2                   (Members and guests rise.)

3                   FATHER WETZEL: Let us pray.

4                   Lord, inspire this body today  
5 with the qualities of good counsel. Give  
6 this City Council insight to make wise  
7 decisions, integrity to face truth,  
8 courage to make difficult choices, and  
9 compassion for the needs of others.

10                  Make those here present a model  
11 of justice and honor for the world.

12                  Lord, today we pray for our  
13 Mayor, for the various levels of City  
14 officials and, in particular, for this  
15 assembled City Council. Grant them  
16 wisdom to govern amid conflicting  
17 interests in issues of our times, a sense  
18 of welfare and true needs of our people,  
19 a keen thirst for justice and  
20 righteousness, confidence in what is good  
21 and fitting, personal peace in their  
22 lives and joy in their tasks.

23                  I pray for the agenda set  
24 before them today. Give them an  
25 assurance of what would please you and

8                     COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

9           Thank you so much for those inspiring  
10          words.

11                    (Council at ease.)

12                    COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

13          Thank you so much.

14                    Our next order of business is  
15          the approval of the Journal of the  
16          meeting of Thursday, February 20th, 2014.

17                    The Chair recognizes Councilman  
18          Greenlee.

19                    COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: Thank  
20          you, Mr. President. I move that the  
21          Journal of the meeting of Thursday,  
22          February 20th, 2014 be approved.

23                    (Duly seconded.)

24                    COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: It  
25          has been moved and properly seconded that

6                   COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

9                   COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:   The  
10           ayes have it, and the Journal is  
11           approved.

12                   The next order of business is  
13           requests for leave of absence.

14                   The Chair recognizes Councilman  
15           Jones.

16                   COUNCILMAN JONES:   Thank you,  
17           Mr. President.   On behalf of the  
18           majority, there are no requests for  
19           leaves of absence today.

20                   COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

21           Thank you.   Thank you very much,  
22           Councilman.

23                   The Chair recognizes Councilman  
24           O'Neill.

25                   COUNCILMAN O'NEILL:   Thank you,

2           Mr. President. On behalf of the  
3           republicans, there are no requests for  
4           leave of absence.

5                        COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

6           Thank you. Thank you, Councilman.

7                        At this time, I will dispense  
8           with the regular order of business. I  
9           would like to welcome everyone here  
10          today. I want to thank you very much for  
11          coming down to see your government in  
12          action. We really appreciate you taking  
13          time out of your day, and we hope that  
14          your experience today is so nice that you  
15          do it twice and you come back again. So  
16          thank you very much.

17                      At this time, the Chair  
18          recognizes Councilman Oh, who will  
19          present a resolution recognizing 2014 as  
20          the Year of the Veteran in Philadelphia.  
21          Would Scott Brown and those accompanying  
22          him please join the Councilman at the  
23          podium.

24                      And joining Councilman Oh, we  
25          also have Councilman Squilla and

3                   COUNCILMAN OH: Thank you very  
4           much, Council President. I would also  
5           ask all the veteran organization leaders  
6           to join us up here while we read and  
7           present this resolution. Thank you very  
8           much. Please come up.

9                   (Applause.)

10                   COUNCILMAN OH: As our veteran  
11           organization leaders are assembling, let  
12           me first start by thanking our Council  
13           President for his leadership as Council  
14           President in really focusing attention of  
15           our city government on veterans,  
16           revitalizing our city's Veterans Advisory  
17           Commission. And I'm very proud to say  
18           that we will be hearing shortly from our  
19           new Executive Director.

20                   Joining me are my  
21           co-introducers, Councilman Mark Squilla,  
22           Councilwoman Jannie Blackwell, and let me  
23           just say that any year could be Year of  
24           the Veteran. This is a special year for  
25           us. Any year could be Year of the

2           Veteran, but this year is Year of the  
3           Veteran and it will be such a year if we  
4           make it so, and that is the point of this  
5           resolution. So let's make it so.

6                       This is a City Council  
7           resolution passed by all members of City  
8           Council recognizing 2014 as the Year of  
9           the Veteran in Philadelphia to highlight  
10          and celebrate the accomplishments as well  
11          as to continue to raise public awareness  
12          of issues related to veterans and the  
13          ongoing initiatives to serve those who  
14          have served.

