23                   COUNCILMAN GOODE: Thank you,  
24           Mr. President. Today I introduce a  
25           second tax abatement bill. The bill asks

3           to take money from the School District

10          for both bills, you can vote against both

13                         Thank you, Mr. President.

14                         COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

15           Thank you, Councilman. And that bill  
16           will be referred to the appropriate  
17           committee.

18                         The Chair recognizes --  
19           Councilman Johnson, did you need to be  
20           recognized?

21                         COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: No.

22                         COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

23           Okay.

24                         The Chair recognizes  
25           Councilwoman Brown.

3 morning, Mr. President. I offer two

8                   COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:  
9 Thank you, Councilwoman.

10                   CHIEF CLERK: A privileged  
11 resolution honoring the life and legacy

13                   COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: That  
14 resolution will be on today's Final  
15 Passage Calendar.

16                   CHIEF CLERK: And a privileged  
17 resolution authorizing the City Council  
18 Committee on Rules to hold public  
19 hearings to investigate strategies and  
20 offer recommendations for the improvement  
21 of collection procedures, to increase  
22 current and delinquent revenues from the  
23 School Income Tax.

24                   COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: That  
25 resolution will also be on today's Final

3                    The Chair recognizes Councilman  
4           Jones.

5                    COUNCILMAN JONES: Thank you,  
6           Mr. President. I offer one privileged

9           Thank you, Councilman.

10                   COUNCILMAN JONES: Co-sponsored  
11           by all members of Council, the privileged  
12           resolution.

13                   COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:  
14           Thank you, Councilman.

15                   CHIEF CLERK: An ordinance  
16           amending Section 19-201 of The  
17           Philadelphia Code, entitled "City  
18           Depositories," by authorizing the City  
19           Treasurer to deposit funds in U.S. Bank.

20                   COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: That  
21           bill will be referred to the appropriate

13                    COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:  
14           Thank you, Councilman.

15                    CHIEF CLERK: An ordinance  
16           amending Section 9-204 of The  
17           Philadelphia Code, entitled "Sidewalk  
18           Vendors in Center City," in order to  
19           expand the previously designated vendor  
20           location on the east side of 5th Street

25                    COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: That

11                   COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:   That  
12          bill will be referred to committee.

13                   CHIEF CLERK:   And an ordinance  
14          to amend the Philadelphia Zoning Maps by  
15          changing the zoning designations of  
16          certain areas of land located within an  
17          area bounded by the Frankford Creek,  
18          Aramingo Avenue, Wheatsheaf Lane, Sepviva  
19          Street, Butler Street, Frankford Avenue,  
20          Valetta Street, Coral Street, Vici Street  
21          and Frankford Avenue.

22                   COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:   That  
23          bill will be referred to committee.

24                   CHIEF CLERK:   And an ordinance

15                   COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Thank you,

17           privileged resolution co-sponsored by

19           Blondell Reynolds Brown. Thank you.

20                   COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:  
21           Thank you, Councilwoman.

22                   CHIEF CLERK: An ordinance  
23           amending Section 9-206 of The  
24           Philadelphia Code, entitled "Sidewalk  
25           Vendors in Neighborhood Business

5                    COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: That

8                    CHIEF CLERK: And an ordinance  
9           approving a new plan, estimated costs and  
10          proposed method of assessment of the  
11          Germantown Special Services District of  
12          Philadelphia for and concerning business  
13          improvements and administrative services  
14          to the Germantown area of the City.

15                   COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: That  
16          bill will be referred to the appropriate  
17          committee.

18                   CHIEF CLERK: And a privileged  
19          resolution recognizing, honoring, and  
20          celebrating Dawn Michelle Staley, on the  
21          occasion of her induction into the  
22          Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame  
23          Class of 2013.

24                   COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: That  
25          resolution will be on this week's Final

3 The Chair recognizes Councilman

4 Oh.

5 COUNCILMAN OH: Thank you,

6 Mr. President. I offer no bills or

7 resolutions today.

8 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The

9 Chair thanks the gentleman.

10 That concludes our

11 introductions of bills and resolutions.

12 Today we have no reports from committees,

13 so the next order of business is

14 consideration of the Calendar. As there

15 are no bills on the First Reading

16 Calendar, the Chair recognizes Councilman

17 Jones for the purpose of calling up bills

18 on the Second Reading and Final Passage.

