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2 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good
3 morning, everyone.

4 (Good morning.)

5 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
6 hour has come. I would ask all guests
7 and visitors to please retire behind the
8 rail and ask all members to please take
9 their seat. Thank you very much.

10 To give our invocation this
11 morning, the Chair recognizes the
12 Reverend John H. Roberts, Sr., Pastor of
13 the Garden of Prayer World Prayer Center.
14 He is here today as the guest of
15 Councilman James Kenney.

16 I would ask all members and
17 guests to please rise.

18 (Members and guests rise.)

19 REVEREND ROBERTS: Good
20 morning.

21 (Good morning.)

22 REVEREND ROBERTS: Let's bow
23 our heads.

24 Our Father, we take time to
25 thank you now for letting us see another

3 not only did you wake us up, but you
4 helped us to get up. You've given us a
5 portion of strength where we were able to
6 bathe ourselves and put our own clothes
7 on without any assistance. We're

11 We pray now for the leadership
12 of this great City of Brotherly Love. We
13 ask prayer now for our Mayor, for our
14 President of City Council, for all the
15 Councilpersons, all the great leaders of
16 this great city.

17 Your word says that we are to
18 pray for those who are in authority and
19 that when the righteous rule, the people
20 rejoice, but when the wicked rule, the
21 people mourn.

22 So we ask now that you would
23 give direction in the way that we should
24 go for the great people of this great
25 city. Not only that, we ask that you

14 (Council at ease.)

15 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

16 Thank you so much. Before we proceed,
17 we'd like to ask everyone to please
18 stand. We would have a moment of silence
19 for our good friend and colleague
20 Councilwoman Augusta Clark. Please
21 stand.

22 (Moment of silence.)

23 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

24 Thank you so much.

25 At this time, the Chair

4 Mr. President. Mr. President, I request

8 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
9 Thank you, Councilwoman. Leave shall be
10 granted and the record will reflect your
11 vote. Thank you.

12 The next order of business is
13 the approval of the Journal of the
14 meeting of October 10, 2013.

15 The Chair recognizes Councilman
16 Greenlee.

17 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: Thank
18 you, Mr. President. I move that the
19 Journal of the meeting of Thursday,
20 October 10th, 2013 be approved.

21 (Duly seconded.)

22 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
23 Thank you. It has been moved and
24 properly seconded that the Journal of the
25 meeting of Thursday, October 10, 2013

5 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: No?

10 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The

11 ayes have it. The Journal is approved.

12 The next order of business is

13 the request for leaves of absence.

14 The Chair recognizes Councilman

15 Jones.

16 COUNCILMAN JONES: Thank you,

17 Mr. President. On behalf of the

18 majority, there was one request for leave

19 of absence, which was Councilwoman Tasco.

20 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

21 Actually, I think, Councilman, she

22 actually didn't request leave of absence.

23 She voted.

24 COUNCILMAN JONES: Excused?

25 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Yes.

2 We have that. Thank you, Councilman.

3 The Chair recognizes Councilman

4 O'Brien -- I'm sorry; O'Neill.

5 COUNCILMAN O'NEILL: Thank you,

6 Mr. President. Not the first time,

7 believe me.

8 On behalf of the republicans,

9 there are no requests for leave of
10 absence.

11 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

12 Thank you, Councilman. Yeah. The fire

13 drill kind of threw me off. A little

14 delayed. It's all the smoke and

15 everything.

16 At this time, I will dispense

17 with the regular order of business. I'd

18 just like to welcome and thank all of our

19 guests and visitors that have come here

20 today. We hope that you truly enjoy

21 yourself, so much so that you come back

22 again. We really relish the opportunity

23 to show you your government at work. So,

24 again, thank you, and we look forward to

25 seeing you again. Thank you.

2 At this time, the Chair
3 recognizes Councilwoman Blackwell for the
4 purpose of welcoming special guests
5 joining us in the Chambers this morning.

6 Councilwoman Blackwell.

7 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL: Thank
8 you, Mr. President. I would like to take
9 a moment to recognize four pharmacy
10 students from the University of the
11 Sciences who have set up a table in front
12 of my office, Room 408, to distribute
13 information about the importance of
14 knowing your pharmacist for American
15 Pharmacists Month, and I thank you all
16 for co-sponsoring the resolution.

