COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good morning, everyone. We're going to get started. We're running real late, and it's partially my fault.

I'd ask for your cooperation. Can you lower your voices, please.

To give our invocation this morning, the Chair recognizes Pastor Brian H. Grant of Germantown Christian Assembly. He is here today as the guest of Councilman Derek Green.

18 home electrified.

19 After about three months, the
20 meter reader came to read the meter, and
21 he really was surprised there was hardly
22 any usage of the electricity. So he said
23 to her, Is everything okay? I notice you
24 have hardly used your electricity.

25 She said, Everything is working

3 just long enough to light the candles.

4 The power was there, but it was
5 having no impact on her life. And I just
6 want to say to you this morning that the
7 power is available. The power of God is
8 available, available to help you deal

10 deal with, available to help you with the
11 personal challenges you face in your own
12 life.

13 So let's just bow right now and
14 ask God's blessing.

15 Father, we thank you that we
16 can approach a God who is able to do
17 exceedingly, abundantly above all that we
18 can ask or imagine.

19 We thank you that despite your
20 awesomeness, that not even one sparrow
21 falls to the ground by chance.

22 We thank you, God, that you
23 have such an interest in us, that you
24 desire despite the fact that you feel the
25 universe that you desire to have a

2 personal relationship with us through
3 faith.

4 Today, we ask your blessing on
5 the members of this Council. Guide them
6 in their deliberations and bless their
7 efforts as they work for the unity,
8 peace, and prosperity of this city.

9 We ask a special grace for
10 anyone here who might be passing through
11 personal challenges. May they find
12 strength, wisdom, and comfort as they put
13 their faith in you.

14 Lord, you have certainly
15 brought us a mighty long way, but, dear
16 Lord, we pray that you may keep us in
17 your path, lest our feet stray from the
18 places where we met thee, lest our hearts
19 drunk with the wine of the world we
20 forget thee. And so shattered beneath
21 thy hand may we forever stand true to our
22 God, true to our native land.

23 We ask this in the name of our
24 Lord and savior, Jesus Christ.

15 present a resolution congratulating Roman
16 Catholic High School Basketball Team.
17 Would Chris McNesby and those
18 accompanying him please join the
19 Councilman at the podium.

20 (Councilmembers and guests
21 approached podium.)

22 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: And
23 joining Councilman Squilla, we have
24 Councilman Greenlee, Councilman Johnson.

25 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Good

3 being here. I just want to say in a year
4 where we are celebrating some great
5 champions, that as we had earlier here
6 Villanova winning the national
7 championship, we also have some great,
8 great schools here in the City of
9 Philadelphia that really exceeded and are
10 showing how great Philadelphia sports is.
11 We have some great schools, and
12 fortunately enough they're in my district
13 to be able to win the state championship
14 this year. And last year we had four.
15 This year we have three. And it's an
16 amazing feat to go out there. And I
17 challenge you District Councilmembers to
18 get some of your schools to compete with
19 some of my schools to make sure we can
20 see that happen.

21 But anyway, this is a great
22 honor, and being able to come here today
23 to be able to, with my colleagues, be
24 able to honor these young, great athletes
25 and students that are going to move on to

3 Philadelphia proudly. We're just going

5 And today we're honoring and
6 congratulating Roman Catholic High School
7 Basketball Team, the Cahillites on

9 League Championship, The PIAA AAAA State
10 Championship and The District 12 City
11 Title for the AAAA Classification.

12 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Whereas,
13 the Cahillites, led by Head Coach Chris
14 McNesby, graduate of 1995 class, finished
15 with a record of 27 and 4;

16 Whereas, the Varsity Basketball
17 Program at Roman Catholic High School
18 finished the season ranked No. 19 overall
19 by USA Today and ranked 12 in the country
20 by MaxPreps; and

21 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: Whereas,
22 the Cahillites defeated Taylor Allerdice
23 School out of Pittsburgh to win the State
24 Championship by a score of 73 to 62 on
25 March 19th, 2016; and

2 Whereas, based on their past
3 performance, it is safe to assume that
4 the Cahillites from Roman Catholic High
5 School will only get better with time;
6 therefore, be it

7 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Resolved,
8 by the Council of the City of
9 Philadelphia, that we hereby congratulate
10 Roman Catholic High School Boys
11 Basketball Team on winning the 2016 PIAA
12 State AAAA Championship and The District
13 12 City Title for the AAAA
14 Classification.

