16 The Chair now recognizes  
17 Councilman Oh.

18 COUNCILMAN OH: Thank you,  
19 Mr. President. On behalf of the  
20 republicans, a leave of absence is

23 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:  
24 Thank you. Thank you, Councilman. Leave  
25 shall be granted.

2                   At this time, I would like to  
3 dispense with the regular order of  
4 business and I would like to thank and  
5 welcome all visitors here today. We  
6 really appreciate the fact that you've  
7 taken time out of your day to come down  
8 and witness your government in action.  
9 We hope that your experience today is a  
10 pleasurable one, so much so that you come  
11 back. So, again, thank you so much.

12                   Before we start, I would like  
13 to ask if there's anyone who has an  
14 electronic device, be it cell phone,  
15 smart phone, whatever kind of phone that  
16 makes any kind of noise, I would ask that  
17 you please turn it off or turn it on  
18 silent. Thank you very much for your  
19 cooperation.

20                   At this time, the Chair  
21 recognizes Councilwoman Sanchez, who will  
22 present a resolution recognizing and  
23 honoring the Puerto Rican 65th Infantry  
24 Regiment. Would Commander Jose Melendez  
25 and those accompanying him please join

4 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: And  
5 joining Councilwoman Sanchez is  
6 Councilman Oh, and I would like to  
7 recognize a good friend and a colleague  
8 of ours, State Senator Tartaglione.

9 (Applause.)

10 COUNCILWOMAN SANCHEZ: Thank  
11 you, Mr. President. This Council has  
12 been steadfast and consistent in its  
13 support of our men and women who have  
14 served this country that allow us to have  
15 the freedoms that we have today.

16 A couple of weeks ago in a  
17 delegation led by Senator Stack and  
18 Senator Tina Tartaglione, who joins us  
19 this morning, there was a delegation both  
20 at the federal, state, and city level  
21 calling on the United States Congress to  
22 bestow on the Puerto Rican 65th Infantry  
23 the Congressional Gold Medal of Honor,  
24 and when we finish the resolution  
25 presentation, members will speak to that

2 campaign who join us this morning.

3 So I want to ask all of you in  
4 joining me in recognizing and honoring  
5 the tremendous bravery, contributions,  
6 and sacrifices of the Puerto Rican 65th  
7 Infantry Regiment and calling on the  
8 United States Congress to award the  
9 Regiment the Congressional Gold Medal.

10 COUNCILMAN OH: Whereas, the  
11 65th Infantry Regiment hailed from Puerto  
12 Rico and its members were known as the  
13 Borinqueneers; and

14 Whereas, the unit was founded  
15 in 1899 and remained a vital part of the  
16 United States Armed Forces until 1956,  
17 when the Regiment was inactivated; and

18 Whereas, this distinctive  
19 military unit served in multiple  
20 conflicts and members were known for  
21 their fierce fighting spirit; and

22 Whereas, during World War I and  
23 in 1943 the Borinqueneers were sent to  
24 guard the Panama Canal and in 1944 were  
25 deployed in North Africa, Italy, Corsica,

2 France and the Maritime Alps, where they  
3 engaged in their first combat and  
4 suffered 47 casualties; and

5 Whereas, in Korea the Regiment  
6 saw its finest and gravest hour when  
7 facing off against Chinese soldiers in  
8 order to hold open the retreat route for  
9 the Chosin Reservoir; and

10 Whereas, on February 2nd, 1951,  
11 two battalions of Borinqueneers took part  
12 in the last battalion bayonet charge in  
13 the United States military history,  
14 routing Chinese forces from 2 strategic  
15 hilltops south of Seoul; and

16 Whereas, Puerto Rican soldiers  
17 also defended a recuperating United  
18 States Army Division from infiltrating  
19 North Korean soldiers; and

20 Whereas, by the time the  
21 Regiment was inactivated, more than 750  
22 Borinqueneers had died and 2,400 had been  
23 wounded in the Korean War alone; and

24 COUNCILWOMAN SANCHEZ: Whereas,  
25 in 1959, the Regiment was allotted to the

2           Puerto Rican Army National Guard, where  
3           the 1st battalion, the 65th Infantry  
4           still serves; and

5                       Whereas, while defending the  
6           United States, the brave soldiers earned  
7           628 Bronze Stars, 258 Silver Stars, 10  
8           Distinguished Service Crosses, and more  
9           than 2,700 Purple Hearts; and

10                      Whereas, their commitment and  
11           courage are indeed deserving of praise  
12           and gratitude of all Americans; and

13                      Whereas, in recognition of  
14           their tremendous sacrifices and  
15           accomplishments, it is fitting that the  
16           United States Congress award the 65th  
17           Infantry Regiment the Congressional Gold  
18           Medal of Honor; therefore, be it

19                      Resolved, by the Council of the  
20           City of Philadelphia, recognizes and  
21           honors the 65th Infantry Regiment on the  
22           tremendous sacrifices that they have made  
23           in defense of the United States of  
24           America. Their courage is truly an  
25           inspiration, and worthy of the

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2 recognition from the City of  
3 Philadelphia.

4 Further resolved, that the  
5 Council of the City of Philadelphia calls  
6 on the United States Congress to honor  
7 the service of the 65th Infantry Regiment  
8 by awarding them the Congressional Gold  
9 Medal of Honor.

10 Further resolved, that an  
11 engrossed copy will be delivered to the  
12 65th Infantry today presented to the  
13 Latino American Legion and the  
14 Philadelphia Congressional delegation as  
15 a sincere expression of our gratitude and  
16 support for their Congressional Gold  
17 Medal campaign.