19 COUNCILMAN JONES: Thank you,

20 Mr. President. The following resolutions

21 and bills are being called up for Second

22 Reading and Final Passage Calendar today:

23 Nos. 130311, 120651-A, 130248, 130143,

24 130485, 130412, 130459. All other bills

25 and resolutions are being held.

2                   COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

3           Thank you so much, Councilman.

4                   Before considering these  
5           resolutions and bills on the Final  
6           Passage, we will consider public comment.

7           Public comment will be as follows:

8                   In the middle of the Council  
9           Chambers at the gate, you will see a  
10          podium. On that podium is a microphone.  
11          There is a device next to the microphone  
12          that will indicate your time. The time  
13          for your public comment will be three  
14          minutes. When it's time for you to  
15          speak, the light on the device will turn  
16          green. When it turns yellow, that means  
17          you have 30 seconds to conclude your  
18          remarks, and when it turns red, that  
19          means that your three minutes are up.  
20          And we'd ask that you please adhere to  
21          those particular guidelines.

22                   So if there's anyone who wishes  
23          to speak today for public comment on  
24          bills and resolutions that are only on  
25          the Final Passage Calendar, we'd ask that

3           left. Thank you.

4                     Mr. Decker, would you please  
5           read the names.

6                     CHIEF CLERK: Danita Bates.

7                     (No response.)

8                     CHIEF CLERK: Danita Bates.

9                     (No response.)

10                    CHIEF CLERK: Clarc King,  
11           commenting on 120118.

12                    (Witness approached podium.)

13                    MR. KING: Thank you, President  
14           of the City Council. Thank you,  
15           Councilmembers. I am here to comment on  
16           the proposal 120118, the proposal to  
17           examine the feasibility of transferring  
18           operations or selling Philadelphia Gas  
19           Works. I believe this proposal must be  
20           tabled.

21                    Selling off a great asset like  
22           this for paper money while the world  
23           financial system is in need of  
24           reorganization is a bad idea. A new  
25           financial economic system is in order.

1           9/12/13 - STATED - PUBLIC COMMENT

2                   Right now the private-sector  
3           system of finance and funding of  
4           government is the origin of the City's  
5           budgetary crisis. Money and energy  
6           cartels prey on government entities  
7           throughout the nation.

8                   City Council must investigate  
9           its finance contracts, as a lopsided  
10          result in losses is a sure indication of  
11          the rigging of interest rates.

12                   While reviewing the Dodd-Frank  
13          Act, City Council must investigate its  
14          relationship with the too-big-to-fail  
15          banking facilities.

16                   I would like to propose the  
17          creation of the public bank of  
18          Philadelphia, the local fed facility,  
19          with its ability to create credit. A  
20          transaction tax at the Philadelphia Stock  
21          Exchange, Philadelphia's own assets, tax  
22          bases, and what-have-you can be used to  
23          create credit to launch the redevelopment  
24          of Philadelphia.

25                   As much as you may like and

2           respect the private sector, they have not  
3           delivered the goods. The City's security  
4           policy that includes full employment and  
5           economic platforms that enhance the  
6           standard of living of the population can  
7           only come through the creativity that  
8           government can provide.

9                         We are going in the wrong  
10           direction, appeasing and struggling to be  
11           in compliance with the system called the  
12           monetary financial system. It is an  
13           economy cancer delivery system. We must  
14           look for another way.

15                         Thank you so much.

16                         CHIEF CLERK: Tiffany Gire.

17                         (No response.)

18                         CHIEF CLERK: Tiffany Gire,  
19           commenting on 120651-A.

20                         (Witness approached podium.)

21                         MS. GREEN: Good morning. It's  
22           Tiffany Green. I'm commenting on this  
23           bill for -- it's coming up for final  
24           passage. I would hope that we would  
25           start the new year off in an honorable

2           manner. Back in September of 2012, this  
3           ten-year tax abatement bill was submitted  
4           in, and at the time, it read it would be  
5           reduced down to five years and then 20  
6           percent each time, from 80 to 60 to 40 to  
7           70 [sic].

