9                   COUNCILMAN O'NEILL: Thank you,  
10          Mr. President. On behalf of the  
11          republicans, there are no requests for

13                  COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The  
14          Chair thanks the gentleman.

15                  At this time, I would like to  
16          dispense with the regular order of  
17          business and I would like to thank  
18          everyone who has taken time out of their  
19          busy day to come down to witness their  
20          government in action. We truly hope you  
21          find today's session an enjoyable one and  
22          a knowledgeable one. We hope you enjoy  
23          it so much that you actually come back  
24          again. So, again, thank you for coming  
25          and being our guest today.

3           recognizes Councilman Taubenberger, who  
4           will present a resolution recognizing the  
5           Salvation Army Greater Philadelphia.  
6           Would Collette C. McBratney and those  
7           accompanying her please join the  
8           Councilman at the podium.

9                   (Councilmembers and guests  
10           approached podium.)

11                   COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: And  
12           joining the Councilman, we have  
13           Councilman Jones and Councilwoman Bass  
14           and Councilwoman Blackwell, Councilwoman  
15           Parker, and Councilwoman Gym.

16                   COUNCILMAN TAUBENBERGER: I am  
17           truly delighted to be able to  
18           congratulate a group that is so  
19           important, and as I spoke to several of  
20           the young ladies this morning, it's  
21           something they're going to appreciate now  
22           but very, very much so in the future.  
23           And to start off the resolution, I am  
24           asking Councilman Jones to step forward.

25                   COUNCILMAN JONES: So we all

2           fight over Reverend Bonnie. I happen to  
3           have probably the largest number of  
4           facilities in my district; is that right?

5                        REVEREND CAMARDA: Yes, you do.

6                        COUNCILMAN JONES: And all of  
7           them are managed to be a part of a  
8           community, not an aberration. Just  
9           lucky, I guess. But we welcome her as a  
10          part of our community, each and every one  
11          of them, whether it's 55th and Market,  
12          whether it's up in Overbrook or  
13          Wynnefield, the Kroc Center, or even in  
14          Roxborough, you have facilities. So  
15          she's always welcomed wherever she goes.  
16          As the young people say, she's good in  
17          every hood.

18                      COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: South  
19          Philly too.

20                      COUNCILMAN JONES: South Philly  
21          too.

22                      So whereas, the Be Your Best  
23          program grew out of the Salvation Army  
24          Greater Philadelphia's desire to provide  
25          meaningful, academically based after

2           school activities for young women in  
3           Philadelphia; and

4                   COUNCILWOMAN GYM: Whereas, the  
5           Be Your Best program teaches young women  
6           the social skills, manners and life  
7           lessons to develop themselves  
8           successfully and with emotional maturity;  
9           and

10                   COUNCILWOMAN BROWN: Whereas,  
11           the Be Your Best program places a special  
12           emphasis on educational goals, career  
13           planning and involvement in your  
14           community for these students; and

15                   Whereas, the Be Your Best  
16           program is for young ladies between the  
17           ages of 9 to 15 to gather for eleven  
18           weeks and helps build a foundation and  
19           network for these students; and

20                   COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Whereas,  
21           the Be Your Best program was founded in  
22           2011 and graduated over 82 graduates from  
23           nine classes; and

24                   COUNCILWOMAN PARKER: Whereas,  
25           the Be Your Best program was almost

2           eliminated due to a lack of funding until  
3           Collette McBratney personally dedicated  
4           herself to raising the money needed to  
5           sustain the program for the young women;  
6           and

7                           COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL:

8           Whereas, the Be Your Best program  
9           continues to critically impact the lives  
10          of their graduates and their families for  
11          Philadelphia due to efforts of the  
12          students, volunteer instructors, and the  
13          generous financial support from their  
14          donors; now, therefore, be it

15                          COUNCILMAN TAUBENBERGER: Be it  
16          resolved, the Council of the City of  
17          Philadelphia, hereby recognizes and  
18          honors the Salvation Army Greater  
19          Philadelphia "Be Your Best" program as an  
20          impactful and positive effort laying a  
21          foundation for academic achievement as  
22          well as career skills for the future of  
23          their graduates and their families.

24                          Collette, where are you, and  
25          Bonnie?

3           (Applause.)

4           COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The  
5 Chair --

6           MS. McBRATNEY: This is a wow  
7 for me, I'll tell you, just being in this  
8 great place. Thinking what this means  
9 and to be here is just a pure delight.

10           There are so many people that  
11 share this honor, but I want to say,  
12 first of all, to President Darrell  
13 Clarke, thank you so much. To each  
14 member of the City Council, thank you so  
15 much for what you mean and all that you  
16 do. I'm sure you take a lot of heat at  
17 times, but we do as the citizens of  
18 Philadelphia appreciate you. And then to  
19 two very special people, to Al  
20 Taubenberger, not only a friend but a  
21 public servant, thank you so much, Al.  
22 To Curtis Jones, who believed in what  
23 we're doing and would do this  
24 proclamation, you have my highest thanks.

25           Behind me, ladies and

9           understanding, but in all your ways

10          acknowledge him and he will direct your

11          paths. And indeed he has directed our

12          paths and done more than anybody could

13          imagine. So the girls always say we're,

14          what, girls? We're super stars, right?

15          Can you do it on three? One, two, three.

16                         (Superstars.)

17                 MS. McBRATNEY: Thank you so

18                 much.

19                         (Applause.)