15 Further resolved, that this
16 engrossed copy of this resolution be
17 presented to Roman Catholic High School
18 Basketball Team as evidence of the
19 sincere sentiments of this legislative
20 body.

21 Congratulations.

22 (Applause.)

23 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
24 Chair recognizes Dan Hoban for remarks.

25 MR. HOBAN: Ladies and

2 gentlemen and the esteemed members of the
3 Philadelphia City Council, my name is Dan
4 Hoban, Roman Catholic class of 1992 and,
5 once again, honored as the voice of Roman
6 Catholic Basketball to thank you for
7 allowing us to join you today.

8 I would like to present to you
9 the back-to-back Philadelphia Catholic
10 League PIAA District 12 and now the
11 two-time PIAA AAAA State Champions, Roman
12 Catholic High School Basketball.

13 I would also like to
14 congratulate the Saints of
15 Neumann-Goretti boys and girls basketball
16 teams who are with us today and Coach
17 Carl Arrigale and Coach Andrea Peterson
18 for their AAA State Championships as
19 well.

20 Led by USA Today State Coach of
21 the Year Chris McNesby, the Cahillites
22 defended their titles with a 27 and 4
23 overall record, including a 17-game
24 winning streak to end the season. Along
25 the road, the Cahillites defended their

2 crown at the Gonzaga DC Classic in
3 December in a thrilling overtime victory
4 over the host.

5 After a few bumps in the road
6 during the Catholic League season, Roman
7 avenged earlier losses by beating
8 Archbishop Carroll in the semi-finals and
9 Neumann-Goretti by the score of 72-65 in
10 front of a more than sell-out Palestra
11 crowd. In fact, the attendance topped
12 all but eight of the NCAA's conference
13 championship games.

14 After defending their City
15 title, Roman once again ran through the
16 state tournament, averaging double-digit
17 wins against highly regarded opponents
18 like Parkland and Plymouth Whitemarsh.
19 The culmination occurred in Hershey where
20 the Cahillites fought off a 10 to nothing
21 deficit to defeat previously state-ranked
22 No. 1 Taylor Allerdice out of Pittsburgh
23 73-62 for a second state title.

24 The team consisted of freshmen
25 Mikeal Jones and Seth Lundy, juniors

2 D'andre Vilmar, Dakquan Davis, JP
3 Sanders, and Colin Flach, along with
4 seniors Khalil Vincent going to Valley
5 Forge, Anthony Dawson headed to Penn
6 State Abington, Mark Tobin headed to
7 LaSalle University, also a First Team
8 All-State soccer goalie, Paul Newman
9 headed to Brown University, and the Penn
10 State trio of Tony Carr, Lamar Stevens,
11 and Nazeer Bostick, along with our
12 managers Jake Hall, Jesse Murphy, and
13 Kieran Flaherty.

14 Carr and Stevens were
15 recognized as First Team All-Catholic and
16 First Team All-City. They were also
17 joined by Nazeer Bostick as a Second Team
18 All-Catholic, and all three were honored
19 as First Time All-State by the Associated
20 Press.

21 Tony Carr was named Player of
22 the Year by the Philadelphia Inquirer,
23 the Associated Press, and Mr. Basketball
24 by USA Today, along with scoring a total
25 of 1,065 points.

2 Lamar Stevens was recognized as
3 the Player of the Year by the
4 Philadelphia Daily News and ended his
5 high school career with 1,348 points. He
6 was also the MVP of the Gonzaga DC
7 Classic, joining on the All-Tournament
8 Team by Tony Carr and Nazeer Bostick and
9 also All-Tournament at the Chick-Fil-A
10 Classic in South Carolina.