8                         Now, at this particular point,  
9           when we met with Councilman Goode, we  
10          went over the bill and we supported it.  
11          For a whole year this bill has been  
12          sitting like this. We reached out to  
13          other groups and we told the groups about  
14          the bill, and they said that they could  
15          live with that, that the ten-year tax  
16          abatement would be reduced down to five  
17          years and then reduced 20 percent until  
18          it expires. But last year in June, in  
19          the last two weeks or three weeks, this  
20          was changed back up to ten years, up to  
21          ten years, and this is like a bait and  
22          switch, and this is not fair, because we  
23          stand here today begging for money for  
24          our kids to have school supplies. And as  
25          we all know, property taxes go towards --

2           a portion of the property taxes go  
3           towards our kids and the school system.  
4           Yet we still want to stick with this  
5           ten-year tax abatement. This is not  
6           right. If you're going to go down to  
7           five years, then you should stick with  
8           that.

9                         Secondly, it was not really  
10           publicized and there was no real hearings  
11           on the new amendment that was submitted  
12           back in late June 2013. That's why we  
13           consider this a bait and switch, because  
14           there was no time to even have public  
15           hearings on the fact that you raise it  
16           back up to ten years and then at the  
17           fifth year you want to start the  
18           expiration.

19                         Right now you have thousands of  
20           condominium buildings with one, two,  
21           three units -- I mean, 100 to 300 units  
22           all getting ten-year tax abatement. What  
23           you fail to realize is that one building  
24           has a transfer. So one owner can  
25           transfer the ten-year tax abatement to

2           200 different individual housing units.  
3           So that means that you have multiple --  
4           instead what you have on the books is  
5           showing one tax abatement for one  
6           building, you have a transfer to multiple  
7           homeowners, condominium owners.

8                   I'm saying that this bill needs  
9           to be voted down today. It needs to go  
10          back through the right process. It needs  
11          to have public hearings on this new  
12          amendment bill. And if you're going to  
13          go down to five years and the groups  
14          agree to that, then let's do that,  
15          because this is about having money for  
16          our School District and our kids. We  
17          shouldn't have to go around begging for  
18          supply money.

19                   (Applause.)

20                   COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

21          Thank you for your testimony.

22                   CHIEF CLERK: There are no  
23          other speakers on the public comment  
24          list, Mr. President.

25                   COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

2           There being no one else for public  
3           comment, that concludes that section of  
4           our session. We will now consider the  
5           resolutions and bills on the Second  
6           Reading and Final Passage Calendar.

7                     Mr. Decker, would you please  
8           read the title of Resolution 130311.

9                     CHIEF CLERK: A resolution  
10          urging the Pennsylvania General Assembly  
11          to oppose legislation that will legalize  
12          predatory small-dollar lending, commonly  
13          known as payday lending, in Pennsylvania.

14                    COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The  
15          Chair recognizes Councilwoman Tasco.

16                    COUNCILWOMAN TASCO:  
17          Mr. President, I move that we withdraw  
18          this resolution from the Calendar.

19                             (Duly seconded.)

20                    COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: It's  
21          been moved and properly seconded.

22                             All those in favor of withdraw?

23                             (Aye.)

24                    COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

25          Those opposed?

3                   COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The  
4                   ayes have it. Resolution 130311 is  
5                   withdrawn.

6                   Mr. Decker, please read the  
7                   title of 120651-A.

8                   CHIEF CLERK: An ordinance  
9                   amending Chapter 19-1300 of The  
10                  Philadelphia Code, entitled "Real Estate  
11                  Taxes," by reducing the amount of real  
12                  estate taxes to be exempted for certain  
13                  improvements to, or construction of,  
14                  certain residential, commercial,  
15                  industrial or other business properties;  
16                  and by reducing the duration of such  
17                  exemptions.

18                  COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The  
19                  Chair recognizes Councilman Greenlee.

20                  COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: Thank  
21                  you, Mr. President. I move that Bill No.  
22                  120651-A be tabled.

23                  (Duly seconded.)

24                  COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: It's  
25                  been moved and properly seconded.

1                   9/12/13 - STATED - 2ND READING

2                   There's not supposed to be any  
3                   debate, but I see Councilman Goode has  
4                   his light on and I will alter from that  
5                   particular provision today and hope I  
6                   don't get in trouble. Councilman Goode.

7                   COUNCILMAN GOODE: Thank you,  
8                   Mr. President. My comments will not  
9                   change much from last year when I  
10                  introduced this bill to modify the  
11                  ten-year tax abatement. It's still about  
12                  tax fairness. The final version of this  
13                  bill will not allow for a full hundred  
14                  percent tax abatement for ten years.  
15                  Instead, the abatement will be capped at  
16                  \$500,000 per dwelling unit. The second  
17                  five years of the abatement will decrease  
18                  annually from 80 percent to 60 percent to  
19                  40 percent to 20 percent to 10 percent,  
20                  until that taxpayer pays their full  
21                  share.