18 (Applause.)

19 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The  
20 Chair recognizes Commander and Veterans  
21 Advisor Commissioner Melendez.

22 COMMANDER MELENDEZ: Thank you,  
23 Mr. President. Councilwoman Maria  
24 Quinones, my Senator, Christine  
25 Tartaglione, and a big shout to Curtis

2 Jones. He knows why. Ladies and  
3 gentlemen, there's so many dignitaries  
4 here, there's so many here that I'm  
5 afraid to mention names. I'm going to  
6 stop there.

7 I just want to say thank you on  
8 behalf of the Latin American Legion Post  
9 840 of the American Legion. This is  
10 something that we've been working on very  
11 diligently for a very long time, and it's  
12 uphill. Some of you probably never heard  
13 of the 65th Infantry Regiment before, but  
14 if I were to mention the Tuskegee Airmen,  
15 everybody in this room has. Well, that's  
16 what we want to accomplish for the 65th  
17 Infantry, and the Congressional Gold  
18 Medal will do that. However, in the  
19 Latin American Region Post, we're very  
20 similar to City Council of Philadelphia.  
21 We assign committees to do the work and  
22 then we all take the credit for it.

23 I am very blessed. I have two  
24 committee members who have done the bulk  
25 of the work for me, and I get the credit.

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2 I get to speak in front of my favorite  
3 people.

4 I have George Perez from  
5 Congressman Brady's office and Juvencio  
6 Gonzalez. He's our Chair of the Public  
7 Relations Committee for our post. And we  
8 know our time is very limited, but I  
9 would like them to share with you some of  
10 our success so far and how you can best  
11 help us.

12 Thank you.

13 MR. PEREZ: Thank you,  
14 Mr. President, members of City Council,  
15 one of my senators, Tartaglione. My name  
16 is George Perez. I also work for  
17 Congressman Brady's office.

18 We have a long, long fight  
19 ahead. We still have some Congressmen  
20 from Philadelphia that have not signed on  
21 on this bill in Congress. We urge you to  
22 contact those Congressmen from  
23 Pennsylvania to sign on to this Senate  
24 and House bill that we have in  
25 Washington.

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2 In addition to that, we still  
3 have 93 soldiers missing in action that  
4 the United States has not accounted for.  
5 The bodies are laying half a mile from  
6 the DMZ zone in Korea and we have not  
7 been able to cross that line to get their  
8 remains.

9 So thank you very much. I  
10 appreciate all City Council, especially  
11 Maria for bringing this up and Councilman  
12 Oh for assisting us in this.

13 Thank you very much.

14 (Applause.)

15 MR. GONZALEZ: Good morning.  
16 Thank you, Mr. President, Maria Quinones,  
17 Councilman David Oh, my Senator, Tina  
18 Tartaglione, and of course I can't stop  
19 not saying Henon, Councilman Henon. I  
20 was with him last night, so I get to be  
21 on your program.

22 Basically I want you to  
23 remember, everyone in this room, remember  
24 HR 1726. Google it. It's a very  
25 impressive report of the 65th Infantry,

3           descriptive. I kind of broke down this  
4           morning just reading it, because it talks  
5           about the prejudism, the discrimination,  
6           the things that -- when they were  
7           activated, they had two wars, the Korean  
8           War and they had the war within. And it  
9           has taken 60 years to get here, 60 years  
10          for them to get the Congressional Gold  
11          Medal.

12                         But let me just say, as of  
13          today we have achieved 157 sponsors in  
14          Congress, and we have 22 senators. In  
15          the State of Pennsylvania we still have  
16          11 members of Congress that we want to go  
17          after and to come on board. This is very  
18          impressive. Let me say that when they  
19          came in and when they -- when they  
20          considered the Congressional Gold Medal,  
21          I want to say that in 237 years, only one  
22          Latino has received the award, the  
23          Congressional award, and that has been  
24          Roberto Clemente. It's our turn as the  
25          65th Infantry. The other groups,

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2 Tuskegee, Navajo Code Talkers, the  
3 Japanese Nisei, and the Montford Point  
4 Marines. We want to be number fifth.

5 Let me say that the story of  
6 the 65th Infantry during the Korean War  
7 has been described as one of pride,  
8 courage, heartbreak, and redemption. And  
9 so basically every general that commanded  
10 the 65th Infantry, they did nothing but  
11 praise.

12 Thank you for this  
13 Congressional Gold Medal support.

14 (Applause.)

15 (Council at ease.)

16 (Applause.)

17 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

18 Thank you so much again for your service.

19 At this time, the Chair  
20 recognizes Councilwoman Brown, who will  
21 present a resolution commending the  
22 United States Green Building Council on  
23 selecting Philadelphia as the host city  
24 for the 2013 Greenbuild International  
25 Conference and Expo. Would Ms. Janet

4 And joining Councilwoman Brown,  
5 we have Councilman Kenney, Councilman  
6 Jones, Councilman Johnson, and  
7 Councilwoman Bass.

8 COUNCILWOMAN BROWN: So, Mr.  
9 President, we are excited that next week  
10 for the first time 30,000 attendees from  
11 90 countries will be coming to  
12 Philadelphia as we are more and more  
13 recognized as a city that cares about the  
14 future, particularly when it comes to the  
15 environment and sustainability. And I  
16 would be remiss again, I have no problem  
17 acknowledging that it was Councilman  
18 James Kenney who four, five years ago  
19 made it clear that our city needed to  
20 look at this, the future, issue now in a  
21 more deliberative way.

