 19-1300 of The Philadelphia Code,
8 entitled 'Real Estate Taxes,' by
9 providing for installment payment
10 agreements and requiring commencement of
11 enforcement action, all under certain
12 terms and conditions."

13 I'm here today to say that many
14 Philadelphians would be more able to pay
15 their delinquent real estate taxes if
16 their criminal records were expunged,
17 removing a barrier to employment.
18 According to Attorney General Holder's
19 Reentry Council, about one in three
20 Americans have criminal history records.
21 The percentage in Philadelphia is
22 probably higher than that.

23 According to the Society of
24 Human Resource Managers, 90 percent of
25 employers do background checking. The

2 result is that many people with criminal
3 records have severe employment barriers
4 that limit their income. The employment
5 barrier that is represented by a criminal
6 record was vividly demonstrated here in
7 Philadelphia a few weeks ago when 3,000
8 persons with criminal records showed up
9 at a job fair and were turned away
10 because of the record crowds. But some
11 criminal cases can be expunged and, most
12 notably, those include arrests, summary
13 convictions, and perhaps more as the
14 Pennsylvania General Assembly considers a
15 bill to allow some misdemeanor
16 convictions to be expunged.

17 We urge City Council to fund
18 Community Legal Services to handle
19 expungement cases. We believe that an
20 investment of \$100,000 would generate \$6
21 million annually in savings and tax
22 revenues for \$60 return for \$1 invested,
23 as well as improve lives here in
24 Philadelphia.

25 Thank you very much.

10 morning, sir.

11 MR. KING: Thank you,
12 Councilmembers. The resolution
13 authorizing the Committee to hold
14 hearings to examine the feasibility of
15 the transferring ownership or operations
16 of Philadelphia Gas Works to a private
17 entity is a bad idea, as Philadelphia Gas
18 Works undergirds Philadelphia's economy,
19 and Philadelphia Gas Works can also have
20 the potential of creating a new economy
21 platform.

22 I'd also like to take the time
23 to mention that Resolutions 130225 and
24 130227 ought to be tabled until there is
25 some kind of resolution with the

2 Dodd-Frank Act that particulars deal with
3 their bank accounts of its customers.
4 Eleven states, I report to the Council,
5 have filed legal actions against the
6 Dodd-Frank Act. There appears to be a
7 lack of disclosure. There appears to be
8 an indecipherable ordinance to these
9 Dodd-Frank Act that no one can
10 understand.

11 So thank you very much.

12 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

13 Thank you so much, sir.

14 CHIEF CLERK: Montgomery

15 Wilson, commenting on 120054-A.

16 (Witness approached podium.)

17 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good
18 morning.

19 MR. WILSON: Thank you,
20 Councilman. I wanted to arrange it so I
21 can see the light rather than blocking
22 the red light.

23 My name is Monty Wilson. I'm a
24 an attorney with Community Legal Services
25 in Philadelphia and I'm here today in

2 support of Bill 120054-A, the real estate
3 tax installment payment agreement bill
4 that CLS and legal services have worked
5 with Revenue and Council staff on for the
6 last 18 months to set up a formal system
7 of written payment agreements for
8 Philadelphia homeowners to enter into
9 payment plans on their delinquent taxes.

10 I think many of us all know
11 from the recent PlanPhilly article that
12 came out last March that there are 40,000
13 homeowner-occupied properties in
14 Philadelphia which are tax delinquent.
15 This bill marks a big step forward, an
16 enormous step forward in Philadelphia,
17 towards a process of collecting that
18 revenue for the City, while at the same
19 time allowing these homeowners the
20 opportunity to stay in their homes and
21 make an affordable payment.

22 I'm very optimistic given that
23 the bill has been placed on the Consent
24 Calendar that this bill will pass today.

25 The thing I wanted to touch on

2 base before my time ends is the next
3 steps. I think this is an enormous step
4 forward. I suspect that this bill will
5 become a state and possibly a national
6 model. It is comprehensive and well
7 thought out, and I'd like to thank the
8 Council staffers who worked with us. But
9 the next step will, of course, be
10 implementation, and the Department of
11 Revenue and CLS and the housing
12 counselors who have been asked to help
13 these homeowners will need the resources
14 and the funding to do that, and I would
15 hope Council would consider that this
16 month.

17 The other thing to consider is
18 that currently in Harrisburg,
19 unfortunately I learned last week that
20 there is a new bill that -- delinquent
21 tax real estate sale reform bill, HB
22 1409, has been introduced, which would
23 essentially preempt the bill that you are
24 voting on today, unfortunately. It would
25 set up a mandatory maximum of 24 months

2 to repay your delinquent taxes and also,
3 I believe, bar the City from forgiving
4 penalties and interest on the amount
5 owed. It's directly contradictory to the
6 work that we've done for the last 18
7 months, and I would urge Council to take
8 a look at that bill, speak to our state
9 reps and urge the Harrisburg sponsors to
10 amend that bill so that we can move
11 forward with this bill.

12 Having said all that, that's
13 the work for the future. I am extremely
14 grateful to Council for considering this
15 bill. I'm optimistic that it's going to
16 pass, and I want to take a moment to
17 thank all the sponsors who were involved
18 in the bill, particularly the folks that
19 I have worked with from legal services,
20 the folks at Philadelphia VIP, the Senior
21 Law Center, and the Philadelphia
22 Unemployment Project and PLA.

23 I would be remiss if I didn't
24 thank people at the Department of
25 Revenue, Clarena Tolson, particularly

3 Counsel who came to the table and worked