22                  The opponents of this bill  
23                  don't want the cap, but tomorrow is the  
24                  deadline for the homestead exemption,  
25                  which is capped at \$30,000. So a

2           \$500,000 exemption is very generous; some  
3           would say, as they just did, too  
4           generous. Having no cap is ridiculous.

5                        When I introduced this bill, I  
6           noted a Fels study from the University of  
7           Pennsylvania concluded that most of the  
8           beneficiaries of the tax abatement are  
9           private developers and higher income  
10          residents. In other words, it's  
11          generally a tax break for the few, the  
12          new, and the well-to-do, not for most of  
13          Philadelphia. Yes, I said that. I meant  
14          it, and I was right. The \$500,000 cap on  
15          this program doesn't affect anyone but  
16          them.

17                       Public testimony from both Toll  
18          Brothers and Dranoff Properties confirmed  
19          that to be true. The witnesses not only  
20          admitted it, but they bragged about it,  
21          suggested that we needed to bribe better  
22          people to live here, bribe them to live  
23          here with our money, not their profits,  
24          at any cost. And they have the audacity  
25          to suggest that we take the money from

2           the schools to bribe people to move here  
3           because our school system is broken. I  
4           reject that. We should be focused on  
5           better schools for Philadelphia, not on  
6           importing people that they think are  
7           better. Our investment should be first  
8           in the current residents of Philadelphia  
9           and their children. For me this is still  
10          about tax fairness.

11                         Thank you, Mr. President.

12                                 (Appause.)

13                         COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

14          Thank you, Councilman.

15                         Move to table traditionally, as  
16          I said a little earlier, doesn't  
17          authorize debate, but I'm going to ask  
18          Councilman Green and ask you all that  
19          hopefully this will be the last  
20          conversation with respect to this bill,  
21          respectfully. Just following the rules.  
22          Councilman Green.

23                         COUNCILMAN GREEN: Thank you,  
24          Mr. President. Obviously I wouldn't have  
25          asked to speak if others weren't allowed

2           to. I apologize for that, and I thank  
3           you for your indulgence.

4                       Western Union, Naval Square,  
5           2400 South, 22 units; 15th and  
6           Bainbridge, Artisan Townhomes, 28 Units;  
7           12th and Lombard, six units; the Stables,  
8           Northern Liberties, 27 units; 10  
9           Rittenhouse, hundreds; Symphony House,  
10          hundreds; Residences at Ritz Carlton,  
11          hundreds; Aria, probably close to a  
12          hundred; Murano, hundreds; SouthStar  
13          Lofts, 85 units; 1706 Rittenhouse, at  
14          least 30; conversion of Two Liberty; Parc  
15          Rittenhouse; 2200 Arch; 23-A Condos; the  
16          Granary; the Sansom; the White Building;  
17          101 Walnut; 22 Front Street, Stampers  
18          Square; 2116 Chestnut; 1706 Rittenhouse;  
19          the Packard Building, among others, all  
20          of these properties contain over \$500,000  
21          units. All of these properties would not  
22          have penciled as construction projects.

23                       So, yes, the money does allow  
24          developers to be able to afford to build  
25          these homes to bring in new people to the

2           City of Philadelphia who might not  
3           otherwise be here without these projects,  
4           and these projects would not be developed  
5           without the tax abatement.

6                     The abatement is not about  
7           helping wealthy people not pay taxes.  
8           It's about getting buildings built in the  
9           first place in the City of Philadelphia.  
10          And so for that reason, I guess I would  
11          ask people to vote down the motion to  
12          table so that we can vote on this bill  
13          and vote it down to create certainty for  
14          our developers so that they keep doing  
15          business and constructing buildings and  
16          creating jobs in the City of  
17          Philadelphia.

18                    Thank you, Mr. President.

19                    COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

20           Thank you, Councilman.

21                    There is a reason why the  
22           provision is in there to not debate the  
23           table, because I suspect that there will  
24           be this back and forth. So I'd like to  
25           kind of go directly to the question.

1           9/12/13 - STATED - 2ND READING

2           There was a motion. There was a second.  
3           And I would like to ask for a call on the  
4           motion and the second on the motion to  
5           table.