22 Commending the United States  
23 Green Building Council on selecting  
24 Philadelphia as the host city for the  
25 2013 Greenbuild International Conference

5                        COUNCILMAN KENNEY:   And  
6           whereas, the green building movement is a  
7           global movement, and housing the  
8           conference in Philadelphia will bring  
9           myriad resources to the City for future  
10          prosperity of the region and the global  
11          community, not to mention an awful lot of  
12          hotel rooms, which we like to fill as  
13          much as we possibly can;

14                      Whereas, the Greenbuild  
15          International Conference and Expo offers  
16          invaluable resources to visiting  
17          attendees and City residents alike for  
18          networking, continuing education, and  
19          exchange of ideas and products for the  
20          improvement of sustainability practices,  
21          all crucial to global environmental  
22          health;

23                      COUNCILMAN JONES:   Whereas, the  
24          Greenbuild International Conference and  
25          Expo provides resources for attendees to

3 creating better buildings, giving people  
4 better, brighter, healthier spaces to  
5 live, work, and play; and

6 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Whereas, a  
7 job fair will be held at this year's  
8 Greenbuild International Conference and  
9 Expo, linking qualified applicants with  
10 employers who share values and creating  
11 opportunities for job seekers in the  
12 region; and

13 Whereas, the United States  
14 Green Building Council is committed to a  
15 prosperous and sustainable future through  
16 cost-efficient and energy-saving green  
17 buildings, with 77 local chapters, nearly  
18 13,000 member companies and  
19 organizations, and more than 180,000 LEED  
20 Professional Credential Holders, and is  
21 projected to contribute 554 billion to  
22 the U.S. gross domestic product from 2009  
23 to 2013; and

24 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Whereas,  
25 the Delaware Valley Green Building

9                         Resolved, by the Council of the  
10           City of Philadelphia, commending the  
11           United States Green Building Council on  
12           selecting Philadelphia as the host city  
13           for the 2013 Greenbuild International  
14           Conference and Expo to be held at the  
15           Pennsylvania Convention Center from  
16           November 20th through 22nd, 2013.

17                        COUNCILWOMAN BROWN: Further  
18           resolved, that an engrossed copy of this  
19           resolution be presented to the leadership  
20           and membership of the United States Green  
21           Building Council as evidence of the  
22           sincere sentiments of this legislative  
23           body.

24                        Introduced by myself and  
25           sponsored proudly by all the members of

2           Philadelphia City Council. Let me  
3           underscore that this will be the world's  
4           largest conference and expo dedicated to  
5           green building, again, bringing over  
6           30,000 attendees from 90 countries.  
7           Congratulations to our local chapter.

9                           COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The  
10          Chair recognizes Ms. Milkman for remarks.

11                          MS. MILKMAN: Thank you so  
12          much. My name is Janet Milkman. I'm the  
13          Executive Director of the Delaware Valley  
14          Green Building Council. We're the local  
15          chapter of the U.S. Green Building  
16          Council, and on behalf of both  
17          organizations, I want to thank the City  
18          Council, Council President Clarke,  
19          Councilwoman Blondell Reynolds Brown, and  
20          all of you here today for this wonderful  
21          recognition.

22                          This conference is coming to  
23          Philadelphia for the first time ever. We  
24          want it to come back. It's going to  
25          bring over \$32 million in revenue to our

3           to showcase all of the amazing  
4           sustainability work that's happening in  
5           our region. There will be 35 green  
6           building tours of affordable housing, of

9           and the Barnes Foundation and the  
10          Franklin Institute. It will be an  
11          incredible opportunity to show everyone  
12          how great Philadelphia and our region is  
13          and what a leader we are in  
14          sustainability.

25          the Commissioner of Public Property and

13 Property Maintenance Code) of The  
14 Philadelphia Code, by further amending  
15 construction and demolition practices.

4 you, Mr. President. Today I introduce  
5 one bill.

6 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

10 CHIEF CLERK: An ordinance  
11 authorizing the Commissioner of Public  
12 Property and the Commissioner of Parks

18 Avenue, and 47th Street.

19 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: That

21 The Chair recognizes Councilman

23 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: Thank  
24 you, Mr. President. On your behalf, I

15                   COUNCILMAN JONES: Thanks

6 The Chair again recognizes

11 COUNCILMAN JONES: Thank you,  
12 Mr. President. In addition to the bills  
13 being considered on the Consent Agenda,  
14 the following resolutions and bills are

20 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:  
21 Thank you.

22 Before considering the  
23 resolutions and bills on the Final  
24 Passage Calendar today, we will have a  
25 public comment session. The guidelines

22                      CHIEF CLERK: Jenny Drumgoole,  
23          commenting on 130825.

24                      (Witness approached podium.)

25                      COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good

2 morning.

3 MS. DRUMGOOLE: Good morning.

4 My name is Soxx. Most people call me  
5 Soxx. And I'm here today to speak about  
6 Resolution No. 130825 that urges  
7 Pennsylvania to increase funding to low  
8 income residents to weatherize their  
9 homes. I think this is a great idea,  
10 because no one likes to be cold in their  
11 homes in the winter.

12 It was really cold yesterday,  
13 but you know who was out in the cold and  
14 working all day? The trash collectors.  
15 The trash collectors have been working  
16 when it's raining and when it's snowing  
17 and even when it's really hot outside.