17 The students are -- and before
18 I name them, let me note that that is the
19 school that Anjali Chainani on my
20 staff -- Anjali, stand up. She's taking
21 two courses, and after this, she'll have
22 only two courses left and her thesis
23 before she has her Ph.D. at the
24 University of Sciences. So we're very
25 proud of her. And, of course, you know,

2 after you train them, they move on. So
3 she'll be leaving at the end of the year
4 to take her last two courses for a Ph.D.

5 And these students who are in
6 front of my office to distribute this
7 information are Ashley Krumaker, a
8 third-year pharmacy student; Matthew
9 Ciapetta, third year; Deanna Bauerlein,
10 second-year student; Terri Pack,
11 second-year student; Breanne Meier;
12 Bailey Colvin; and Rachel Boardman, who
13 are also in their second years
14 undergraduate. So I hope that you and
15 your staff will take advantage of this
16 information. We try to do this every
17 year and support them, and it gives us
18 the chance to get information out to our
19 community and the constituents we serve.

20 Thank you.

21 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

22 Thank you, Councilwoman. Would they
23 please stand to be recognized.

24 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL:

25 They're in front of my office.

3 they're out here.

4 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL: Yeah.
5 They're working hard. So thank you.
6 Thank you.

7 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: I
8 understand. Thank you. Thank you,
9 Councilwoman.

10 At this time, the Chair
11 recognizes Councilman Curtis Jones, who
12 will present a resolution proclaiming
13 Saturday, October 19th, 2013 as Men
14 Against Domestic Violence Day. Would
15 Ms. MoShay LaRen and those accompanying
16 her please join the Councilman at the
17 podium.

18 And joining Councilman Jones,
19 we have Councilman Greenlee, Councilman
20 Kenney, Councilman Johnson, and
21 Councilman Oh and Councilman O'Brien and
22 Councilman Goode and Councilman Green
23 and -- I should have just said the entire
24 male contingent.

25 COUNCILMAN JONES: Some of the

2 men here will not have a reading spot,
3 but they will be here in total support of
4 this concept. One of our members, who
5 happens to be an enlightened male --
6 well, two of them -- stand out even above
7 and beyond the crowd by way of pushing
8 forth this agenda. One of them is
9 Councilman Greenlee, and I want to
10 publicly say that in front of everybody.
11 He doesn't get the credit that he
12 deserves to be leading the charge on
13 behalf of all Councilmembers and
14 particularly men on this issue.

15 The second is one of the
16 freshmen, Councilman Kenyatta Johnson,
17 who has -- and between the two of them,
18 fought for additional dollars to go into
19 domestic abuse beds --

20 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Three
21 million.

22 COUNCILMAN JONES: Three
23 million dollars. He wanted it on the
24 record.

25 But the reason why we are here

2 is that it is not just a female issue.

3 It is an all-of-us issue. And what

4 Ms. LaRen is doing is bringing that rally

5 to Love Park this Saturday to bring that

6 to light.

7 One name that I know some of my

8 colleagues will remember is a young lady

9 that worked for the City of Philadelphia.

10 I won't mention her name. She worked for

11 MOCS, and she was a friend to all

12 Philadelphians in need, worked very hard

13 and diligently, and because of a crime

14 of, quote, "passion" and because of a

15 male that felt entitled to, when the

16 relationship didn't work, take it out on

17 her physically. He murdered her in front

18 of a City facility for all to see, and

19 that touched all of us who knew her in a

20 deep way. Because other than being an

21 enlightened male, I'm also a father, a

22 husband, a brother to women who face this

23 every day, and although things have

24 changed, the statistics in this regard

25 have remained eerily the same, and we men

2 of Council want to stand by you and let
3 you know on this day and every day that
4 we are going to do what we can within our
5 power to change this, as our colleagues
6 have demonstrated tangibly.

7 So, therefore, this resolution
8 proclaiming Saturday, October 19th, 2013
9 as Men Against Domestic Violence Day to
10 raise public awareness to the specter of
11 domestic violence and stand united in
12 support of victims of domestic violence
13 across the City of Philadelphia.