20                 REVEREND CAMARDA: On behalf of

21                 the Salvation Army, I really want to

22                 thank you. You know, we love all of you

23                 Councilpeople. We love your staff. We

24                 are here to serve. And on behalf of this

25                 group on 55th and Market, we want to

13                         (Applause.)

14                         COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

15           Thank you.

16                         REVEREND CAMARDA: Mr. Billy  
17           comes every week and takes all the  
18           pictures and do whatever these ladies  
19           tell him to do.

20                         COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

21           Thank you.

22                         REVEREND CAMARDA: Mr. Billy,  
23           come up for the picture too.

24                         COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

25           Council will be at ease.

3           COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

4   Thank you.   Thank you.

5                   At this time, the Chair  
6   recognizes Councilman Green, who will  
7   present a resolution recognizing June  
8   2016 as Disability Pride Month.   Would  
9   Charles Horton and those accompanying him  
10  please join the Councilman at the podium.

11                   (Councilmembers and guest  
12  approached podium.)

13           COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARK:   And  
14  joining Councilman Green, we have  
15  Councilwoman Gym, Councilman  
16  Taubenberger, Councilman Squilla, and  
17  Councilwoman Bass.

18                   (Applause.)

19           COUNCILMAN GREEN:   Good  
20  morning.   It's a pleasure to be here this  
21  morning as we are continuing our  
22  Disability Pride Week.   We had a great  
23  flag-raising on Monday, myself and  
24  Councilman Taubenberger and other members  
25  of Council.   I know Councilwoman Gym and

2           Councilman Squilla and Councilman Domb  
3           were at that flag-raising. So it gives  
4           us great pride to present this resolution  
5           this morning.

6                       Whereas, a disability is a  
7           physical or mental impairment that  
8           substantially limits one or more major  
9           life activities, a person who has a  
10          history or record of such an impairment,  
11          or a person who is perceived by others as  
12          having such an impairment, a condition  
13          experienced by approximately 56.7 million  
14          Americans, or 19 percent of the  
15          population, according to the most recent  
16          U.S. Census Bureau statistics; and

17                       COUNCILMAN TAUBENBERGER:

18          Whereas, conditions such as senility or  
19          neurocognitive impairment, blindness or  
20          seeing impairment, deafness or hearing  
21          impairment, and movement impairment have  
22          historically elicited a mix of  
23          difference, hostility, shame, and  
24          intolerance;

25                       Whereas, this year marks the

2           26th anniversary of the passage of the  
3           federal Americans with Disabilities Act,  
4           which prohibits discrimination against  
5           people with disabilities in employment,  
6           transportation, public accommodations,  
7           commercial facilities,  
8           telecommunications, state and local  
9           government services; and

10                   COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Whereas,  
11           the ADA has raised awareness of the  
12           abilities of individuals with  
13           disabilities and has resulted in great  
14           progress, which can be seen in everyday  
15           life through curb cuts, communication  
16           access, accessible buildings and  
17           transportation; and

18                   COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Whereas,  
19           Disability Pride Parades are held  
20           annually to celebrate people with  
21           disabilities and to change the way people  
22           think about and define disability, to end  
23           the stigma of disability, and to promote  
24           the belief that disability is a natural  
25           and beautiful part of human diversity in

2           which people living with disabilities --  
3                        (Applause.)

4           COUNCILWOMAN BASS: That's  
5           right. In which people living with  
6           disabilities can take pride; and

7           COUNCILWOMAN PARKER: Whereas,  
8           along with Philadelphia, Disability Pride  
9           Parades have been held in a number of  
10          places across the United States,  
11          including Silicon Valley/Santa Clara  
12          County, Chicago, Colorado Springs,  
13          Houston, Atlanta, Detroit, New Jersey,  
14          and Columbus, as well as around the world  
15          in locations such as South Korea, Norway,  
16          and the U.K.; and

17          COUNCILWOMAN GYM: Whereas,  
18          this coming Saturday, June 11th,  
19          Philadelphia's 5th Annual Disability  
20          Pride Parade and Celebration will start  
21          at the National Constitution Center at 10  
22          a.m. with opening ceremonies, then parade  
23          down East Market Street to City Hall and  
24          Dilworth Park, and feature several  
25          performances from local artists including

2           Spin Choir, Johnny Crescendo, Gooch and  
3           the Motion, and The Danie Ocean Band.  
4           Now, therefore, be it

5                        COUNCILMAN GREEN: Resolved, by  
6           the Council of the City of Philadelphia,  
7           that we hereby proclaim June 2016 as  
8           Disability Pride Month in the City of  
9           Philadelphia.

10                      Further resolved, that an  
11           engrossed copy of this resolution be  
12           presented to representatives of  
13           Disability Pride Parade and Celebration.

14                      Congratulations.

15                      (Applause.)

16                      MR. HORTON: Well, I'd just  
17           like to thank the Council and the staff  
18           and all the members of the Disability  
19           Pride Committee that I've been working  
20           since I think December last year getting  
21           this thing together. Years and years ago  
22           I came up with a T-shirt, 9/87. We said  
23           Disability Pride in it and, my God, we've  
24           moved a long way since then. We still  
25           got a long way to go.

2                    Disability Pride is about  
3 disabled people feeling okay to be  
4 disabled people. We don't need to  
5 apologize for our disabilities. We don't  
6 need to excuse them. We're just as human  
7 being as every single other person on the  
8 planet, and that's what we celebrate. We  
9 celebrate our difference. Disability is  
10 fine. Everybody is different. There's  
11 no such -- the normal person, I've never  
12 met. I've never ever met a normal  
13 person. They don't exist. We're all  
14 different, and the disability is just  
15 another way that we teach our children,  
16 our grandfathers, and all of our  
17 communities. So that's what Disability  
18 Pride is about.