18 The last time I was here, I  
19 invited everyone to my next Happy Trash  
20 Day celebration, which was on Thursday,  
21 October 24th. I know you probably  
22 couldn't come because your meetings are  
23 on Thursdays, but I just wanted to let  
24 you know that we had a great time, and I  
25 want to invite you to the next Happy

2           Trash Day, which will be on Wednesday,  
3           November 27th, and it's really close to  
4           City Hall this time.

5                       For those of you who don't  
6           know, Happy Trash Day is when my friends  
7           and I say thank you to the trash  
8           collectors for all the hard work they do.  
9           During the last Happy Trash Day, we were  
10          able to say thank you to seven trash  
11          crews, and that was pretty great. We  
12          even had representatives from the Streets  
13          Department and union representatives from  
14          the City come. Some news people even  
15          came and wrote stories about Happy Trash  
16          Day, which will be kind of perfect for my  
17          scrapbook. I was able to make lots more  
18          friends. And you know what my new trash  
19          collector friends told me, they said that  
20          no one has ever given them a party or  
21          even said thank you like this for all  
22          their hard work. They said that they  
23          only hear when something is wrong. They  
24          also told me that they haven't had a  
25          raise in many years, which really makes

2 me sad, but it was nice to make them feel  
3 happy on Happy Trash Day.

4 Lots of people posted pictures  
5 on the Internet, and here's what some of  
6 the people wrote about the pictures: I  
7 love this. I really wish I could have  
8 been a part of this. It was really nice.

9 Here's another one, and I think  
10 this is from a trash collector, because  
11 he says, Where was that at? We never get  
12 that type of treatment on our route. And  
13 then we got, That was really nice of  
14 them. That's serious love. And then one  
15 of my favorites was, Throw some wild rice  
16 in there. And that's a trash collector  
17 insider joke, because they have to pick  
18 up lots of trash that's filled with bugs  
19 that look like rice.

20 So anyway, our trash collectors  
21 do a really hard job, and that's why I  
22 think the City of Philadelphia should  
23 have an annual Happy Trash Day Week, and  
24 then we could all give them one big party  
25 at the end.

2 A lot of people in the City  
3 don't know the right way to throw out  
4 their trash. Happy Trash Day, we could  
5 also help people learn what to do about  
6 that, like what to do with their old  
7 paint and batteries and light bulbs,  
8 because people aren't supposed to put  
9 that in the regular trash, and they do,  
10 and that's not good.

11 So the next Happy Trash Day  
12 will be the day before Thanksgiving,  
13 Wednesday, November 27th, on the 100  
14 block of Mole Street, and that's only a  
15 few blocks away from here, and what  
16 better time to say thank you than at  
17 Thanksgiving time. I know I'm very  
18 thankful for all of their hard work.

19 So I also have some Happy Trash  
20 Day buttons that I've passed out before.  
21 They all went on Happy Trash Day, over  
22 200. So if anyone would like some, you  
23 can have them here.

24 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

25 Thank you.

2 MS. DRUMGOOLE: It's just  
3 glitter and bottle caps that people throw  
4 out and beans in many colors.

5 So thank you very much.

6 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

7 Thank you.

8 MS. DRUMGOOLE: Happy Trash  
9 Day.

10 (Applause.)

11 CHIEF CLERK: Sheila Colson.

12 (Witness approached podium.)

13 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good  
14 morning.

15 MS. COLSON: Good morning. My  
16 name is Sheila Colson. I am a  
17 56-year-old trans woman. I would like to  
18 say that I'm here today because of the  
19 resolution and I was invited by some  
20 friends of mine.

21 This is an historical day for  
22 me, because I would have never thought  
23 that -- well, I would hope, but I never  
24 thought that I would see the day that  
25 Philadelphia even considers trans people.

1           11/14/13 - STATED - PUBLIC COMMENT

2           So I have to applaud you for that.

3           Unfortunately, though, the work has just  
4           begun, and it certainly has to go a lot  
5           further.

6                        I'm on the Mayor's task force  
7           for the homeless, and we have been able  
8           to get trans women who identify as --  
9           trans people who identify as women into  
10          female shelters, and when they get into  
11          the shelters, they are welcomed, but when  
12          the person that takes them to the shelter  
13          leaves, then they say, You're not a  
14          woman, you got to get out of here, you  
15          know.

16                       The employment, I believe  
17          something was just passed as far as  
18          employment, but it's great that you guys  
19          are passing these laws and all the laws  
20          and the resolutions and all that stuff is  
21          being passed, but unfortunately, we need  
22          someone to watch the watchers, you know,  
23          because people bring their own agenda to  
24          work sometimes. People bring their own  
25          agenda into and everybody -- every right

2           that's afforded to anyone in this room  
3           should be afforded to me. Every right  
4           that's afforded to anyone in this room  
5           should be afforded to me.

6                        So I don't understand why when  
7           a girl goes into a shelter and it's three  
8           degrees outside and when the person takes  
9           them there, she's all right to be there,  
10          but after the case manager leaves, Oh,  
11          you got to go. They want to send you to  
12          a male shelter. And we do have the  
13          Morris Home, and it's a great place and  
14          it's for trans people, but you need --  
15          the Morris Home only has eight beds.  
16          There's like 50 homeless trans people in  
17          the City of Philadelphia.

18                       I see I'm running out of time.  
19          But, like I said, this is a historical  
20          day on one part, but then again, it's not  
21          really that much. I mean -- but thank  
22          you so much.