14 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: And
15 whereas, October is recognized as
16 Domestic Violence Awareness Month; and

17 Whereas, victims of domestic
18 violence are vulnerable to chronic
19 poverty, unemployment, underemployment,
20 lack of adequate housing, and lack of
21 safe communities to seek refuge; and

22 COUNCILMAN OH: Whereas,
23 domestic abusers are often motivated by a
24 desire to exert power and control over
25 their victims. Last year, 24 homicides

2 were attributed to domestic violence in
3 the City of Philadelphia; and

4 Whereas, domestic violence
5 negatively affects the quality of life
6 and safety of Philadelphia residents,
7 male or female, every day; however, men
8 are, on average, less likely to speak out
9 against domestic violence; and

10 COUNCILMAN KENNEY: Whereas,
11 the conversation about domestic violence
12 must include men, and men must be offered
13 the same level of support and resources
14 available to other victims. Combatting
15 domestic violence requires a united front
16 of all members of society to condemn
17 perpetrators; and

18 Whereas, members of the
19 Philadelphia community have dedicated
20 their lives to the service of domestic
21 abuse victims and the elimination of
22 domestic violence in official capacities
23 within public and private organizations;

24 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Whereas,
25 MoShay LaRen is one such member of the

2 public who has shown a life-long effort
3 toward the elimination of domestic
4 violence, spreading a message of support
5 and outreach toward victims of domestic
6 violence through a private-sector career
7 with Radio One's WRNB FM and as a
8 community representative on the Board of
9 Directors for the Pennsylvania Coalition
10 Against Domestic Violence. MoShay LaRen
11 is the primary architect of the Man Up
12 rally, dedicated to organizing men around
13 Philadelphia to protest against domestic
14 violence; now therefore

15 COUNCILMAN JONES: Further
16 resolved, that an engrossed copy of this
17 resolution be presented to MoShay LaRen
18 as evidence of our sincere sentiment of
19 this legislative body.

20 (Applause.)

21 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
22 Ms. LaRen, please give remarks.

23 MS. LaREN: This is my first
24 time being present at a City Council
25 meeting, and I just want to say, first of

2 all, good morning and thank you so much
3 to our distinguished members of City
4 Council. We appreciate everything you do
5 for us on a daily basis, and I am so
6 grateful, honored, and thankful that you
7 have taken this issue and embraced it as
8 such to put it in the records of City
9 Council that Saturday will be
10 acknowledged as Men Against Domestic
11 Violence.

12 I realized in my advocacy that
13 started about six years ago when I
14 decided to be brave enough to speak out
15 about my own journey through domestic
16 violence that in order for us to truly
17 eradicate this issue, that we had to
18 broach it on both sides of the equation.
19 And often, and so often, we talk about
20 the victims being women, and
21 statistically 85 percent of them are, but
22 there are 15 percent of them who are male
23 victims, and we need to find out where
24 their stories are, how do you become an
25 abuser, what's your journey. We need to

2 offer them the resources so that they can
3 heal as well.

4 So in doing this, that is our
5 call to action, and I so thank you,
6 Councilman Kenyatta Johnson, Curtis
7 Jones, Councilman Greenlee, and the
8 entire City Council body for
9 acknowledging and embracing this, and
10 hopefully together we can educate,
11 inspire, and empower our City of
12 Philadelphia that this is not just their
13 issue, it is our issue as a community.

14 Again, thank you so much. God
15 bless you.

16 (Applause.)

24 Project Commercial Paper Notes to pay the
25 cost of certain capital projects and

3 An ordinance authorizing

4 generally the continued issuance and sale

10 adopting a rate covenant; and directing

11 the imposition and collection of rates

12 and charges sufficient to comply

14 An ordinance amending an

16 No. 130180) adopting the Operating Budget

17 for Fiscal Year 2014, by making certain

18 additional appropriations needed to meet

19 the unanticipated emergency created by

20 the availability of a state grant to help

21 with the fiscal crisis of the School

22 District of Philadelphia; and

23 An ordinance amending Title 22

24 of The Philadelphia Code, entitled

25 "Public Employees Retirement Code," to

10 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good
11 morning.