6                    COUNCILMAN GOODE: Roll call.

7                    COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Roll  
8           call. Request for roll call.

9                    Councilman Kenney?

10                   Mr. Decker.

11                   COUNCILMAN KENNEY:

12           Mr. President, please clarify the aye  
13           vote, no vote, what it means.

14                   COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: I'm  
15           sorry.

16                   COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Could you  
17           just please clarify what an aye vote does  
18           and what a no vote does.

19                   COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Aye  
20           vote is to table, a motion to table, and  
21           I know I'm not supposed to editorialize,  
22           but this is essentially a table to  
23           discuss this at another time.

24                   COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Correct.

25           Thank you.

2                   COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: It's  
3 not necessarily voting down or in support  
4 or opposed to the particular bill.

19 request to be recognized for the purpose  
20 of making remarks.

21                                 (Duly seconded.)

22                  COUNCILMAN JONES: Having been  
23 moved and seconded, the Chair recognizes  
24 Councilman O'Brien.

25                  COUNCILMAN O'BRIEN: Thank you,

2           Mr. President. The resolution I  
3           introduced today calls for Council to  
4           investigate the City's recent Request for  
5           Proposal seeking a single law firm to  
6           provide legal representation to all  
7           indigent clients when a conflict of  
8           interest requires appointment of outside  
9           counsel. The right to counsel is a  
10          fundamental safeguard guaranteed under  
11          the Bill of Rights to all persons accused  
12          of crimes that are unable to afford a  
13          lawyer. In the landmark case Gideon  
14          versus Wainwright, the U.S. Supreme Court  
15          recognized the fundamental role that  
16          legal representation plays in a fair  
17          criminal justice system.

18                         In Philadelphia, the Defender's  
19          Association provides free legal services  
20          to criminal and juvenile clients who are  
21          financially unable to obtain counsel. In  
22          some cases, the Defender's Association is  
23          precluded from providing that legal  
24          representation due to a conflict of  
25          interest. When this occurs, the courts

2           appoint private attorneys to represent  
3           the accused. These attorneys are  
4           referred to as conflict counsel or  
5           court-appointed counsel.

6                       Each year the Philadelphia  
7           Court of Common Pleas makes more than  
8           22,000 conflict counsel appointments in  
9           Philadelphia's Family, Criminal,  
10          Municipal, Orphans, and Traffic Courts at  
11          a cost to the City of between \$8 and \$10  
12          million.

13                     In November 2012, the Mayor's  
14          Office, intending to assume this  
15          appointment power from the courts, posted  
16          a Request for Proposal seeking a private  
17          entity to provide legal representation to  
18          indigent clients where the Defender's  
19          Association is prohibited from providing  
20          representation due to conflict of  
21          interest. It appears that a contract  
22          will soon be executed between the City  
23          and a private entity, and this gives me  
24          great concern.

25                     My staff and I have built our

2           careers in the criminal justice  
3           conversation. Our shared goal in  
4           different venues has always been justice.  
5           We are collectively uncertain that  
6           justice will be served with this new  
7           court appointment process, and we have so  
8           many questions. What will the quality of  
9           representation be for those accused of a  
10          crime that do not have the financial  
11          means to hire an attorney?

12                    The RFP calls for a one-year  
13           contract. What if the deal is not  
14           renewed? What happens to those poor  
15           clients? Where do their cases go? Who  
16           will represent them? Where is the  
17           efficacy or transparency in this process?  
18           Why is this a one-year contract with an  
19           option for three successive one-year  
20           contracts? Was this done to skirt  
21           Council's oversight and input? Will this  
22           cost the City more money in hidden or  
23           unforeseen expenses? What is this new  
24           dynamic modeled after?

25                    I could go on and on. These

2           questions are many and the answers are  
3           few. Therefore, Mr. President, members  
4           of Council, I have no other choice but to  
5           introduce this resolution today, and with  
6           my co-sponsors, Councilpersons Greenlee,  
7           Kenney, and Bass, we wish to put us back  
8           on a path to find these answers.

9                         Thank you, Mr. President.

10                        COUNCILMAN JONES: Are you now  
11           moving for the adoption of the  
12           resolution?

13                        COUNCILMAN O'BRIEN: Yes, I am.

14                                 (Duly seconded.)