11 On behalf of everyone at Roman
12 Catholic, we thank you for allowing us to
13 join you today, and thank you for
14 honoring our two-time state champions
15 Roman Catholic High School.

16 Thank you.

17 (Applause.)

18 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

19 Council will be at ease.

20 (Council at ease.)

21 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

22 Thank you very much.

23 At this time, the Chair
24 recognizes Councilman Johnson.

25 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Thank you,

3 moment to acknowledge a group of young
4 people from one of the most outstanding
5 public schools here in the City of
6 Philadelphia. That public school is E.M.

10 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Thank you,
11 Council President.

12 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
13 Thank you.

14 And thank you for coming down
15 to see us today in action. Really
16 appreciate the great work you all do.

17 Thank you. At this time, one
18 more time, the Chair recognizes
19 Councilman Squilla, who will present a
20 resolution honoring Saints John Neumann
21 and Maria Goretti High School Girls
22 Varsity Basketball Team. Would Coach
23 Andrea Peterson and those accompanying
24 her please join the Councilman at the
25 podium.

4 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Thank you.

5 And again honoring another school with a
6 state championship. And knowing how hard
7 this is, I mean, Philadelphia has only
8 been in the state playoffs for the local
9 teams for seven years, I think, and
10 looking at the number of champions that
11 we have had has been unbelievable, and
12 it's a great credit to the schools and
13 the programs that give these children an
14 opportunity to play.

15 (Applause.)

16 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: So thank
17 you.

18 And Councilman Greenlee and
19 myself were actually at the games at the
20 girls and the boys championship games
21 down at the Palestra, and it was a great
22 event. It felt like old time, big five
23 basketball at its best.

24 Today we're honoring the Saint
25 John Neumann and Maria Goretti High

2 School Girls Varsity Basketball Team for
3 winning the PIAA District 12 AA City
4 Championship and the PIAA AA State
5 Championship game while finishing the
6 season 29 and 1 and with a national
7 ranking No. 7 by ESPN.

8 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Whereas,
9 on Saturday, February 27th of 2016, the
10 Saints took down the Panthers of Imhotep
11 Charter School 48 to 36 to win their
12 third straight PIAA District 12 AA City
13 Championship and earning a top seed in
14 the State Tournament; and

15 Whereas, the Saints continued
16 on in the Pennsylvania State Tournament,
17 defeating the Squires of Delone Catholic
18 49 to 24, the Minersville Battling Miners
19 71 to 33, the Holy Redeemer Royals of
20 Wilkes-Barre 48 to 39 and the Dunmore
21 Bucks 52 to 26 to reach the Championship
22 Game against the North Star Cougars of
23 Boswell; and

24 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: Whereas,
25 the Saints put on a dominant performance

2 in their state championship game against
3 North Star Cougars of Boswell, with a
4 commanding victory of 65 to 28 to become
5 the AA Pennsylvania State Champions. The
6 Lady Saints finished their season with a
7 record of 29 and 1; and

8 Whereas, special accolades
9 should be given to five Neumann-Goretti
10 players named as All-Catholic selections:
11 MVP, Alisha Kebbe; First Team, Kamiah
12 Smalls, Chyna Nixon and Jada Russell; and
13 Second Team, Morgan Lenahan. Additional
14 special accolades should be given to
15 Alisha Kebbe, who was selected as the
16 Player of the Year for the Southeast
17 Region by Philly.com; and

18 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Whereas,
19 the Lady Saints were led this season by
20 second year Head Coach Andrea Peterson.
21 Last season, Coach Peterson was named the
22 top High School Girls' Basketball Coach
23 in the United States of America, winning
24 the Naismith National Coach of the Year
25 Award, and being Named National Coach of