23                       COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

24          Thank you for your testimony.

25                       (Applause.)

2 CHIEF CLERK: Jordan Davis,  
3 commenting on Transgender Week  
4 resolution.

5 (Witness approached podium.)

6 MS. JORDAN: Good morning. My  
7 name is Jordan Gwendolyn Davis, and I  
8 would like to thank Councilmember Kenney  
9 for introducing this resolution declaring  
10 November 17th through the 23rd as  
11 Transgender Awareness Week in  
12 Philadelphia. This is a relatively new  
13 concept devised by GLAAD last year to  
14 supplement the Transgender Day of  
15 Remembrance. While this should not  
16 detract from the somberness of TDOR,  
17 Trans Awareness Week should also stand  
18 for hope, empowerment, and education.

19 Mara Keisling said it best at  
20 the NCTE's 10th anniversary celebration  
21 this week. This is our moment, and  
22 indeed 2013 has been a historic year for  
23 Philadelphia's transgender community. On  
24 July 1st, SEPTA finally implemented the  
25 elimination of gender stickers from

2           passes as they promised in spring 2012.  
3           This was made possible by years of  
4           organizing by Riders Against Gender  
5           Exclusion, or RAGE, as well as the  
6           resolution unanimously passed by this  
7           body shortly before their decision.

8                        I was proud to have worked on  
9           this resolution. I thank Councilmember  
10          Reynolds Brown's office for moving on  
11          this and all members of City Council for  
12          voting yes.

13                      This year also marked the  
14          passage of Bill 130224, an omnibus bill  
15          that overhauled the City code to provide  
16          further protections for the LGB and  
17          especially T community here in  
18          Philadelphia from transition-related  
19          health benefits, the bathrooms and more.  
20          Kathy Padilla and myself worked long  
21          hours to make sure that this bill was  
22          trans inclusive.

23                      In addition to the many  
24          stakeholders, I would like to thank  
25          Councilmember Kenney as well as

2           Councilmember Squilla, Johnson,  
3           Blackwell, Jones, Clarke, Henon, Sanchez,  
4           Bass, Tasco, Greenlee, Reynolds Brown,  
5           Goode, and O'Brien for voting yes on this  
6           bill and moving Philadelphia light years  
7           ahead in terms of LGB and especially T  
8           rights, and I'd like to thank Mayor  
9           Nutter for putting his signature on it as  
10          well.

11                        It has not been all roses for  
12          Philadelphia for the transgender  
13          community this year. Diamond Williams, a  
14          transgender woman of color, was found  
15          brutally murdered this July, marking at  
16          least the fifth known anti-trans hate  
17          murder in the last 15 years. In  
18          addition, the criminal justice system,  
19          from the cops to the DA to the City jail,  
20          is still a hipe of trans phobia, and  
21          despite attempts at administrative  
22          remedies, the shelter system in  
23          Philadelphia can still be mercurial  
24          towards the rights of transgender  
25          clients.

2 In addition, as I testified  
3 before the Law and Public Safety  
4 Committee last week, street harassment is  
5 still a problem affecting members of our  
6 community. Let us use these promises and  
7 problems, these challenges and tragedies  
8 to take action and to make sure that come  
9 whatever may, we work to make respect for  
10 gender identity and authentic lives a  
11 preemptory and norm in the City.

12 Thank you very much.

13 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

14 Thank you for your testimony.

15 (Applause.)

16 CHIEF CLERK: Robert Taylor,  
17 commenting on 130384.

18 (Witness approached podium.)

19 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good  
20 morning, sir.

21 MR. TAYLOR: Good morning,  
22 Mr. President. Good morning, members of  
23 Council, ladies and gentlemen. I'm  
24 Robert Taylor, citizen of South  
25 Philadelphia, President of Transport

2 Workers Local 700 and a member of the PA  
3 Council and commentator on WPEB 88.1 FM,  
4 the Jasper Jones Show.

5 I'm commenting on Bill No.  
6 130384. Normally I speak about the  
7 various parking regulations and how they  
8 expand. Today, however, I want to thank  
9 Councilman Johnson for introducing this  
10 measure that will terminate such a  
11 regulation. I want to thank the  
12 Councilman for restoring at liberty at  
13 least one bit at a time, reducing the  
14 difficulties for people parking in their  
15 own community and, therefore, reducing  
16 the chance of anyone running afoul of the  
17 law in that small way.

18 I look forward to more such  
19 measures being put forward, and obviously  
20 I support this bill and I urge its  
21 passage.

22 Integrity leads to freedom,  
23 Cato.

24 And I thank you for your time.  
25 God bless Philadelphia.

3 Thank you, sir.

4 (Applause.)

5 CHIEF CLERK: Clarc King,

6 commenting on 120118.

7 (Witness approached podium.)

8 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good

9 morning.

10 MR. KING: Good morning,

11 Mr. President. Thank you. Thank you,

12 Councilmembers. I'm here to address the

13 Resolution 120118. That is the

14 feasibility study authorizing the sale

15 and/or operation of Philadelphia Gas

16 Works to a private entity.

17 Philadelphia political

18 leadership must be informed that the

19 private-sector finance system that

20 supports the proposed sale of PGW is

21 dependent on the Federal Reserve's

22 unlimited bailout system. It is only

23 through expanding the City's capacity to

24 increase energy flux density per capita

25 per square mile that economy growth can

2 occur.