15                      Whereas, Philadelphia is the  
16          birthplace of the United States Army,  
17          United States Navy and the United States  
18          Marine Corps, establishing a link between  
19          our city and those who have served our  
20          country dating back to pre-Revolutionary  
21          War times; and

22                      Whereas, veterans from past  
23          wars and peace time as well as those  
24          currently serving from overseas military  
25          duty to Philadelphia are part of the

2           foundation of our community having served  
3           our country in the armed forces, putting  
4           themselves in harm's way, willing to make  
5           the ultimate sacrifice, to protect us and  
6           preserve our liberties; and

7                       Whereas, there are roughly  
8           88,000 veterans living in Philadelphia  
9           with service spanning World War II until  
10          the present, men and women of all races,  
11          religions, ethnicities, gender  
12          identifications and physical abilities;  
13          and

14                      Whereas, a new generation of  
15          veterans, including many female veterans,  
16          are returning from service and choosing  
17          to live, work and further their education  
18          in Philadelphia; and

19                      COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL: Thank  
20          you. Before I read my section, let me  
21          acknowledge the late and great Lucien  
22          Blackwell, who was a Korean War veteran,  
23          and Ed Speller from the Veterans Advisory  
24          Commission, who could not be here today.

25                      Whereas, veterans offer our

2           city a talented and experienced pool of  
3           leaders, workers and neighbors; and

4                       Whereas, many vets face  
5           challenges in living to their fullest  
6           potential because of the injuries, both  
7           mental and physical, suffered during  
8           their service; and

9                       Whereas, in 2012, Philadelphia  
10          became the first city in America to offer  
11          a tax credit to employers hiring  
12          returning vets which will be assessed and  
13          modified as needed in 2014; and

14                      Whereas, in 2012, a coalition  
15          was formed to include the City of  
16          Philadelphia, the Department of Veteran  
17          Affairs and other partner non-profit  
18          organizations, such as the Veterans  
19          Multi-Service Center, to end veteran  
20          homelessness in Philadelphia by the end  
21          of 2014; and

22                      COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: And I want  
23          to say too before I read my section is  
24          that it's an honor and a privilege for me  
25          to be here and to be part of this

2           opportunity to honor the people who have  
3           fought for our freedom and given us what  
4           we have and have here today.

5                       Whereas, City Council passed a  
6           Resolution authorizing the Committee on  
7           Global Opportunities and the  
8           Creative/Innovative Economy to hold  
9           hearings on the state of veterans in  
10          Philadelphia which will be held in 2014;  
11          and

12                      Whereas, the Philadelphia Free  
13          Library, One Book, One Philadelphia  
14          Program has chosen The Yellow Birds by  
15          Kevin Powers, a tale of a veteran's  
16          experience while at war, as it is  
17          selected for discussion and events to be  
18          held throughout the City in 52 existing  
19          libraries; and

20                      Whereas, Philadelphia will host  
21          the Veterans Wheelchair Games in August  
22          2014, with over 600 competitors from all  
23          over the nation traveling to Philadelphia  
24          in order to participate; now, therefore,  
25          be it

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2                   Resolved, by the City Council  
3                   of the City of Philadelphia, that it  
4                   hereby recognizes 2014 as the Year of the  
5                   Veteran in Philadelphia to highlight and  
6                   celebrate the accomplishments as well as  
7                   continue to raise public awareness of  
8                   issues related to veterans and ongoing  
9                   initiatives to serve those who have  
10                  served us.

11                  Thank you.

12                  (Appause.)

13                  COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The  
14                  Chair recognizes --

15                  COUNCILMAN OH: At this time,  
16                  I'd like to present the resolution to  
17                  Scott Brown, Executive Director of the  
18                  Philadelphia Veterans Advisory  
19                  Commission.

20                  (Appause.)

21                  MR. BROWN: Council President  
22                  Darrell Clarke, Councilman Oh, Councilman  
23                  Squilla, Councilwoman Blackwell,  
24                  Councilmembers, colleagues, the Veterans  
25                  Commission, and fellow veterans, good

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2           morning.

3                         (Good morning.)