2 the Year by USA Today. Coach Peterson
3 has also been named Coach of the Year for
4 Pennsylvania (Class AA) by the
5 Pennsylvania Sports Writers Association.
6 As a player, Coach Peterson was a star
7 athlete at Drexel University and Saint
8 John's University. While at Drexel,
9 Coach Peterson earned a Colonial Athletic
10 Conference Student Athlete of the Year
11 Award, CAA All-Academic Team Honors and
12 led Drexel to their first ever appearance
13 in the NCAA Tournament. As a high school
14 player in the Philadelphia Catholic
15 League, Coach Peterson was the starting
16 point guard on back-to-back Philadelphia
17 Catholic League Championship teams at
18 Archbishop Carroll High School, where she
19 was a two-time All-Catholic League First
20 Team selection, a two-time All-Daily News
21 First Team selection, a Nike Tournament
22 of Champions First Team selection and a
23 Street & Smith's All-American Honorable
24 Mention selection; and

25 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Whereas,

2 that's an amazing accomplishment. Let's
3 give a big round of applause for Coach
4 Peterson.

5 (Applause.)

6 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Whereas,
7 the Saints bid farewell to their seniors
8 Alisha Kebbe, Kamiah Smalls, Jada
9 Russell, Morgan Lenahan, and Erica Brown
10 and have a wonderfully promised future
11 with returning players Chyna Nixon,
12 Jabria Ingram, Minika Glenn, Dajiah
13 Parmley, Angel Ricks and Kiara Kroger.

14 Sorry about if I messed up your
15 name. They do it with mine all the time.

16 So now, therefore, be it
17 resolved, by the City Council of
18 Philadelphia, that Council does hereby
19 honor and commend the Neumann-Goretti
20 High School Girls Varsity Basketball Team
21 for winning the PIAA District 12 AA City
22 Championship, the PIAA AA State
23 Championship while finishing 88 and 2 in
24 three seasons of basketball.

25 Further resolved, that this

3 presented to the Head Coach Andrea
4 Peterson, Assistant Coach Kat Scanlan,

11 (Applause.)

12 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Please
13 recognize Coach Peterson for a few
14 remarks.

15 COACH PETERSON: Thank you,
16 Council. We appreciate it. I just want
17 to say we appreciate this honor for being
18 here today and just say a few things
19 about our young women.

20 We have four kids. In the last
21 three years, we've graduated ten Division
22 I athletes. This year, Kamiah Smalls.

23 (Applause.)

24 COACH PETERSON: Kamiah Smalls
25 right over here, attending James Madison

3 (Applause.)

4 COACH PETERSON: Jada Russell

10 She's going off to Wagner University on a

11 full scholarship.

12 (Applause.)

13 COACH PETERSON: And also

14 Alisha Kebbe, who was the MVP, is heading

15 off to Syracuse University next year on a

16 full ride.

17 (Applause.)

18 COACH PETERSON: Just one last

19 thing. I always say I have a lot of

20 chances to speak, but without these young

21 women, the confidence I have and we have

22 at Neumann-Goretti wouldn't be done

23 without these kids standing behind me.

24 They put in the work. They just follow

25 my lead. You're only as strong as the

3 So thank you, guys, for an

12 Councilman Squilla on his annual showcase
13 of successful athletic teams will be
14 presenting a resolution congratulating --
15 we got Maria again. Okay. Man, you got
16 a basketball factory down there --
17 recognizing Saint John Neumann and Maria
18 Goretti 2015 and 2016 Boys Basketball
19 Team. Would Coach Carl Arrigale and
20 those accompanying him please join the
21 Councilman at the podium.

22 (Councilmembers and guests
23 approached podium.)

24 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: And
25 joining the Councilman, we have

10 proud of our alma mater and what they
11 have accomplished. And it's a great
12 honor to be here to just recognize this
13 team that has done so much over the past
14 seven years to really show -- even more
15 than that, but just to show the character
16 of the program there at Neumann-Goretti.

17 So today we'd like to
18 congratulate the Saint John Neumann and
19 Maria Goretti 2015-2016 Boys Basketball
20 Team on winning the PIAA Division AAA
21 State Championship.