12 MS. DRUMGOOLE: Hello. Good
13 morning. I'm very, very excited to be
14 here. Most people know me as Sox, and
15 this is the first time I've been to a
16 Philadelphia City Council meeting.

17 I would like to speak on Bill
18 No. 130635 regarding a proposed annual
19 fee of \$300 a year for sanitation and
20 cleaning expenses for certain duplexes in
21 the City.

22 When I read the bill, I
23 couldn't find, however -- it didn't say
24 how the extra money that was going to be
25 coming in was going to be spent.

2 Now, my favorite day of the
3 week is trash day, and there's no one
4 that works harder for the City of
5 Philadelphia than the men and women who
6 collect our trash every week, and I think
7 we would all agree to that. I think that
8 they should get more recognition for what
9 they do to keep this city running.

10 As a private citizen of
11 Philadelphia, I decided that the best way
12 I could thank them for all of their hard
13 work was to celebrate my own Happy Trash
14 Day. My best friend, Olivia, and I have
15 made Happy Trash Day banners and balloons
16 that welcome them as they come to clean
17 our block. We've also made them
18 thank-you crafts and even had a pizza
19 party. It always feels really good to
20 make the trash men happy and women.

21 I would argue that a portion of
22 the proceeds from Bill No. 130635
23 proposed annual fees go, in some way,
24 directly to the trash collectors of the
25 City of Philadelphia, either as an

2 increase in their pay or in the form of a
3 citywide Happy Trash Day. The Council
4 could also decide to make one day of the
5 year deemed Happy Trash Day and use a
6 week to encourage all Philadelphians to
7 do something nice to thank their trash

9 No one says thank you enough
10 anymore, and a little recognition goes a
11 long way. So I want the City of
12 Philadelphia to be the place that thanks
13 the people who work the hardest for
14 everything they do for the City.
15 Philadelphia trash collectors deserve a
16 Happy Trash Day.

17 Thank you for your time and
18 consideration, and if you have any
19 questions, you're free to attend my next
20 week's Happy Trash Day celebration, which
21 will be on the 2000 block of Dreer Street
22 in District 1.

23 So thank you.

16 this is actually an amendment that would
17 remove half of it, of the \$300 charge,
18 from owner-occupied duplexes. So there
19 actually is a reduction in the amount the
20 City will receive next year, but my
21 amendment today will make sure that it's
22 not in this year's budget so it's not a
23 budget issue in the middle of the year,
24 as the bills are going out right now.

12 think everybody should appreciate our
13 municipal workers.

16 Thank you. Thank you, Councilman. I
17 concur.

19 CHIEF CLERK: Clarc King,
20 commenting on 120118.

21 (Witness approached podium.)

22 MR. KING: Thank you,
23 Mr. President. Thank you,
24 Councilmembers. I am here once again to
25 speak to 120118. I ask that Philadelphia

2 cannot allow the feasibility study
3 regarding the sale of PGW to go any
4 further. Rather, Philadelphia must
5 examine the Wall Street policy of
6 hyperinflation and its impact on city
7 operations and the population's economy.

8 PGW is vital to the economy
9 that supports the population's survival.
10 It supports the standard of living. It
11 cannot be bought for stolen money.

12 The specter of a bail-in
13 process hovers the financial system where
14 customers' deposits are confiscated to
15 rectify the claims of derivative holders
16 in the event of an insolvency crisis.
17 This is totally irrational and
18 intolerable.

19 Our federal government, the
20 administration, our Congress cannot break
21 free from Wall Street's extortion. The
22 restatement of the Glass-Steagall
23 standard in U.S. banking is crucial to
24 the stabilization of the United States.
25 Yet, Congress and the administration will

2 not act to defend the nation or protect
3 the population.

4 The creation of Philadelphia's
5 public bank is necessary for the City's
6 security. A public bank has the power to
7 lift the local economy, expand PGW,
8 funding our schools, installing the

10 facilities.