4                         MR. BROWN: It is with great  
5           honor that I accept the job as Director  
6           of Veterans Advisory Commission and  
7           County Director of Veterans Affairs for  
8           the City of Philadelphia. I am truly  
9           humbled by this choice and thank all who  
10          have helped me get here.

11                        Though contrary to my first  
12          piece of news media released, I am a  
13          veteran who served in the United States  
14          Navy. I served aboard the USS Briscoe  
15          (DD-977) destroyer in the late 1990s,  
16          early 2000, and I myself am a hundred  
17          percent service-connected veteran who  
18          utilizes the VA health system on a daily  
19          basis.

20                        I come from a long line of  
21          veterans - my father, grandfather, and  
22          great-grandfather, which I mere remember  
23          every time underneath my beret.

24                        I have spent many hours  
25          volunteering with claims for my fellow

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2           veterans, just as someone did for me.

3                   Working as your Director, I  
4           intend on collaborating all veterans'  
5           organizations that put veterans first. I  
6           want to continue to work side by side  
7           with Wanda Pate and Joyce Mckeown, who  
8           are here. They together have carried  
9           this office for the past two years  
10          diligently and productively.

11                   Sadly, earlier this month we  
12          lost a great director and a friend to the  
13          veterans of Philadelphia, Edgar Howard,  
14          and I would be remiss if I didn't ask for  
15          a moment of silence in his great memory.

16                   (Brief moment of silence.)

17                   MR. BROWN: I know that Edgar  
18          would expect a lot from our office, and  
19          we as a staff intend on doing just that.  
20          We will continue to have roundtables,  
21          fairs, and presentations for our  
22          veterans. The office will work to  
23          introduce numerous other activities and  
24          events throughout the year, holding to  
25          faith a filled agenda.

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2                   My promise is that I'm not  
3 perfect. I need the help of good  
4 veterans. Please make yourself and your  
5 organization known to me and to the  
6 office.

7                   The resolution today  
8 circumferences numerous veterans  
9 organizations in Philadelphia. Present  
10 today up here with me is Tim Meserve  
11 representing of the Philadelphia Veterans  
12 Multi-Service Center right here. Also  
13 another person who continues to help  
14 veterans throughout Philadelphia,  
15 Elizabeth Helsel, Associate Director of  
16 the VA Medical Center. She's back here  
17 somewhere with me. Numerous veterans  
18 organizations here, the Philadelphia Vets  
19 Center, the Veterans Support Group, Safe  
20 Haven, Impact Services, Support Homeless  
21 Vets, Vet Corps, Travis Manion  
22 Foundation, Thank a Vet, People First,  
23 the Perimeter, Sunrise House, Stand Down,  
24 USEF, Our Vets Success, Point Man  
25 Ministries. A couple directors and

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2           commanders here, Andre Mears, the  
3           Latin-American Post No. 840. Here we go.  
4           Here he is. Bill Coles, 5th District up  
5           here with me. John Peterson, the  
6           Commander of 405, the Union League. Dave  
7           Adams, a radio personality somewhere  
8           here. Okay. Al Willis, WP Roach Post  
9           No. 21 and recipient of the Congressional  
10          Gold Medal, World War II right here in  
11          our presence.

12                           (Appause.)

13                   MR. BROWN: My personal  
14           commander of Southwest Philly, Post 959,  
15           who reminded me that my dues were due,  
16           John Tomaski. He's up here. As he  
17           always does. Greater Philadelphia  
18           Veterans Networks and You Are Not Alone.

19                   What a group to end with. You  
20           veterans are not alone in Philadelphia.  
21           These groups here today are just a  
22           smidgeon of what is offered in  
23           Philadelphia. I truly believe that our  
24           office and these organizations mentioned  
25           and numerous more will better the City

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2           services to our veterans. Thank you to  
3           every veterans group here today.

4                    Can I get all the veterans here  
5           to stand? How about a round of applause  
6           for our fellow veterans.

7                    (Applause.)

8                    MR. BROWN: Fellow veterans,  
9           thank you for being so important to us,  
10          so good to our country, and for being in  
11          this Council Chamber today.

12                   I accept this resolution on  
13          behalf of all veterans organizations and  
14          all veterans throughout this great city  
15          of ours. I am truly moved that my  
16          introduction and this citation are within  
17          the same agenda this morning.