3 PGW is vital to the City's  
4 economy formation, an economy platform  
5 that can bring the City into the hydrogen  
6 economy and on into the fusion economy.  
7 There is no such thing as limits to  
8 growth. There is only limitless growth.

9 However, through the logic of  
10 private-sector finance, contraction is  
11 demanded in every sector of the  
12 population's economy. Labor, the basis  
13 of capital formation, is purged. Schools  
14 and hospitals are to be closed, police,  
15 fire, teachers, and medical professionals  
16 are all threatened. We suffer a constant  
17 degradation of our standard of living.

18 Philadelphia must seek its  
19 independence from the private-sector  
20 finance. Philadelphia is in control of  
21 about \$6.5 billion in assets. The City  
22 has its own redevelopment corporation.  
23 Philadelphia Gas Works can be improved  
24 and expanded through the facilitation of  
25 its own agencies. The Pennsylvania

2 Energy Fund, a \$650 million fund, may  
3 serve as a resource for PGW.

4 Philadelphia has many agencies,  
5 and so an intercity agency for financing  
6 and funding a corporation through a  
7 public bank could be formed. I ask the  
8 City in this collapsing economy to go  
9 back to old-school government, invest  
10 through a public bank in education,  
11 health, and science-driven infrastructure  
12 projects that facilitate economy  
13 platforms creating the higher order of  
14 existence humanity demands.

15 Thank you so much.

16 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

17 Thank you, sir.

18 (Applause.)

19 CHIEF CLERK: Cye Sheppard,  
20 commenting on 120118.

21 (Witness approached podium.)

22 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good  
23 morning.

24 MR. SHEPPARD: Good afternoon,  
25 Mr. President. Good afternoon, City

1           11/14/13 - STATED - PUBLIC COMMENT  
2           Council. Good afternoon, citizens. I'm  
3           commenting on 120118, and it's still -- I  
4           concur with the brother just before me  
5           that we should not even consider selling  
6           Philadelphia Gas Works or consider  
7           selling the Liquor Control Board or  
8           consider selling the Turnpike or consider  
9           selling our schools, you know, or  
10          consider a lot of things.

11                       Everything is about  
12          privatization now. It's capitalization.  
13          And it's a shame, because these are  
14          funding sources for Philadelphia, but if  
15          somebody makes a significant contribution  
16          to your campaign and back-door deals,  
17          then it's incentivized to make these  
18          deals happen, because our rates will go  
19          up and there's deregulation. So we got  
20          to think smart and look out for our  
21          future.

22                       Another thing, I have three  
23          minutes up here, whereas City Council and  
24          their staff have all day, all week. So  
25          I'm going to make a motion to extend

2 public comments to ten minutes.

3 I second that motion.

4 You've heard the question. Are  
5 you prepared to vote?

6 Yes.

7 All in favor?

8 Aye.

9 The motion carries.

10 So now I got an extra six  
11 minutes. Just kidding.

12 So this thing about a 33  
13 million tax break for billionaires, who  
14 is going to make up the difference? The  
15 poor people. We always do. No input on  
16 selling these schools. They're our  
17 schools. They're not the SRC's schools.  
18 They're not the Board of Education's  
19 schools. They're not City Council's  
20 schools. They're not Nutter schools.  
21 They're not Corbett schools. They're our  
22 schools. But have me or anybody else  
23 here been invited to a public hearing to  
24 say what should we do with Germantown  
25 High, what should we have done with West

2 Philly High? No. So it's the tail  
3 wagging the dog.

4 It used to be things like  
5 statesmen and people service the people,  
6 like David Richardson. Now it's like  
7 it's not representative. It's like y'all

10 So I'm going to close by saying  
11 we don't need Dilworth Skating Rink,  
12 because what did it do? It displaced a  
13 lot of homeless. I asked Al Sharpton  
14 yesterday, I said, What happens to a  
15 politician who gets in office and then in  
16 two years he sells his soul to the devil?  
17 He makes money and stack as much as he  
18 can to see how long he can stay in  
19 office. You know what he did? He  
20 deferred to somebody else.

21 My closing statement will be,  
22 there's one person here I know that's  
23 worth their soul, Jannie Blackwell.  
24 There's other people I'm watching,  
25 brother Kenyatta Johnson, you know,

2 brother Wilson Goode.

3 There's no \$33 million tax  
4 break.

5 And, lastly, you know, that  
6 Henon guy, Councilman Henon, he's going  
7 to be tough to deal with. He going to

9 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Sir.

10 MR. SHEPPARD: I'm Cyé Harold  
11 Sheppard --

12 (Microphone was cut off.)

13 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: All  
14 right, sir. Your time is up. Thank you.

15 (Applause.)

16 CHIEF CLERK: There are no  
17 other speakers on the public comment  
18 list, Mr. President.

19 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:  
20 Thank you so much. Thank you very much.

21 We will now consider today's

23           while, arguably one of the largest in the  
24           history of the world.

25                   One would ask why are we

10          correctly, either we recognize that the  
11          earth is trying to heal itself or it will  
12          remind us.

13                    So we want to recognize those  
14          who are relieving suffering of the  
15          Filipinos that lost their lives and those  
16          who survived that tragic storm. And I'd  
17          like it to be recognized in a standing  
18          vote by members.

19                    (Duly seconded.)

20                    COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: It's  
21          been moved and properly seconded, and we  
22          have a standing vote, please, for those  
23          victims of the storm.

24                    (All members standing.)