19                   We really hope that you come  
20 along. If you can't make it at all, at  
21 least get to Dilworth to see some of the  
22 great musicians. It's going to be a  
23 really fabulous day. It was fabulous  
24 last year. It's going to be fabulous  
25 this year. And thank you so much.

6                   (Council at ease.)

7           COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

8   Thank you.

9                   At this time, the Chair  
10   recognizes Councilwoman Blackwell, who  
11   will present a presentation for Odunde.  
12   Would Bumi Fernandez and those  
13   accompanying her please join the  
14   Councilwoman at the podium.

15                   (Councilmembers and guest  
16   approached podium.)

17           COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:   And  
18   joining the Councilwoman, we have  
19   Councilman Kenyatta Johnson.

20           COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL:   Thank  
21   you very much, Mr. President.

22                   This is an extreme pleasure.   I  
23   heard the yays, and I don't know how many  
24   people we have.   We have up to a half  
25   million people who visit our city and who

2           help our economy and who enjoy  
3           themselves. We have people like the Uni  
4           of Effay (ph) from Nigeria and people  
5           from all over the world who come to  
6           appreciate and enjoy Odunde, and we're  
7           just so proud to have this privilege.  
8           And as all of you know, certainly Bumi  
9           Fernandez is also part of the Mayor's  
10          Commission on African and Caribbean  
11          Immigrant Affairs and part of a wonderful  
12          family who participate in every way  
13          possible in our city and our government  
14          and moving it forward.

15                    City Council, City of  
16          Philadelphia citation celebrating and  
17          honoring Odunde, Inc., on its 41st  
18          anniversary.

19                    The Council of the City of  
20          Philadelphia is pleased and proud to join  
21          with the community in recognizing and  
22          honoring a great Philadelphia tradition,  
23          the Odunde Festival. This significant  
24          cultural event is celebrating its 41st  
25          anniversary this year;

2                   Whereas, Odunde was created in  
3           1975 by Lois Fernandez and Ruth Arthur.  
4           The Festival attracts at least 500,000  
5           people annually and is the largest  
6           African American street festival held in  
7           our country. The Festival, whose concept  
8           originates from the Yoruba people of  
9           Nigeria, West Africa, celebrates the  
10          coming of another year for African  
11          Americans and Africanized people around  
12          the world; and

13                   Whereas, Odunde is an occasion  
14          highlighted by a colorful procession from  
15          23rd and South Streets to the Schuylkill  
16          River, where an offering of fruit and  
17          flowers is made to Oshun, the Yoruba  
18          goddess of the river. Odunde is also  
19          known for its authentic African  
20          marketplace featuring vendors from around  
21          the world selling merchandise from many  
22          African nations, the Caribbean, and  
23          Brazil; and

24                   Whereas, each year the second  
25          Sunday in June, Odunde takes place

2           covering 12 City blocks. Odunde will be  
3           celebrating its 41st year in the  
4           traditional South Philadelphia location  
5           near 23rd and South Streets. The  
6           Festival started in 1975 with a \$100  
7           grant and neighbors from Fernandez's  
8           South Philadelphia community. In just  
9           two years, the Odunde Festival exploded;

10                   COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: The  
11           eclectic mix of vendors, entertainment,  
12           and music started to draw people from  
13           around and beyond the region, and each  
14           year continues to be no different; and

15                   Whereas, although Odunde is  
16           best known for his highly visible annual  
17           festival, it provides educational,  
18           cultural, and activist services  
19           throughout the year which supports its  
20           mission. Many of its larger programs are  
21           sponsored or presented as collaborations  
22           with cultural, educational or business  
23           institutions which share Odunde's  
24           mission. They present a wide array of  
25           dance, musical, and theatrical

2           performances, as well as workshops,  
3           lectures, and demonstrations highlighting  
4           the rich cultural heritage of the African  
5           and African American experience.

6                       Therefore, by virtue of this  
7           citation, the Council of the City of  
8           Philadelphia respectfully congratulates  
9           and honors Odunde, Inc., on the joyous  
10          occasion of its 41st anniversary of the  
11          annual Odunde Festival. We salute the  
12          members of Odunde, Inc., its founder Lois  
13          Fernandez, and all who participate in  
14          this great annual event for keeping alive  
15          this great community tradition.

16                      Congratulations.

17                      (Applause.)

18                      COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The  
19          Chair recognizes Ms. Fernandez for  
20          remarks.

21                      MS. FERNANDEZ: Thank you,  
22          Council President Clarke.

23                      I just want to say thank you to  
24          Council President Clarke, City Council.  
25          Thank you to Councilwoman Blackwell and

2           Councilman Johnson, who support Odunde  
3           beyond just the one day, the second  
4           Sunday in June. Thank you to Mayor  
5           Kenney, who I met with him about two  
6           months ago. He said, Bumi, I support you  
7           110 percent.

8                     And I said, Mayor Kenney, I  
9           haven't felt this type of love out of the  
10          Mayor's Office in eight years and I  
11          welcome it. Thank you very much.