18                   I will assure you that while at  
19          the helm of this office, I will keep this  
20          resolution, the Year of the Veteran 2014,  
21          and you, the veterans of Philadelphia, my  
22          first priority. God, family, and the  
23          love for your country are what those who  
24          have served are taught. I hope to work  
25          as hard for veterans as all of the

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2           directors before me did.

3                   Thank you all for this  
4           resolution. That will remain always on  
5           display in Room 127, our office, as a  
6           reminder that veterans are always number  
7           one.

8                   Our first public hearing will  
9           be March 5th at 2:00 p.m. where I'll be  
10          present, and it will be here in Council  
11          Chambers. Again, March 5th at 2 o'clock.

12                   Thank you very much.

13                   (Appause.)

14                   COUNCILMAN OH: Would you  
15          say -- I'm sorry, Council President. I  
16          know this is going a little long. Can I  
17          break protocol and request two more --

18                   COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: We  
19          can stay here all day, sir.

20                   COUNCILMAN OH: Thank you very  
21          much, Council President.

22                   I would like to ask Tim Meserve  
23          from the Veterans Multi-Service Center  
24          and Betsy Helsel from the VA,  
25          Philadelphia Veterans Administration, to

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2           make some brief comments.

3                   MR. MESERVE. Tim Meserve, and  
4           I'm a veteran. I want to thank  
5           Councilman Oh, Councilman Squilla, and  
6           Councilwoman Blackwell for sponsoring,  
7           along with their staffs, for this great  
8           tool for veterans. I also want to thank  
9           the Council President for your leadership  
10          and Councilman Johnson, but in today's  
11          world in Washington can't get along, the  
12          entire Council, I want to thank you for  
13          unanimously supporting this and showing  
14          that Philadelphia leads the way in all  
15          things.

16                   (Applause.)

17                   MR. MESERVE: We want to thank  
18          a couple people real quickly. I want to  
19          thank Kayla Williams from the One Book  
20          Philadelphia. There's a great event. If  
21          you haven't read Yellow Birds, they have  
22          over a hundred plus events that are going  
23          through 19 March.

24                   Fern Villit (ph) from the VA  
25          and Debby Derricks from my organization

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2           who helped in this process.

3                   I wanted to say that the  
4           Wheelchair Games -- and there's so many  
5           things that are going on in Philadelphia,  
6           but I just got to speak this morning  
7           about the coalition to end veterans  
8           homelessness. I want to talk about the  
9           amazing things that the organization of  
10          the City is doing. There's six  
11          charities, three City organizations and  
12          HUD and the VA as well as the state  
13          Veterans Commission involved. When VA  
14          and PHA got together, they took a process  
15          for HUD-VASH vouchers that used to be  
16          more than 140 days. They've done it  
17          multiple times, put a veteran from start  
18          to finish in a brand new apartment in  
19          three to five days. They are doing  
20          amazing things.

21                           (Appause.)

22                   MR. MESERVE: Real quick. Our  
23          chronic homeless numbers for veterans  
24          went up 400 percent since the beginning  
25          of the boot camp in this process and we

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2           have housed double the number of veterans  
3           every month, from 30 to 60 homeless  
4           veterans every month. We will end  
5           homeless veterans and it will be because  
6           of everyone in this room.

7                        I just want to say to all the  
8           VSOs out there that Council has given us  
9           this great tool. Every one of us needs  
10          to use this, because in our  
11          organizations, it is the Year of the  
12          Veteran every year, but now it's the Year  
13          of Veteran in Philadelphia. We do have a  
14          kick-off event on 10 March, and there'll  
15          be lots of events from all these  
16          different organizations celebrating the  
17          Year of the Veteran.

18                        Thank you.

19                        (Applause.)

20                        MS. HELSEL: Good morning. I  
21          just have two minutes of brief comments.  
22          I just want to tell you how thrilled and  
23          delighted I am to be here to represent  
24          Philadelphia VA at this presentation, and  
25          we at the VA feel so fortunate to be

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2           located in a city that has chosen to  
3           elevate the visibility of veterans in  
4           such an important way. So thank you for  
5           all of that.