22 COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: Whereas,
23 the Neumann-Goretti Boys Basketball Team
24 led by Coach Carl Arrigale had an
25 outstanding season finishing 27 and 4;

3 Whereas, the team comprised of
4 1st Team All Catholic selections Quade
5 Green, Zane Martin and Dhamie

9 Whereas, on March 18th, 2016
10 the Saints won the PIAA AAA State
11 Championship at the Giant Center in
12 Hershey by defeating MARS High School 99
13 to 66. In doing so the Saints set a
14 state championship record by scoring 99
15 points with an outstanding team effort
16 led by Zane Martin with 33 points, Quade
17 Green with 25 points, Rasheed Browne with
18 18 points, Vaughn Covington with 11
19 points while Dhamir Cosby-Roundtree had 9
20 points, 10 rebounds and 3 blocks; and

21 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Whereas,
22 seniors Zane Martin, Rasheed Browne,
23 Vaughn Covington, Amire Tyler leave the
24 Saints John Neumann and Maria Goretti
25 with 3 AAA State Championships, 3 AAA

2 City Titles, 2 Catholic League
3 Championships and a four-year record of
4 106 and 16. Wow.

5 Therefore, be it resolved, that

11 Further resolved, that this

4 my time out to notify you of all this
5 that's going on.

6 In this age when voters are
7 demanding accountability from our
8 government employees, as the Council, the
9 courts, the Mayor's Office, the City's
10 attorney's office, and the Philadelphia
11 Redevelopment Authority purposefully
12 excluded the voice of the people.

13 Twenty-two years, no hearing, no notice,
14 no jury trial, yet my home was stolen, to
15 pay a developer up to \$100 million to
16 build a mall on my stolen home in this
17 city that is so strapped for cash, the
18 Council is raising taxes on everything.

19 Was Herbert Wetzel at the RDA
20 while my home was being
21 unconstitutionally sequestered?
22 Reappointment signals Council's
23 acceptance of his job performance. This
24 is egregious behavior.

25 De-fund the Redevelopment

2 Authority and the Land Bank and order the
3 Attorney General to investigate and
4 prosecute violations, 42 USC 1982, 1983,
5 1985, 1986, among others, and investigate
6 the District Attorney's Office as to why

8 Ben Franklin, quote, Political
9 offices and baby diapers have to be
10 changed often and for the same reason.

11 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
12 Thank you.

13 CHIEF CLERK: Louise Hanible,
14 commenting on 160411.

15 (Witness approached podium.)

16 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good
17 afternoon.

18 MS. HANIBLE: Good afternoon,
19 President Council. The reason why I'm
20 here today, because I represent housing
21 tenants all over the City, in your
22 district and everybody else district,
23 come to me with complaints. I was called
24 early this morning because a lot of
25 tenants watch Council on TV and this was

3 I'm speaking really on Bill

10 Board. They are not reappointed by
11 Council or the Mayor. The tenants
12 reelect who we want on the Board.

13 So could you please explain
14 this to me, why they are being
15 reappointed and not elected by the
16 tenants? Can somebody explain that to
17 me?

18 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: I'm
19 not a member of the Board.

20 MS. HANIBLE: What you say?

21 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: I'm
22 not a member of the Board, so I can't
23 respond to that.

24 MS. HANIBLE: Well, somebody in
25 here knows something. How can they be

2 reappointed to a Board? Are y'all taking
3 our rights away from us? Because we have
4 the right to vote for the tenants that we
5 want on the Board, not to be appointed by
6 you, the President, or nobody of this

9 have the right to vote for who we want to
10 represent us? Not that I have a problem
11 with who is on the Board, but I want to
12 know is our rights being taken from us?
13 Somebody in here got to know.

14 Jannie, you once sitted on the
15 Board.

16 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL: Yeah,
17 but I don't now.

18 MS. HANIBLE: But I want to
19 know. I want to know do we still have
20 the right to vote for who we want to
21 represent us on the Housing Board?

22 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL: I
23 don't know. When I went to the Board
24 meeting last week, they elected two
25 people. I didn't know it was happening.

2 I thought it was --

3 MS. HANIBLE: How did they
4 elect two people? We ain't have no
5 election.

6 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL: I
7 don't know.