12                    So I do want to tell everyone  
13          that Odunde, we are more than just a  
14          festival. We have an economic impact on  
15          the City of Philadelphia, and that's very  
16          key, because some people try to say,  
17          Odunde, that little festival? I'm  
18          thinking to myself, I will slide across  
19          this table and crack you in your face.  
20          You don't understand how much I love  
21          Odunde, right? But my mom said, Bumi,  
22          always be professional. So that's what I  
23          do, right?

24                    So I just want to tell you some  
25          numbers. And I'm not taking these

2           numbers out the sky. Steve Mullin of  
3           Econsult Solutions, his team calculated  
4           all these numbers.

5                        So at a state level, Odunde has  
6           a \$30.6 million economic impact. We  
7           support over 380 jobs with \$3.3 million  
8           in earnings and create \$740,000 in tax  
9           revenue for the State of Pennsylvania.

10                      Now, I know you're wondering --  
11                      (Applause.)

12                      MS. FERNANDEZ: And at a city  
13           level, which all of you want to know  
14           about, at a city level, Odunde has a \$28  
15           million economic impact. We support over  
16           345 jobs with \$12.5 million in earnings  
17           and create over 480,000 in tax revenue  
18           for the City of Philadelphia just within  
19           that ten-hour period.

20                      (Applause.)

21                      MS. FERNANDEZ: So it's very  
22           key for supporting Odunde.

23                      Thank you to all of you who  
24           support Odunde. Thank you to City  
25           Council, Councilwoman Blondell. Thank

2           you to everyone. And thank you to  
3           Congressman Bob Brady, who is a champion  
4           for Odunde, and he is priceless to me.

5                     Thank you, everyone.

6                     (Applause.)

7                     COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

8           Council will be at ease.

9                     (Council at ease.)

10                    COUNCILMAN HENON: At this  
11           time, the Chair recognizes Councilman  
12           Squilla, who will present a resolution to  
13           Kathleen Sullivan. Would Kathleen  
14           Sullivan and those accompanying her  
15           please join the Councilman at the podium.

16                    (Applause.)

17                    (Councilmembers and guests  
18           approached podium.)

19                    COUNCILMAN HENON: Councilman  
20           Squilla.

21                    COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Good  
22           morning, everyone. We just have a little  
23           technical difficulty in that the  
24           resolution is downstairs. So he just  
25           went down to get it and bring it back up.

2           So it's always a good thing to be  
3           prepared.

4                    COUNCILMAN HENON:  At least it  
5           wasn't a wedding ring, right?

6                    COUNCILMAN SQUILLA:  Yeah.  
7           Well, I guess I could sing or something  
8           while we're waiting.

9                    COUNCILMAN HENON:  Council will  
10          be at ease for a few minutes.

11                   COUNCILMAN SQUILLA:  Thank you.  
12          (Brief pause.)

13                   COUNCILMAN HENON:  While we're  
14          waiting to cure some of these technical  
15          difficulties, the Chair recognizes  
16          Councilman Jones.

17                   COUNCILMAN JONES:  Thank you,  
18          Majority Leader.  I wanted to recognize  
19          two young people that are here today, Ian  
20          Watson and Keisha Watson from Lower  
21          Merion High School, one 16 years old,  
22          both of them live in the 4th District,  
23          and next year they're taking music up at  
24          the Settlement Music School.  One plays  
25          the drums; the other one is on the

3           AAU team and also Lower Merion High

8                           COUNCILMAN JONES: Thank you.

9                           COUNCILMAN HENON: Thank you,  
10           Councilman, and congratulations on the  
11           recognition.

12                           At this time, the Chair does  
13           now recognize Councilman Squilla for a  
14           presentation to recognize the resolution  
15           honored to Kathleen Sullivan and those  
16           that are accompanying here at the dais of  
17           the podium. Thank you.

18                           COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Thank you.  
19           I'm also joined by Councilwoman Bass and  
20           Councilman Domb to present this well  
21           long-awaited resolution for our dear  
22           friend Kathleen Sullivan. And I just  
23           want to say before we start real quick is  
24           that you know when you have issues and  
25           you have problems and you need somebody

2           to go to, it's always nice that you could  
3           have somebody that you reach out to that  
4           gets back to you, and that's not always  
5           the case in all the fields. But Kathleen  
6           was always there. Even if it was an  
7           answer we didn't like, she was there to

9           make sure that we at least knew that  
10          Comcast was listening to our concerns.  
11          So, I mean, that's a great, great honor,  
12          and Kathleen has just been such a big  
13          part of that.

14                        So today we're recognizing  
15          Kathleen. The Council of the City of  
16          Philadelphia is pleased and proud to  
17          recognize and honor Kathleen Sullivan on  
18          the occasion of her retirement from the  
19          Comcast following 15 years of loyal and  
20          dedicated service.

21                        COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Whereas,  
22          Kathleen Sullivan is the fourth of nine  
23          children born to Katherine Hannah Fay  
24          Sullivan and Larry Sullivan, a former  
25          Philadelphia police officer. She was

2           raised in the Kensington section of  
3           Philadelphia and attended Little Flower  
4           High School and Temple University;

5                       Whereas, during her 15-year  
6           tenure at Comcast from 2001 to 2016,  
7           Ms. Sullivan has proved extraordinary  
8           service working -- has provided  
9           extraordinary service working closely  
10          with the City of Philadelphia and leading  
11          Comcast government affairs through  
12          several challenging initiatives,  
13          including Philadelphia Rights-of-Way,  
14          Time Warner-Comcast transfer, and Comcast  
15          Philadelphia franchise renewal in 2015.  
16          As a lobbyist for Comcast, Ms. Sullivan's  
17          leadership and expertise in City  
18          government made her a force to be  
19          reckoned with in championing legislative  
20          issues germane to the cable industry. As  
21          an advocate for the underserved,  
22          Ms. Sullivan has been a champion for  
23          numerous non-profits throughout  
24          Philadelphia, including board memberships  
25          with the Philadelphia Police Athletic