6                       We feel we already do have a  
7           strong relationship with the City, but we  
8           think this proclamation will really go a  
9           long way to cement that partnership and  
10          also to add additional visibility and  
11          support to the Wheelchair Games that  
12          you've already heard about, which are  
13          coming to the City in August 12th to the  
14          18th. Not only is that bringing 650  
15          veterans and thousands of visitors and  
16          volunteers, but lots of economic positive  
17          impact to our city. So thank you.

18                      So on behalf of the VA, I just  
19          want to extend my deepest gratitude to  
20          all of you and invite you to join us in  
21          celebrating veterans and veteran causes,  
22          not just this year but each and every  
23          day.

24                               Thank you.

25                               (Appause.)

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2                   COUNCILMAN OH: Thank you very  
3 much. We're going to take a photograph  
4 right now. Because we have so many  
5 people up here, I believe the  
6 Councilmembers will come up front, but I  
7 see veteran leaders still in the audience  
8 and spouses of veterans and others.  
9 Would you just come up here and take this  
10 picture with us. We have room. You know  
11 who you are. Please don't be shy. Come  
12 on up. You're veteran leaders. Come on  
13 up here and take this picture with us.

14                   Thank you.

15                   COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

16 Thank you.

17                   Council will be at ease.

18                   (Council at ease.)

19                   COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

20 Thank you very much. Thank you very much  
21 for your service, to all our veterans.

22                   At this time, the Chair  
23 recognizes Councilman Curtis Jones, who  
24 will present a resolution honoring and  
25 celebrating Philadelphia's living

2           legends. Would honorees and those  
3           accompanying the Councilman please join  
4           him at the podium.

5                         (Applause.)

6                         COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Can  
7           we hold off on the cameras until we do  
8           the presentation. Thank you. Thank you.

9                         Councilman Jones.

10                        Folks, could we have a little  
11           quiet, please. Thank you.

12                        COUNCILMAN JONES: On the  
13           occasion of Black History Month, we  
14           reflect on those who came before us who  
15           wrote pages and chapters in the history  
16           of America and in particular African  
17           American culture.

18                        In 1926, Dr. Carter G. Woodson  
19           started Negro History Week, and in 1975,  
20           it was recognized by President Gerald  
21           Ford. It became a month in 1986 when  
22           Congress passed it into law. But here in  
23           Philadelphia, we've lost a lot of those  
24           living legends last year. When we think  
25           about the Honorable Gussie Clark, when we

2           think about Lana Felton-Ghee who passed  
3           away, names like Congressman Bill Gray,  
4           E. Steven Collins, and Dr. Lomax, to name  
5           a few.

6                        So what we've tried to do each  
7           year since 2008 is recognize the living  
8           legends in our community who are  
9           continuing to write those pages, to  
10          create those chapters in Philadelphia  
11          African American culture and history and  
12          to, in a small way, the body of Council  
13          say thank you.

14                      So with that, names like former  
15          Mayor John Street, former President of  
16          City Council; names like Ethel Barnett;  
17          names like Commissioner Sylvester  
18          Johnson; labor leaders like Sam Staten,  
19          Jr., a legacy, a second generation in  
20          labor; names like Jerry Wyatt Mondesire,  
21          to name a few; Joyce Batchelor, an  
22          advocate for children for over 25 years.  
23          And with that, we want to let them know  
24          that we recognize their contributions,  
25          that we care deeply about what they do

2           and what they have done for all of us.

3                   And without further adieu, as  
4           part of commemoration of Black History  
5           Month, today we honor and celebrate  
6           Philadelphia's living legends: John  
7           Street, Ethel Barnett, Sylvester Johnson,  
8           Joyce Batchelor, Sam Staten, Jr., Doris  
9           Smith, Jerry Mondesire, Trudy Haynes, and  
10          Della Clark. The panel before you  
11          demonstrates exemplary leadership in the  
12          areas of government, public safety,  
13          social justice, civil rights, labor  
14          relations, journalism, community  
15          activism, and business leadership; and