11 Philadelphia has a great
12 future. The Philadelphia Naval Yard must
13 expand its relations with the U.S. Navy
14 at the Office of Naval Research where
15 science-driven projects are contracted
16 for our participation. Education and
17 economic opportunities exist. Minority
18 education opportunities exist through the
19 Office of Naval Research.

20 Philadelphia needs its own
21 Department of the Navy that can seek out
22 contracts, economic science, research,
23 and education opportunities.

24 Philadelphia has a great future in
25 creating a new financial economic policy

3 make possible.

14 my Councilman, Curtis Jones. Jannie
15 Blackwell was working with me. Housing
16 Authority had evicted me wrongfully. I
17 was in Jannie Blackwell office and I was
18 getting evicted. And I thank you,
19 Jannie, for getting me back in my house.
20 I really appreciate that.

21 But after that, in January, the
22 executive board members of Housing had to
23 resign. So Jannie couldn't really work
24 with my situation no more. So two months
25 later, they came back and evicted me

3 never got eviction notice. Never. Never

11 reason why I'm really standing -- I'm
12 standing on behalf of my daughter,
13 because you didn't just evict me, you
14 evicted my daughter. You evicted my
15 daughter.

16 And I just want to say this:
17 Justice don't hold on you, City Council,
18 myself, my daughter or any child, but
19 justice holds on God, my God, and we
20 coming back for our justice one way or
21 the other, with my City Council people or
22 without y'all.

23 So thank you. I appreciate
24 this opportunity, because I really wasn't
25 going to speak, but I asked my Councilman

3 this issue, because he's working with me

10 long as I got breath in my lungs. It's
11 unacceptable. It was wrong. You know

14 announce that the School District has
15 hired a new Chief Inspector, Mr. Carl
16 Holmes. We look forward to working with
17 him as we strive to improve the safety
18 and the climate of safety in our schools.

19 We'd like to also note, as all
20 of you realize, that the Governor has
21 restored the \$45 million that was held
22 up. I'm told this will restore 80
23 guidance counselors, some assistant
24 principals, maintain sports and music
25 programs at least until the end of the

2 school year, as well as hiring back
3 teachers to eliminate most split-grade
4 classrooms. So at least -- of course, we
5 have to go through this again next year,
6 but at least we've made a beginning in
7 trying to make life better in our school

11 Thank you, Councilwoman.

12 The Chair recognizes Councilman
13 Goode.

14 COUNCILMAN GOODE: Thank you,
15 Mr. President. I just want to wish a
16 belated happy birthday to my favorite
17 Councilwoman-at-Large, our Majority Whip,
18 who celebrated another anniversary of her

7 three small things to discuss. The first

9 by PhillyCORE Leaders to hold an event
10 called SEED Philly, which PECO, I, and
11 others sponsored. There were three
12 entrepreneurial educational ideas
13 competing for \$5,000 in funding.
14 PhillyCORE Leaders received a startup PHL
15 award of \$15,000. Five thousand of it
16 last night was given to a group called 12
17 Plus, who are doing a pilot program in
18 Kensington at a school there, and it's
19 called 12 Plus. They create a sort of
20 room, a place for kids to go and get
21 counseling, help with college
22 applications. The guidance counselors
23 have been removed from that school.
24 Since then, maybe some will be restored.
25 But they do a great job, and they were

2 the recipient in a crowd-sourced
3 conclusion of a \$5,000 award. And the
4 other winner was a teacher in our public
5 school system named Trey Smith, who
6 received a thousand-dollar award to start
7 a program of Math Quiz Bowls among 12
8 high schools in the City of Philadelphia
9 to try to get the children more
10 interested in engineering, math, and
11 science.

12 And so I'd just like to
13 congratulate both the winners and
14 PhillyCORE Leaders for once again putting
15 on a tremendous program. We should all
16 be proud of the activism and energy of
17 that group for the City of Philadelphia.

18 I want to note that perhaps we
19 should have passed a resolution today
20 called Republicans Release Their Hostages
21 Day declared as October 16th. The
22 federal government yesterday stopped the
23 hostage taking, and we now, at least
24 until January, have an operating and
25 working federal government, which we're

2 all thankful for. And also Governor
3 Corbett released the hostage of \$45
4 million to provide it to our schools. I
5 don't know if they got together and
6 coordinated the release of hostages
7 yesterday between the federal and state
8 government, but I was pleased to see it.