2           Leagues, Coaches for Cancer, her alma  
3           mater Little Flower High School for

8           Sullivan served as Philadelphia's City  
9           Representative under Mayor Rendell from  
10          1992 until 2000. While working as City  
11          Representative, Kathleen resurrected the  
12          Philadelphia Marathon to grow it into a  
13          major competitive marathon; planned the  
14          annual City Hall Gala to raise funds for  
15          the beautification and maintenance of  
16          Philadelphia's City Hall; implemented the  
17          annual Phashion Phest Philadelphia to the  
18          City to showcase creative designers in  
19          fashion retail; retained and grew the  
20          annual CoreStates Bike Race by securing  
21          major sponsors; was one of three  
22          inaugural executive directors of Welcome  
23          America, a ten-day citywide festival to  
24          celebrate America's birthday in America's  
25          birthplace; and launched events like the

2           Philadelphia Freedom Festival, the annual  
3           Independence Day ceremony, Night Out on  
4           the Parkway, Wawa Hoagie Day, Knockout

8           the Philadelphia Liberty Medal to  
9           dignitaries like Willem de Klerk, Nelson  
10          Mandela, Vaclav Havel, Sudako Ogato,

12          and CNN, George Mitchell, and Kim de  
13          Jong; worked with the Center City retail  
14          outlets to rejuvenate the annual Center  
15          City holiday celebration; launching a  
16          multi-day holiday festival and parade  
17          centered around the annual holiday tree  
18          lighting; launched the annual PAL Day at  
19          City Hall, bringing youth from the Police  
20          Athletic programs to shadow City  
21          officials, including the Mayor of  
22          Philadelphia; led hospitality events with  
23          the NCAA Women's Final Four; helped to  
24          launch the first annual Philadelphia  
25          College Festival, now a widely recognized

3           Philly; and led the fundraising and  
4           artist selection efforts to create and  
5           bring the Irish Memorial by renowned

8                        COUNCILMAN SQUILLA:   Wow,  
9           that's a lot.

10                       Whereas, Kathleen Sullivan is  
11           well respected by her superiors and  
12           colleagues, and her presence at Comcast  
13           will be sorely missed. Her spirit and  
14           enthusiasm has been paramount to the  
15           position influence and she is held in  
16           high esteem by all. Kathleen has made a  
17           positive impact on many people who have  
18           been enriched by her knowledge and  
19           enhanced by her wisdom.

20                       And, therefore, by virtue of  
21           the citation, City Council of  
22           Philadelphia does hereby recognize and  
23           honor Kathleen Sullivan on the occasion  
24           of her retirement following 15 years of  
25           loyal and dedicated services. We wish

3           health, happiness, and the joys of family  
4           and friends. We extend the sincere

7                        Congratulations.

8                        (Applause.)

9                        COUNCILMAN HENON: The Chair  
10           recognizes Ms. Sullivan for remarks.

11                      MS. SULLIVAN: Well, thank you.  
12           When I walked in this morning at about  
13           9:45, I was talking to some of my friends  
14           at security in the northeast corner and I  
15           looked over and I saw my family, and my  
16           heart started racing. This is the first  
17           I found out that I was going to receive  
18           this honor, and I'm just overwhelmed by  
19           it.

20                      So, President Clarke, thank you  
21           so much for your time and for all that  
22           Council -- what is he saying back there?  
23           Oh, it's Bobby Henon, Councilman Henon.

24                      COUNCILMAN HENON: We love you,  
25           Kathleen.

2                   MS. SULLIVAN: Thank you too.

3                   But I would like to thank all  
4 the Councilmembers.

5                   I began my career as an  
6 official court reporter for Judge Charles  
7 Lord, which is when I knew Brian O'Neill.  
8 So he's old too. And if you were to say  
9 that in 1973 I was going to be up here in  
10 front of this esteemed body surrounded by  
11 my wonderful family and friends, I would  
12 have never believed it. So it's just  
13 beyond my comprehension. So I want to  
14 thank you for that, but I have a few  
15 other people to thank, and I promise not  
16 to be like Sally Fields or Gwyneth  
17 Paltrow.

18                   But my colleague Sharon  
19 Powell -- and actually I don't want to be  
20 a court reporter and correct everybody,  
21 which my family accuses me of all the  
22 time, but I started in 2000, because I  
23 don't want Comcast to cheat me out of a  
24 year of my pension. So it's 16 years.

25                   Soon after I started with

2           Comcast, Sharon and I had a meeting up in  
3           Union, New Jersey, and it was snowing.  
4           There was like two feet on the ground,  
5           two foot of snow on the ground. We get  
6           up there, we go into the meeting. They

8           turn off my phone, it's not there. So  
9           I'm like -- I'm just new. Now I have to  
10          report that I lost my phone.

11                    So we go outside. So I said to  
12          Sharon -- and we're both in our fur hat,  
13          fur coat, fake fur, but as Wendy Williams  
14          would say, we look good. So anyway,  
15          we're on the ground looking for the  
16          phone. She calls it, and I say, Sharon,  
17          I think I can hear it. So I'm crawling  
18          under her gigantic van looking for my  
19          phone. So sure enough, I find it. I get  
20          the phone. I hand it to Sharon. So we  
21          get in the car and we're driving, and all  
22          the sudden I got really embarrassed and I  
23          said, Sharon, why didn't I just ask you  
24          to move the car?