16                   COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Whereas,  
17          John F. Street, Esquire, Philadelphia's  
18          second African American mayor, led the  
19          City from 2000 to 2008 after nearly two  
20          decades of public service on Philadelphia  
21          City Council. Mayor Street was elected  
22          as Council President for seven years  
23          during his tenure on City Council. As  
24          mayor, Street worked to revitalize  
25          Philadelphia, improve graduation rates,

2           and increase the quality of life for the  
3           City of Philadelphia for all citizens.  
4           Still a public servant today, former  
5           Mayor Street currently teaches political  
6           science at Temple University and  
7           advocates for women and youth in  
8           politics; and

9                        COUNCILWOMAN BROWN: Whereas,  
10           this elegant Ethel S. Barnett is a  
11           longstanding public servant who served as  
12           a Philadelphia police officer from 1961  
13           to 1971 and became the first African  
14           American to serve on the Pennsylvania  
15           Civil Service Commission in 1977.  
16           Barnett served on a multitude of  
17           government boards, including the  
18           Philadelphia Energy Education Council,  
19           the Mayor's Commission for Women in

3                   class. Some interesting statistics as we  
4                   enter our budget negotiations is that the  
5                   middle class has declined from 59 percent  
6                   of our population in 1970 to 42 percent

8                   class" Philadelphians spiked, went up,  
9                   from 30 percent of the population to 47  
10                  percent of the population. We're not  
11                  talking about the poor or, as they call  
12                  it, super poor. We're talking about  
13                  lower-middle class, middle class  
14                  shrinkage.

15                  Pew defines the middle class in  
16                  their audit of households as \$41,258  
17                  annually to 123,000. Now, in my  
18                  neighborhood that's a little large, but  
19                  we'll take them at their statistical  
20                  word.

21                  But it has become apparent also  
22                  that the cost of living in that shrinking  
23                  has not gone down. Everything from  
24                  utilities, food, housing, shelter, all of  
25                  those things have gone up.

3 people in this Chamber. First of all,  
4 you, Mr. President, for your work in  
5 preserving that middle class, in making  
6 sure that municipal workers received

10 that also into 33.

11                  I want to recognize Councilman  
12 Henon for his work in trying to preserve  
13 the middle class manufacturing jobs that  
14 are here in the City of Philadelphia and  
15 recognize him for trying to preserve that  
16 middle class.

17                  I want to recognize Councilman  
18 Oh for his work in recognizing  
19 Philadelphia as an international economic  
20 opportunity to the rest of the world,  
21 attracting businesses, reinforcing that  
22 middle class.

23                  I want to make sure that that  
24 is known, that we are fighting every day  
25 in our different areas of expertise to

3           encourage and continue to encourage our  
4           Philadelphia delegation both in  
5           Harrisburg and in DC, Congressman Brady,

9           don't know if after 11 weeks what any of  
10          us would do without a means of income in  
11          the City of Philadelphia. Many of us  
12          live paycheck to paycheck, and as

16                   We have to preserve this middle  
17          class. We have to fight for it in

10          about education. There is not a  
11          conversation that I share with one of my  
12          co-sponsors, Councilwoman Blondell  
13          Reynolds Brown, where we don't express  
14          our concern for what we are going to do  
15          about the School District and funding,  
16          not only this year but as we move  
17          forward. We have that conversation not  
18          just as Councilpeople but as mothers  
19          concerned about the future of our  
20          children and our grandchildren and the  
21          children of our constituents.

22                   Many folks in this Chamber may  
23          not know that Councilman Jones has  
24          provided direct leadership around school  
25          funding and education options

3           to take this opportunity to congratulate  
4           him, as I have constituents in my  
5           district who travel to SLA Beeber in his  
6           district because that is a  
7           high-performing school with

10                   But I do this introduction  
11           because I believe there's great promise.  
12           There's great promise because after all  
13           the chaos around school funding, we have  
14           certain things that have been missing in  
15           the past and in the debate. We have  
16           leadership. Dr. Hite has provided strong  
17           leadership and a renewed faith in all of  
18           us that we can lead to a better situation  
19           at the District, the SRC's leadership  
20           and, of course, our Council colleague  
21           Councilman Green taking on this enormous  
22           task. We have a plan, and Dr. Hite's  
23           plan 2.0 which sets a pathway to what  
24           could be good educational opportunities  
25           for all children. And we have a

2                   financial plan, which outlays the \$320  
3                   million that Dr. Hite says can help us  
4                   lead to a good path, not the best path  
5                   but one that he feels strongly that he

7                   Yesterday, in part thanks to

9                   and Council and the Administration, we  
10                  saw some positive great promise in the  
11                  sale of the buildings, four buildings,  
12                  that are going to sell for about \$37  
13                  million and net the District 30 million.  
14                  While it falls short of our goal for June  
15                  30th of 77 million, it is also great  
16                  promise.