9 Finally, there is a great
10 school in North Philadelphia that many of
11 you are probably familiar with called
12 Cristo Rey. It started last year. It's
13 by a former Big 4 accounting executive
14 named John McConnell. I just want to
15 read everybody a little bit of what John
16 wrote recently in an e-mail to his
17 supporters and say what a great
18 institution this is to have in the City.

19 "On Monday and Tuesday of last
20 week, five of our students were assaulted
21 in five separate incidents as they were
22 leaving school in the late afternoon.
23 The incidents occurred a few blocks from
24 the school near a neighborhood
25 convenience store and at the entrance of

2 the subway. We believe the assaults were
3 initiated by a group of teenagers who
4 were targeting our students.

5 Fortunately, none resulted in serious
6 injury.

7 "The School Police and the
8 Philadelphia Police responded, and they
9 provided some security for the kids on
10 Broad Street." I think the school is on
11 the 5200 block there.

12 "Here is the aftermath of the
13 week: Five Cristo Rey students, 14 to
14 16, received minor injuries. Seven
15 dollars in cash, a cell phone, and one
16 gym bag was stolen. Two hundred and
17 forty-two students are now more worried
18 than ever about their daily commute home,
19 even though most won't admit it. All
20 parents, guardians, and faculty and staff
21 are concerned for the safety of our
22 children. All of our faculty and staff
23 are concerned for their own safety, even
24 though most won't admit it.

25 "Two teenage boys have been

1 10/17/13 - STATED - SPEECHES

2 arrested and are in juvenile detention.

3 Several other suspects are still to be

4 apprehended. It is likely that more

5 suspects will be arrested. They are

6 teenagers not much older than their

7 victims. They live in the same

8 neighborhoods as our students, and some

9 know each other by name.

10 "An arrest record will almost

11 certainly ruin the hope of getting a job

12 or living a decent life. So by

13 victimizing others, the aggressors make

14 victims of themselves. We should not

15 forget that they are also our children,

16 misdirected and lost, more in need of our

17 love than our scorn."

18 I just wanted to share that.

19 Cristo Rey is a tremendous school. The

20 students pay for their education by

21 working several days a week and having

22 longer school days the rest of the day.

23 It's a national program. It's a

24 Catholic-based education, and we're just

25 pleased to have them in the City of

1 10/17/13 - STATED - SPEECHES

2 Philadelphia.

3 Thank you, Mr. President.

4 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

5 Thank you, Councilman.

6 The Chair recognizes Councilman

7 Johnson.

8 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Thank you,

9 Council President. First, recently in

10 Harrisburg and through some of your

11 efforts working in partnership with State

12 Representative Cherelle Parker and the

13 Philadelphia delegation, we're starting

14 to see some progress regarding our tax

15 liens bill in Harrisburg. And so

16 hopefully we'll be able to get the ball

17 across the finish line, across the goal

18 line and making sure we find a level

19 of -- another tool that we can use going

20 after what I call slum land and property

21 owners. And so that also will go toward

22 assisting us in addressing the issue of

23 blight.

24 But also I just want to

25 continue to push forward on the issue of

2 gentrification, at least the means
3 testing from the Harrisburg standpoint,
4 that they also continue to take up the
5 cause and get that bill as well across
6 the goal line. And so hopefully those
7 two initiatives will help people who will
8 be significantly impacted as it relates
9 to AVI.

10 And also on another note, the
11 other topic is the issue of
12 transportation, continue to push forward
13 that we will get a bill from Harrisburg
14 that will support one of the most
15 outstanding transportation systems in the
16 country -- that's the award we
17 received -- which is SEPTA. And so
18 there's some debate in Harrisburg right
19 now regarding the transportation bill,
20 but you also have funding for the
21 Philadelphia International Airport. On
22 Tuesday, I'll be up there with State
23 Representative Jordan Harris, continue
24 working and lobbying members of the
25 Philadelphia delegation and also other

2 members of the House of Representatives
3 in support of the transportation bill.

4 And so I just want to make that
5 known for the record.