25                    So at that point, we dubbed

2           each other Laverne and Shirley. We've  
3           had many moments since then like that.  
4           Some funny, funny stories. We could  
5           write a tragedy and a comedy.

6                     But, Sharon, I love you. We

9           miss you dearly. Thank you so much.

10                    Let's hear it for Sharon.

11                    (Applause.)

12                    MS. SULLIVAN: There's also --  
13           I'd like to say something, it's always  
14           wonderful working with Council and having  
15           our debates and our mental gymnastics,  
16           but your staff, the Council staff, is  
17           like second to none. And I know last  
18           year with the franchise, I was like a bad  
19           penny, I wouldn't go away and coming into  
20           everybody's office, and the staff was  
21           just so knowledgeable and always would  
22           hear us out and take the issues to their  
23           bosses. And so for all the Council  
24           staff, I can't name you individually, but  
25           thank you so much.

3 hall, we had several lobbyists, and  
4 Sharon and I would not have been able to  
5 do that without you, and I'd like to say

8 DiCicco, Darwin Beauvais, and Carl  
9 Engelke. Thank you so much for helping  
10 us get through some tough years. And  
11 also to Joe Grace, who was just a  
12 fountain of information for us. So thank  
13 you all very, very much.

14                   (Applause.)

15                   MS. SULLIVAN: And a special  
16 thanks also to my favorite frenemy, Doug  
17 Smith from Verizon. Again, we were on  
18 opposite sides, but we always like being  
19 on the same side of an issue, and it's  
20 been a pleasure working with you, Doug.  
21 Thank you.

22                   Years ago my sisters, we're  
23 very close. Not everybody is here. This  
24 is about one-ninth of my family,  
25 one-tenth of my family. But we used to

2           say, Oh, you can't die before me, I can't  
3           imagine living without you. You got to  
4           die first, because I just can't live  
5           without you. We really do love each  
6           other. And that's the way I feel about  
7           my dear buddy Ed McBride. I said -- Ed,

9                           (Applause.)

10           MS. SULLIVAN: So in taking  
11           that vein from what I said about my  
12           sisters, I had to leave before Ed McBride  
13           retired, because I couldn't work without  
14           him. So, Ed, thank you again and thank  
15           you for putting all this together.

16                           I'd like to also thank my Judge  
17           Lord, who is deceased, one of my best  
18           professors ever, learned so much from  
19           him, and my former boss, Ed Rendell.  
20           Without those gentlemen, I would not be  
21           here today. So thank you.

22                           And then, finally, I would like  
23           to thank God for my family. My father  
24           here is a retired Philadelphia police  
25           officer and --

3           MS. SULLIVAN: And I have the  
4           utmost respect for him. And while we  
5           were going through the franchise last  
6           year, my father was undergoing triple

9           went through rehab. All my brothers and  
10          sisters helped him get back on his feet.  
11          So six weeks later, I call him, I said,  
12          Oh, dad, you sound raspy.

13                   He said, Oh, well, a woman at  
14          the gym said she had the same problem.  
15          This is like December 6th.

16                   And I said, Well, what do you  
17          mean a woman at the gym? I said, Where  
18          did you see the woman at the gym?

19                   He goes, At the gym.

20                   So he was back working out  
21          December 6th after triple bypass. So  
22          he's my hero. So if you wonder where I  
23          get my stubbornness, here it is, my  
24          father.

25                   (Applause.)

3 like to thank my best friends, my sister

8 my brother Michael. And Liam and Erica  
9 and the rest of my family who couldn't

14                   Council will stand at ease.

15                   (Council at ease.)

16                   COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

17 Thank you very much. We will move to

13                       As been highlighted many times  
14          in this Council, Philadelphia is one of  
15          the major cities in deep poverty. We  
16          have a high homeownership rate, but a  
17          declining one, and we have articulated  
18          time and time again in this Council our  
19          renewed commitment to preservation,  
20          affordability, and accessibility  
21          throughout the City.

22                       If you're charging \$5,500 per  
23          month, how could it not be financially  
24          feasible to live up to your obligation?

25                       So I want to thank Mayor Kenney

4           officials and say we're not letting them

11          choose to and that government would do  
12          whatever was possible to ensure diversity  
13          and mixed-income communities throughout  
14          the City.

15                        So I look forward to our  
16          continued work here in City Council as we  
17          continue to reexamine and expand our  
18          inclusionary housing policies in the City  
19          of Philadelphia.

20                        Shame on you, PMC. You're not  
21          going to get away with it. This is too  
22          important to the future of the City of  
23          Philadelphia.

11          city. I want to especially acknowledge  
12          the leadership of Councilmembers Reynolds

14          issue for so long, and to thank my  
15          Co-Chair, Councilwoman Cindy Bass, who  
16          held a wonderful set of hearings on  
17          understanding water safety in our city.  
18          And we left the hearing knowing that  
19          Philadelphians deserve answers and  
20          protections when it comes to the issue of  
21          lead poisoning. There should be no  
22          question about the safety of our schools  
23          and child care centers. We should know  
24          that renters and homebuyers should know  
25          what risks they face and that all of our

2           residents have clear pathways to  
3           remediation.