17                  The last two years this Council  
18                  has worked very hard to multi-task and  
19                  tackle many issues - zoning reform, AVI,  
20                  providing relief for homeowners, and  
21                  every single time through your  
22                  leadership, Council President, we have  
23                  been up to the task.

24                  Let me first start by saying  
25                  that nothing, nothing can replace the

3                   needed and that must be done at the state  
4                   level. Nothing that we do can replace  
5                   that.

6                   Nothing can replace the money  
7                   that -- the federal money that we've lost

10                  million is only a conversation starter,  
11                  we need to engage in a real strong public  
12                  debate around long-term, consistent,  
13                  predictable funding for the School  
14                  District.

15                  I am pleased of this Council,  
16                  my Council colleagues and this Council,  
17                  for the constant leadership that we have  
18                  provided in the last three years as it  
19                  relates to this issue. I do not doubt  
20                  for a minute that everyone in this  
21                  Council is extremely committed to the  
22                  children and to the future of  
23                  Philadelphia and that we understand that  
24                  school funding is a top priority.

9           schools. My colleague just mentioned  
10          four schools. Well, as you know, I have  
11          University City High School, and that  
12          includes Charles Drew School and Walnut  
13          Center, in addition to Wilson School next  
14          to the University of Sciences on the same  
15          block and Shaw School at 54th and  
16          Warrington, which is the Hardy Williams  
17          School. And there is print in the paper,  
18          but I'd like to mention we all love WURD,  
19          my favorite radio show, but certainly I  
20          had some issues today with a moderator.  
21          I don't really know him, but a new  
22          moderator who called me a liar today and  
23          who said that I made a deal and that the  
24          schools were being sold for a pittance.  
25          This is what happens when people don't do

2                   their homework. That the schools were  
3                   being sold for a pittance because I made  
4                   a deal to get a community room in the  
5                   Youth Study Center or the Juvenile  
6                   Justice Center at 48th and Haverford in

9                   community center in the building and  
10                  selling schools, totally different  
11                  entities. We don't control the School  
12                  District land or the buildings. You  
13                  don't mix that funding. And if I have  
14                  that kind of power and authority, the  
15                  schools wouldn't have closed in the first  
16                  place.

17                         Having said that, they said I  
18                         knew about it. And we all know we heard  
19                         about it yesterday. Like people tell us  
20                         things like they're doing us a favor the  
21                         day before. And we heard about these  
22                         sales certainly the day before I did as  
23                         well. And so I suggest that if this  
24                         gentleman would check his records, he  
25                         would see that when the Juvenile Justice

Center was built, it was in the papers,  
they accused me of holding it up for  
three years and they had my picture on  
the front of the Daily News calling me  
Jannie Blocker. Now it was funny, but  
it's not funny when it's you. They call  
me Jannie Blocker, not Jannie Blackwell.  
And we went through -- it's working out  
fine. We love the leadership there.  
It's working out fine, but my point is  
and I told them, you know, I know that I  
represent the community, some of you  
think, on certain issues to a fault, but  
Lucien Blackwell taught me a long time  
ago that you have to honor the people who  
elect you. And so sometimes maybe it is  
considered that I do it to a fault, but I  
try to stay true to what I think I should  
do. Pray first to God and then try to do  
what the people who elect me want me to  
do.

So I suggest to this gentleman  
a community center -- my goodness, we got  
a community room in that center. Sure, I

3                   selling a school, three schools right in  
4                   that area and all that it entails?

5                   I would suggest that when  
6                   someone goes on the radio, any moderator,

9                   should at least be honest about what  
10                  you're saying.