15                        COUNCILMAN JONES: Having been  
16           moved and seconded, all those in favor?

17                                 (Aye.)

18                        COUNCILMAN JONES: All those  
19           opposed?

20                                 (No response.)

21                        COUNCILMAN JONES: The adoption  
22           has been passed. The motion -- the  
23           resolution has been passed.

24                        CHIEF CLERK: And a resolution  
25           honoring the life and legacy of E. Steven

4                    COUNCILMAN JONES:   The Chair  
5           recognizes Councilwoman Brown.

6                    COUNCILWOMAN BROWN:   Good  
7           morning, Majority Leader.  I offer  
8           remarks before moving forward.

9                    Mr. President -- Majority  
10          Leader, with a heavy heart, I know I join  
11          you and many in honoring the legendary  
12          veteran radio broadcaster, exemplary  
13          executive and broadcaster, our very own  
14          E. Steven Collins.  He was not just a  
15          colleague.  He was a friend to many and a  
16          mentor to so many more with legions of  
17          listeners across the City.  His is a life  
18          deserving of respect and tribute as he  
19          deeply cared about the City.  And I  
20          believe Patty Jackson of WDAS said it  
21          best when she commented that he was the  
22          unofficial mayor of our city.

23                    Many of us will miss so much  
24          about him - his seemingly boundless  
25          energy; his focused commitment to any

2           cause he undertook in the corporate,  
3           civic, religious or non-profit community;  
4           his infectious smile; his commanding  
5           physical presence with a teddy bear  
6           heart; his intellect; and his radio voice

9           issues like literacy, non-violence or  
10          something as novel as walking your child  
11          to school; his bright spirit and his  
12          unwavering quest to seek and secure a  
13          balanced story void of sensationalism;  
14          his joyful, positive attitude; his sense  
15          of purpose that turned many disbelievers  
16          or doubters and what I call impossibility  
17          thinkers into believers. He will be  
18          irreplaceable.

19                    The sense of loss for so many  
20                    is huge, but his legacy is infinitely  
21                    greater, a legacy that commands all of us  
22                    to live a life of purpose, a life that  
23                    matters, a life that gives back, a life  
24                    that makes a difference. And he did all  
25                    of this preserving an essential quality

3                     I imagine now he is still  
4           working serving in his new capacity as  
5           guardian angel for the city he cared so  
6           very much about. Elmer Smith said that  
7           there will always be one E. Steven

10          resolution celebrating a life well lived  
11          on the legacy of E. Steven Collins,  
12          better known as E. I would ask that we  
13          rise for a moment of silence honoring E.  
14          Steven Collins and his family.

15                    COUNCILMAN JONES: Well put,  
16          Councilwoman.

17                    Would you please rise for a  
18          moment of silence for E. Steven Collins.

19                    (Moment of silence.)

20                    COUNCILWOMAN BROWN: And with  
21          that, I move for the adoption.

22                    (Duly seconded.)

23                    COUNCILMAN JONES: All those in  
24          favor signify by saying aye.

25                    (Aye.)

12          that Bobby Henon introduced on behalf of

9                   for those who were disabled. She came to  
10                  my office on one particular occasion when  
11                  the contract was going to be taken from  
12                  Temple and awarded to Northwest Human  
13                  Services on the Woodhaven center, and she  
14                  wanted to make sure that the rights and  
15                  the services for those individuals were  
16                  guaranteed.

17                 On a lighter note, I remember  
18                 one time that I was engaging with her on  
19                 an issue that was of common purpose to  
20                 both of us and she withheld the answer to  
21                 that until I gave her my date of birth  
22                 and other information so that I could  
23                 have my chart read. I found that  
24                 particularly unusual, because I don't  
25                 care if a psychic reader or the President

3           Krajewski on an issue. She was going to  
4           do what she wanted anyway. So she wasn't  
5           going to be guided by that or any other  
6           voice.

7                   But I just want to say that she  
8           was a friend, an advocate, a fierce  
9           fighter and protector for those who  
10          needed a voice to stand up. I am certain  
11          that she's going to be missed by her  
12          constituents in Northeast Philadelphia,  
13          but I think all of us in the City of  
14          Philadelphia are better for knowing her.