4                       Ever since the Flint water  
5           crisis has happened, we have put renewed  
6           focus on the irreparable harm that lead

10          lead poisoning and reenergize that and  
11          reinvigorate it with a renewed vigilance  
12          and attention where it matters and when  
13          it matters.

14                      And just very quickly, I'd like  
15          to say that in January of 2016, of this  
16          year, a national publication came out  
17          talking about Philadelphia and asking the  
18          question, Is Philadelphia worse than  
19          Flint, and today the headline on that  
20          same national publication says that  
21          Philadelphia is leading the way on water  
22          safety and testing, and I'd like to thank  
23          all the members of Council for helping  
24          lead us through that and show that we can  
25          really change not only the circumstances

25 COUNCILMAN HENON: Thank you,

15                      COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

16          Thank you, Councilman.

17                      COUNCILMAN HENON: And not on  
18          the Final Passage of today's calendar.

19                      COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

20          Thank you. The record shall reflect  
21          that.

22                      We will now move to our public  
23          comment session. Before doing that,  
24          considering the bills and the resolutions  
25          on the Final Passage Calendar, the public

20                   Mr. Decker, please read the  
21          name of the first individual on the list.

22                   CHIEF CLERK: Winston Michael  
23          Ray, commenting on 160575.

24                   (Witness approached podium.)

25                   MR. RAY: It's kind of chilly

3                     My name is Winston Michael Ray.

4           And, first of all, greetings to almighty

5           God who is allowing me this opportunity

6           to speak to you. I have how many? Three

7           minutes? I'll get right to the point.

8                     I have a speech of a two-edged

9           sword, and here's my two-edged sword.

10          Ladies and gentlemen of this

11          distinguished body, to the Mayor, Mayor

12          James Kenney, I'm from --

13                     COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Sir,

14          if you could speak into the mic, because

15          you keep turning.

16                     MR. RAY: Can you hear me now?

17                     COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Yes,

18          please.

19                     MR. RAY: My name is Winston

20          Michael Ray. I'm homeless. And I'm so

21          happy that I'm homeless. I'm the

22          happiest homeless man in the world,

23          because the President and I are involved

24          in a campaign called Operation HOBO,

25          which is an acronym for Homeless Ones

2           Barack Obama. Let me get to the point.

3                     Philadelphia has the  
4           opportunity to be the first city in the  
5           nation to end what I dub as revenue  
6           segregation and economic Jim Crow, which  
7           is the great wage and income disparity  
8           between the have's and have not's.

9                     Now, I just came from  
10          Harrisburg, Pennsylvania a few days ago.  
11          I tried to meet with the Governor. I  
12          offered him \$2 billion if he would stand  
13          with me to bring this issue out to the  
14          nation. He hasn't responded to me. So  
15          I'm going to make the same offer to your  
16          city. I see you're in need of a few  
17          dollars. We're prepared to donate at  
18          least -- well, contribute, donate \$24  
19          million of this infusion of new money  
20          we're going to get from launching  
21          worldwide marketing movement called --  
22          let me spell it -- Silvers, worldwide  
23          S-I-L-V-E-R-\$, Silverized movement.  
24          Ladies and gentlemen, unbeknownst to the  
25          people in my city of New Orleans,

2           America's, C-I-V-I-L, civil rights era is

5                        I have so much to say, quotes  
6           and so forth. I only got three minutes,

8           see this Chamber packed, standing-room  
9           only. The fire marshals have to keep  
10          telling people to don't block the door on  
11          July 4th, which happens to be President  
12          Obama's daughter's 18th birthday, and we  
13          have a present for that young lady as  
14          well as for America, which will be joined  
15          in 40 years.

16                       So, Mr. Chairman, Mr. Clarke,  
17          Mr. President, I would like to know would  
18          you all be able to join in with me as  
19          leaders of this great city along with the  
20          homeless? Because I'm going to be all  
21          over your city very soon after this  
22          meeting passing out flyers, leaflets  
23          regarding homelessness. Bottom line,  
24          we're prepared to pay up to \$3,000 to  
25          those who have stressed out building in

10          Thank you.

11                      MR. RAY: Can I leave my phone  
12          number real quick? My phone number, if

15          available if anyone wants to meet me  
16          after.

17                      COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

18          Thank you. We will take that under  
19          consideration. Thank you. Thank you for  
20          your testimony, sir.

21                      CHIEF CLERK: Joe Schiavo,  
22          commenting on 160575.

23                      (Witness approached podium.)

24                      COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good  
25          afternoon.

2                   MR. SCHIAVO: Good afternoon,  
3 members of Council. My name is Joe  
4 Schiavo and I'm speaking today on behalf  
5 of the Philadelphia Crosstown Coalition  
6 relative to Bill 160525.

7                   Relative to this bill, we're  
8 concerned that this does turn the  
9 planning process on its head relative to  
10 the issue of platting streets. It places  
11 Council's approval by ordinance ahead of  
12 the normal process of plan development,  
13 plan review, comment, and amendment prior  
14 to final favorable recommendation or  
15 rejection by the Planning Commission.

16                   Relative to code Section  
17 14-304(7)(c), which this bill would  
18 amend, there is no apparent flaw in the  
19 current process and -- but unfortunately  
20 by this bill, 1605 --

21                   COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:  
22 Mr. Schiavo, I'm going to let it go  
23 today, but the bill that you're speaking  
24 on is actually not on the Final Passage  
25 Calendar today. So normally you have

2           to -- well, not normally. The rules call  
3           for you to speak only on bills that are  
4           on the Final Passage Calendar, which this  
5           is not today. But you're halfway through  
6           your testimony, so please if you can just

9                       MR. SCHIAVO: Thank you,  
10           Council President.

11                      COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:  
12           Thank you, sir. Thank you so much.