11                  I have no reason to call a  
12                  station and lie and make up things about  
13                  the sale of schools in my area. I wish  
14                  we weren't here in the first place. We  
15                  all wish we had more money. I wish I  
16                  controlled that as well. I mean, the  
17                  gentleman said that I know everything  
18                  that's going on in my district. I have  
19                  power, but I'm not quite that powerful.

20                  So, again, we ask that -- we  
21                  challenge them to come back, do the right  
22                  thing, say the right thing, and I  
23                  challenge you to be honest, because I  
24                  know I am.

25                  Thank you, Mr. President.

2                   My remarks speak to an  
3                   opportunity to salute a man who touched  
4                   my life very, very early in my career,  
5                   has made a huge impact on a dozen of  
6                   others, and an even bigger mark on the  
7                   City of Philadelphia. On Monday,  
8                   February 24th, Mr. Willie F. Johnson,  
9                   President of PRWT Services, Inc., was  
10                  honored in Washington, DC by our United  
11                  States Senator Bob Casey. I count myself  
12                  both lucky and fortunate to have been  
13                  among the legions of guests and friends  
14                  from Florida, South Carolina, his home  
15                  state, and Philly made us proud, we were  
16                  there in huge numbers, who were there to  
17                  cheer him on, show him our love, and  
18                  offer our heartfelt admiration.

19                  I got to know Mr. Johnson, my  
20                  former boss, when he was the Executive  
21                  Director of the Youth Services  
22                  Coordinating Office under the Rizzo  
23                  Administration, and I learned a lot about  
24                  work ethic and what that looks like.  
25                  Never, ever did he have his nameplate on

2                   his desk. When you walked into his  
3                   office, what you saw on his nameplate  
4                   were two words: Be Thorough.

5                   At the tribute Donna Allie,  
6                   President and CEO of Team Clean, offered  
7                   the following quote. She was one of four  
8                   panelists who were a part of a symposium  
9                   that followed the salute to Mr. Johnson  
10                  on the Senate floor, and here's what she  
11                  had to say: Quote, "If you want to sleep  
12                  well at night, you have to genuinely be  
13                  more interested in people than profit,"  
14                  end quote.

15                  This quote is a testament to  
16                  Willie Johnson's inspiring story. He's  
17                  the Founder and Chairman of PRWT  
18                  Services, Inc., one of the largest  
19                  minority-owned businesses in the United  
20                  States located right here in  
21                  Philadelphia. He started his career as a  
22                  social worker, which has strongly  
23                  influenced his approach to the way he  
24                  approaches the business world.

25                  Before beginning his career as

3           Regional Commissioner for the Office of

9           Then Mr. Johnson took the leap and in  
10          1983 established Fidelity Systems, Inc.,  
11          a cable line construction company. From  
12          there he went on to found another  
13          company, PRWT, Services, Inc. in 1988.  
14          Today, PRWT now employs over 1,500 people  
15          nationwide. A central tenet of PRWT is  
16          to be a world-class entrepreneurial  
17          diversified company while also being an  
18          excellent corporate citizen.

19                   Under his leadership, PRWT was  
20          named Industrial Service Company of the  
21          Year in the 2009 issue of Black  
22          Enterprise and was saluted at the Black  
23          Enterprise Entrepreneur's Conference for  
24          being one of the top 100 black enterprise  
25          companies, and has been in that place for

2                   at least nine years.

3                   He was also recognized as  
4                   Entrepreneur of the Year by the  
5                   Philadelphia region of Ernst and Young in  
6                   June 2000. His commitment to community,  
7                   to the arts and culture organizations --  
8                   he's supported Philadanco, African  
9                   American Museum, Urban League of  
10                  Philadelphia, and the list goes on and on  
11                  and on.

12                  So I'm delighted to be able to  
13                  salute him on this last day of us  
14                  convening during African American History  
15                  Month and salute Mr. Willie F. Johnson  
16                  for being truly an inspirational human  
17                  being, a giant of a citizen, an enormous  
18                  wonderful role model for those of us who  
19                  have the spine to become entrepreneurs,  
20                  because in every way he represents and is  
21                  a reflection and symbol for the next  
22                  generation of leaders.

23                  So it's a wonderful pleasure,  
24                  Mr. President, to salute Mr. Willie F.  
25                  Johnson while he's still able to smell