8 MS. HANIBLE: Could somebody

10 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
11 Ms. Hanible, what I would like to do if
12 you -- can you hang around?

13 MS. HANIBLE: Yes, I could.

14 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
15 We're going to be here for a little
16 while. There apparently was a document
17 that was submitted. I think this is a
18 temporary, but I don't want to speculate
19 on language, so I'll get you the language
20 associated with how that process happened
21 on this particular time. Because the
22 state law did call for elected Board
23 members. So I'll get you the
24 information.

25 MS. HANIBLE: I appreciate it,

3 ain't elected nobody. And we not going
4 to have these people just pushed down our
5 throats. Not that we saying we don't

25 speak on Bill 160429. I am happy to see

12 There's a passage in the Bible
13 that say I told you 99 times because 98
14 wasn't enough. So I'm going to say that
15 to you all, because you all act like you
16 don't understand any other view. I got
17 30 years of real estate behind me, so I
18 will stand up in front of anyone with the
19 facts. I always bring a document to make
20 sure you know what I'm talking about.

21 So eminent domain is being used
22 against the African American community,
23 taking away generation of wealth. It's
24 happening in Brewerytown, and there's an
25 excellent but unfortunate article that's

2 in PlanPhilly that tells about South
3 Philadelphia. The same situation when
4 Martin Luther King was imploded, the
5 Latimore family lost five properties and
6 others. This is how African Americans
7 are losing.

8 Don't you be fooled by the Pew
9 Foundation. They will never, ever report
10 what's happening to the African American
11 community using PHA to take away land,
12 some occupied properties, in the African
13 American community. It's only happening
14 to African Americans. I want to make
15 sure you all do not leave here today
16 thinking that you're doing something so
17 great. Every time you vote on one of
18 these bills, you're not asking any
19 questions. You're not looking for any
20 other alternative plan. You are taking
21 equity from the African American
22 community. It's not happening any other
23 way. I've studied it now from the
24 history and inception of PHA, which I'll
25 be telling that story on Saturday at

2 Cecil B. Moore branch library from 1:00
3 to 3:00 with documents to prove from Bill
4 150409 of last summer where 1,300 parcels
5 were taken out of the African American

9 African Americans. Shame, shame, shame
10 on it.

11 Is this giving me the yellow
12 light here? So I can still continue to
13 say check out PlanPhilly. Check out that
14 article, very detailed by Mr. Marin.

10 district public school. We were able to
11 gain a commitment to end a really
12 terrible practice around split grades,
13 merging grades of students together
14 because teachers couldn't be afforded.
15 We pushed out \$8 million to schools in
16 March so that they could start
17 after-school programs, buy some basic
18 books and supplies and start replenishing
19 classrooms.

20 We were, more than anybody
21 else, at the forefront of addressing
22 teacher vacancies and overcrowding in our
23 schools that's going to restructure and
24 refocus the District's attention back on
25 making sure that our children have the

2 types of classes that they need and that
3 there's a qualified teacher in front of
4 them every single day of the school year.

5 We do not want another year in
6 which thousands of children could end up
7 in either remedial programs or other
8 types of situations simply because they

11 We're still fighting for a lot
12 of things, including a quality contract
13 for all of the labor unions in the School
14 District of Philadelphia, but I think
15 that the message is is that when we
16 invest in citywide district investments
17 across the City and we guarantee them for
18 every child, every family, at every
19 school, we begin to re-promise all of
20 Philadelphians what it looks like to have
21 an invested public school system. This
22 isn't just about single school
23 turnarounds. It's also about broad-based
24 investments that can begin to regenerate
25 some confidence, and that goes out for

2 all of my Councilmembers.

3 I'm grateful to everybody, all
4 my colleagues, who spent many hours
5 trying to work on this issue, prioritize
6 things for the District from sometimes
7 skeptical and rabble-raising advocates

9 much advancement as we did, and I'm
10 grateful for everybody in this building
11 especially for making that change
12 possible.