25                    COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

11 The Chair recognizes Councilman  
12 O'Brien.

13 COUNCILMAN O'BRIEN: Thank you,  
14 Mr. President. In early October, the Law  
15 and Government Committee held an  
16 investigatory hearing regarding the  
17 Mayor's request for proposal seeking a  
18 private entity to provide legal  
19 representation to indigent clients where  
20 the Defenders Association is prohibited  
21 from providing representation due to a  
22 conflict of interest.

23 The Administration initially  
24 proposed a \$10 million one-year deal,  
25 designed to purposefully avoid City

2           Council input. I called for this hearing  
3           after many unsuccessful attempts to  
4           persuade the Administration to scrap  
5           their plan and start anew.

6                     At the hearing, not one of the  
7           ten local, state, and national expert  
8           witnesses endorsed the Administration's  
9           for-profit model. Additionally, the  
10          well-regarded experts illuminated  
11          countless fundamental flaws that  
12          compromise justice, leave the City ripe  
13          for litigation and more unforeseen  
14          expenses. There was only one witness at  
15          the hearing and only one voice in the  
16          entire conversation that believed this  
17          for-profit model was a good idea, the  
18          Administration.

19                    Subsequent to our hearing, I  
20          met with Mayor Nutter on October 18th,  
21          2013 to discuss this defective for-profit  
22          model in the hopes that he would change  
23          his course. In that conversation, I  
24          stated I was not going away on this  
25          issue. I respectfully told the Mayor

2           that I am digging in with my staff,  
3           because proper legal representation is a  
4           constitutional right, and this is an  
5           inherently flawed model.

6                     Today, I honor those words by  
7           introducing legislation co-sponsored by  
8           Councilman Greenlee to address some of  
9           those concerns. One measure seeks to  
10          establish reporting and auditing  
11          requirements for certain contracts for  
12          conflict counsel for indigent  
13          individuals. This bill will require the  
14          Mayor to submit to Council a  
15          comprehensive performance and financial  
16          audit report. This audit will be  
17          performed by a seasoned third party from  
18          the indigent defense world and will hold  
19          the work of the contracted firm in plain  
20          sight for our examination.

21                    The second measure proposes an  
22          amendment to The Philadelphia Home Rule  
23          Charter which will require City Council  
24          approval for certain contracts for one  
25          year or less for the purpose of providing

2                   legal representation and related services  
3                   for indigent persons.

4                   I understand that a Charter  
5                   change is a heavy consideration for this  
6                   body and our citizens, but we are talking  
7                   about preserving the constitutional  
8                   rights of those most vulnerable among us.  
9                   Therefore, I am very comfortable taking  
10                  this course of action.

11                  This isn't about being against  
12                  something. This is about being for  
13                  something. I am for transparency,  
14                  inclusiveness and, most importantly,  
15                  justice.

16                  I have respectfully asked the  
17                  Administration to scrap the plan and  
18                  start over numerous times, but to no  
19                  avail. Metaphorically speaking, there  
20                  are hills you die on. This is what I  
21                  tell my staff when we are confronted with  
22                  issues that present a conflict to our  
23                  values, personal constitutions, and what  
24                  is ultimately just and fair.

25                  With my staff in tow, I am now

3           a hill you die on. This is the hill I'm  
4           dying on.

5                   Thank you, Mr. President.

6                   COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

7           Thank you so much, Councilman.

8                   The Chair recognizes  
9           Councilwoman Reynolds Brown.

10                   COUNCILWOMAN BROWN: Thank you,  
11           Mr. President. First I have an  
12           announcement and then remarks.

13                   In keeping with the work we  
14           started this past spring regarding the  
15           status of women and girls in  
16           Philadelphia, this afternoon as a part of  
17           our monthly Brown Bag series for women  
18           and all enlightened men, I invite staff  
19           and colleagues to hear a conversation  
20           with Dr. Heidi Hartmann. She serves as  
21           President of the Washington-based  
22           Institute for Women's Policy Research.  
23           She is an international feminist  
24           economist and is here in Philadelphia as  
25           a 2013 Scholar-in-Residence at the

5 part of our monthly Brown Bag series.

6 Today, I also wish to shine a  
7 light on House Bill No. 1047 in  
8 Harrisburg. 1047 -- utility companies  
9 were granted -- well, forgive me. In  
10 2004, utility companies were granted  
11 broad authority regarding shut-offs,  
12 reconnections, payment agreements,  
13 medical certifications, and LIHEAP, also  
14 known as the Low Income Home Energy  
15 Assistance Program. This bill is about  
16 to go off into the sunset, and I believe  
17 that is where it should stay.

18 Some in Harrisburg want to  
19 reauthorize the bill. To be clear, House  
20 Bill 1047 does the following: It  
21 restricts low-income customers in the  
22 Utilities Customer Assistance Program  
23 from arranging a reasonable payment plan.  
24 House Bill 1047 allows utilities to  
25 terminate service without personally

2           contacting customers three days prior to  
3           and on the day of termination. House  
4           Bill 1047 allows utilities to terminate  
5           service in the winter, from December 1  
6           through March 31st. House Bill 1047  
7           allows utilities to direct LIHEAP and  
8           Crisis payments using these dollars for  
9           their own general fund rather than to  
10          restore them or prevent termination of  
11          service.

12                        My colleagues and I certainly  
13          understand that a lot of pain is caused  
14          across the City, because shortly we'll be  
15          getting lots of calls for help from  
16          citizens, most notably seniors, children  
17          suffering with health issues due to the  
18          cold, and parents given payment plans  
19          that they cannot afford. I wish to add  
20          my voice to the growing list of leaders  
21          calling for an end to this policy.