15                   Thank you, Mr. President.

16                   COUNCILMAN JONES: Thank you,  
17          Councilman. Ditto, ditto, and ditto.

18                   Are there speeches on the part  
19          of the majority?

20                   The Chair recognizes Councilman  
21          Goode.

22                   COUNCILMAN GOODE: Thank you,  
23          Mr. President Pro Tem. Needless to say,  
24          I will be calling up the first --

3                   COUNCILMAN JONES: Thank you  
4           very much.

10          Folks, we want you to know we support  
11          full funding.

12                   (Audience members yelling.)

13                   COUNCILMAN JONES: Folks, we  
14          have business to conduct. We heard your  
15          point. We're going to ask you to leave  
16          now. We're going to ask you to leave  
17          now.

18                   (Audience members yelling.)

19                   COUNCILMAN JONES: Listen, we  
20          have heard you. We're going to ask you  
21          to respect our process at this point.  
22          We're going to ask you to stop at this  
23          point.

24                   (Audience members yelling.)

25                   COUNCILMAN JONES: Don't forget

3                   Thank you very much. We'd like  
4                   you to stop up at the Governor's mansion  
5                   on your way. Thank you very much.

6                   The Chair now recognizes  
7                   Councilwoman Blackwell -- oh, Councilman  
8                   Goode. The Chair recognizes Councilman  
9                   Goode.

10                  COUNCILMAN GOODE: Thank you,  
11                  Mr. President Pro Tem. Needless to say,  
12                  I will be calling up the first abatement  
13                  bill every week until a vote is taken. I  
14                  also introduced a second bill. As I  
15                  stated, members have three choices - vote  
16                  for both, vote against both, vote for one  
17                  or the other.

18                  The tabling of the first bill  
19                  is not as relevant as the introduction of  
20                  the second bill. The first bill will not

22                  second bill will take effect as soon as

9                   my friends will be back next week.

10                                 Thank you.

11                                 COUNCILMAN JONES: Thank you,  
12                   Councilman.

13                                 The Chair recognizes Councilman  
14                   Green, because we went from the minority,  
15                   we'll come back, but Councilman Green is  
16                   next.

17                                 COUNCILMAN GREEN: Thank you,  
18                   Mr. President. Past is prologue, and  
19                   unfortunately the Mayor today returned  
20                   several bills to City Council as he did  
21                   with the -- as Mayor Street did with the  
22                   condo trash bill. Several bills were  
23                   returned today without signature. They  
24                   are now the law of the City of  
25                   Philadelphia, except the Administration

2           is, I believe, going to take the position  
3           that they don't have to comply with those  
4           laws. This means that we will be back in  
5           court with the Administration in order to  
6           seek declaratory judgments, in order to

9           deliver to City Council an IT strategic  
10          plan that says how they're going to spend  
11          \$120 million over the next five years.

12                    I would like it known for the  
13          record that the citizens of Philadelphia  
14          passed two years ago by over 80 percent a  
15          Charter change that allowed this body to  
16          request any information we wanted with  
17          the budget from the Administration. In  
18          connection with that, we passed a  
19          program-based budget requirement, which  
20          the Administration -- or Mayor signed and  
21          which they intend to comply with. In  
22          addition to that program-based budget,  
23          the IT strategic plan would have been  
24          required to be delivered at the same  
25          time. It is no different than asking for

4                   asking for specificity for line items

10                   Thank you, Mr. President.

11                   COUNCILMAN JONES: Thank you,  
12                   Councilman.

13                   The Chair now recognizes  
14                   Councilman O'Brien.

15                   COUNCILMAN O'BRIEN: Thank you,  
16                   Mr. President. I simply was going to add  
17                   my voice to those advocates that have  
18                   since departed this chamber and ask that  
19                   the Administration in Harrisburg be

22                   COUNCILMAN JONES: Appreciate

7                   briefing with the Philadelphia School  
8                   District Partnership. That was postponed  
9                   when we had the funeral for our  
10                  colleague, the Honorable Joan Krajewski.

11                  We're also coordinating a third  
12                  announcement. We're coordinating a  
13                  luncheon meeting with the Mayor's Office  
14                  of Education, PhillyGoes2College, how  
15                  best to help our students who are trying  
16                  to get to college.

17                  And, finally, we are  
18                  coordinating with the United States  
19                  Department of Education, Office of Civil  
20                  Rights, and we will be announcing a  
21                  briefing that they will likewise provide.

22                  Finally, on another matter, we  
23                  have submitted to you -- every now and  
24                  then we just give you some of these  
25                  things we print. Our Echoes of Africa is