22                        Representative Curtis Thomas,  
23          Sam Staten of Laborers International  
24          Local 332, Pete Matthews of AFSCME  
25          District Council 33, and others

2           understand that people are suffering.  
3           They understand that if you cannot pay  
4           your utility bill, it does not make you a  
5           bad person. It makes you a person in a  
6           bad situation.

7                        To quote our city's consumer  
8           advocate, I think the issue is the  
9           failure of the PUC to mandate affordable  
10          low-income plans, affordable terms to  
11          avoid termination, and the failure of the  
12          PUC to see the issue of poverty as an  
13          issue that should not be solved by  
14          forcing people to suffer the cold without  
15          heat. He goes on further to say that the  
16          republican-controlled SRC allows its lack  
17          of caring and decision to put its  
18          ideology ahead of reason by not seeing  
19          that students who lack heat, students who  
20          lack hot water, students who don't have  
21          cooking stoves suffer academically.  
22          There's a lot of research to prove that  
23          so.

24                        Thus, I am encouraging everyone  
25          to call your State Reps, ask them to

6                   Thank you, Mr. President. I  
7                   appreciate speaking on behalf of those  
8                   who most benefit from the LIHEAP  
9                   programs. Thank you.

10                  COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:  
11                  Thank you, Councilwoman.

12                  (Applause.)

13                  COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: And  
14                  the Chair recognizes Councilwoman  
15                  Blackwell.

16                  COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL: Thank  
17                  you, Mr. President. I certainly  
18                  associate myself and agree with all those  
19                  comments just made.

20                  As a reminder, tomorrow at  
21                  10:00 a.m. in the Caucus Room,  
22                  Ms. Wendella Fox, Director of the Office  
23                  of Civil Rights, United States Department  
24                  of Education, will brief Council on the  
25                  responsibilities and duties of her

3           complaints filed by students or their  
4           parents from kindergarten through

10          time to be present.

11                        Thank you.

12                        COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

13           Thank you, Councilwoman.

14                        The Chair recognizes Councilman  
15           Jones.

16                        COUNCILMAN JONES: Thank you,  
17           Mr. President. I was not going to do a  
18           speech of the majority. I know you were  
19           anxiously anticipating the light going  
20           on, but I was not going to do it until my  
21           colleague Councilwoman Reynolds Brown  
22           rose to shed the light on House Bill  
23           1047.

24                        I have held the bill requiring  
25           a 20 percent increase in the payment to

2           the City of Philadelphia to be dedicated  
3           for energy conservation and programs like  
4           this since last session. I want to  
5           announce that I'm not going to hold it  
6           again, not another week, because the  
7           temperature outside is below 32 degrees  
8           today and that those gas bills are going  
9           to hit the mail for November, and more  
10          people will be homeless due to utility  
11          shut-offs than ever because of mortgage  
12          foreclosures.

13                        There are -- I know every one  
14          of my colleagues in this Chamber gets a  
15          call at least once a week this time of  
16          year about utility shut-offs and things  
17          like that.

18                        They have come up with a new  
19          term for poor, a super poor. I mean, not  
20          super person, not super abilities, but  
21          below the category of poor, so poor that  
22          some of the traditional programs like CAP  
23          and LIHEAP don't even apply. There is a  
24          category of poor today that because of  
25          the circumstances of the house, because

2           of energy leaks through the roof, because  
3           of cracks in the window, they won't even  
4           bother to weatherize it because it's just  
5           beyond help.

6                     We have the ability --  
7           everything has going up in the last 20  
8           years, except what the City gets from  
9           PGW. Gas has gone up. Rent has gone up.  
10          Food has gone up. Definitely our  
11          constituents' taxes have gone up, but the  
12          only thing that remains the same is the  
13          PGW amount to the City of Philadelphia.

14                    We will consider this bill, and  
15          in the proud tradition of my colleague  
16          Councilwoman Blackwell that doesn't mind  
17          going down 16 to 1 on a vote or Wilson  
18          Goode who rarely checks a poll before he  
19          does something, we're going to call this  
20          vote, because too many of my constituents  
21          asked me at AVI workshops, Councilman,  
22          it's nice what you do for the super poor,  
23          but what are you going to do for the  
24          maintenance of the middle class? And  
25          next week we're going to answer that

2           question, at least incrementally, 10  
3           percent, that we're going to do something  
4           to weatherize, reduce their utility  
5           expenditures and help them out.

6                   Everybody else gets bailed out,  
7           Wall Street to Main Street, except our  
8           streets, and we're going to vote next  
9           week.

10                   Thank you, Mr. President.

11                   COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

12           Thank you, Councilman.

13                   (Applause.)

14                   COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: That  
15           concludes our speeches on the minority  
16           and majority. So with that, I would ask  
17           Councilwoman Brown to give us a motion to  
18           adjourn this session.

19                   COUNCILWOMAN BROWN: Certainly,  
20           Mr. President. I move that Council stand  
21           adjourned until Thursday, November the  
22           21st, 2013 at 10:00 a.m.

23                   (Duly seconded.)

24                   COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: It  
25           has been moved and properly seconded that

2                   Council stand adjourned until November  
3                   21st, 2013, 10:00 a.m.

4                   All those in favor say aye.  
5                   (Aye.)

6                   COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

10                  Council is adjourned.

11                  Thank you all very much.