13                      CHIEF CLERK: Joe Danihel,  
14           commenting on 160481, 160569, 160580,  
15           160573, and 160575.

16                      (Witness approached podium.)

17                      COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good  
18           afternoon.

19                      MR. DANIHEL: Good afternoon.  
20           In 1789, the year the Constitution was  
21           passed, the average life expectancy of an  
22           adult was 18 years. I have been waiting  
23           to be paid for my stolen home --

24                      COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Sir?

25                      MR. DANIHEL: -- stolen by the

2           City of Philadelphia for 23 years.

3                   COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

4           Mr. Danihel, can you start out with  
5           referencing the bill. And I know you're  
6           going to segue into something else, but  
7           if you can just start off in referencing  
8           the Vacant Property Review Committee or  
9           the resolutions on the bill that you're  
10          indicating --

11                   MR. DANIHEL: I thought we  
12          already went over that, and we're now  
13          killing one minute of my time, which  
14          you're going to bang me for on the back  
15          end.

16                   COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: You  
17          know, the rule is you're supposed to --

18                   MR. DANIHEL: This Council  
19          continues to use the Redevelopment  
20          Authority, which has stolen my property.

21                   COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Just  
22          reference the Redevelopment Authority.

23                   MR. DANIHEL: I have it in my  
24          speech, sir. Now, do we want to start  
25          the race over again since I've been

2           interrupted and you've interrupted the  
3           rules and --

4                    COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: All  
5           right. Sir, sir, you know, we've had a  
6           long day and I'm asking you to --

7                    MR. DANIHEL: The Redevelopment  
8           Authority has been used by the Council  
9           several more times, even though they've  
10          been duly notified that they're violating  
11          the law.

12                   COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:  
13          Thank you.

14                   MR. DANIHEL: These members  
15          seem to not care. This Council is in  
16          clear violation of 42 USC 1982, 1983,  
17          1985, 1986, 18 USC 2384 and 2381, among  
18          others. Can a firefighter be allowed to  
19          ignore a fire and let it burn for 22  
20          years?

21                    This Council is required by  
22          oath of office and US law to act. The DA  
23          is required to prosecute. Sheriff and  
24          judges are required to not accept deed  
25          transfers unless due process is followed.

1           6/9/16 - STATED - PUBLIC COMMENT

2           These agencies are required to follow  
3           strict laws once clear evidence, like in  
4           my case, is presented. Action and  
5           prosecution is required. It is your duty  
6           of oversight and your action is required.

7                         Why then does the Council not  
8           act? Doesn't the Council care? You have  
9           an oath of office to support, obey, and  
10          defend the Constitution. Now let's get  
11          to work and actually do something to  
12          correct this injustice. You have a legal  
13          and moral obligation to do so, and to not  
14          interrupt the people, because it's under  
15          our direction that your power is derived.  
16          Now, I hope you understand that, because  
17          you clearly don't.

19          Thank you for your testimony.

24                        Good morning, City Council. I

14          way to stop or repair the Mortgage  
15          Foreclosure Program.

16                        So as a businessman and I guess  
17                        as politicians, you got to help me  
18                        understand how you're going to ask for  
19                        \$40 million to give to a program that  
20                        still is broken. I am baffled by that.  
21                        I am baffled. Any business person will  
22                        say we can't put money back into  
23                        something if we haven't fixed it. Now,  
24                        if I'm missing something, I think someone  
25                        can at least tell me how can we do that.

2           (Unintelligible) waiting for someone to  
3           answer that, either Curtis, Councilman  
4           Domb, Councilwoman Gym, Parker. Someone  
5           has to help me with this one. That's  
6           backwards.

7                         Somebody can answer it.

8           Somebody can answer that. A  
9           three-year-old can tell you that's  
10          backwards. You can't put money back into  
11          something that's broke.

12                        COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

13          Thank you, sir.

14                        MR. YOUNG: It's broke.

15                        COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

16          Councilman Jones.

17                        COUNCILMAN JONES: So the  
18          imperfect should never be the enemy of  
19          the good. That's probably misquoted  
20          somehow, but the intent of what I'm  
21          saying is that the Mortgage Foreclosure  
22          Program, which was started in fact by an  
23          action of this body, has helped thousands  
24          of people in the City of Philadelphia  
25          save their home. Are they perfect?

3           Yup. Should they be stopped and looked

11          wouldn't want to hear "therefore," "but,"

17          not perfect. That's just not what I'm

4                   COUNCILWOMAN BROWN: Thank you,  
5 Mr. President. This month the Forbes  
6 magazine published the world's most  
7 powerful women for 2016. Who are the  
8 world's most powerful women this year?  
9 They are the smartest and toughest female  
10 business leaders, entrepreneurs,  
11 investors, scientists, philanthropists,  
12 and CEOs making their mark in the world  
13 today. They're women who are building  
14 billion-dollar brands, calling the shots  
15 in the financial markets, and  
16 crisscrossing the globe to broker  
17 international agreements.

18                   Of course I was most struck by  
19 those women who are now world leaders and  
20 presidents or heads of states, and this  
21 number has more than doubled since 2005,  
22 according to a Pew research study.

23                   Who are some of these world's  
24 most powerful exceptional women? In slot  
25 No. 33, it is the Attorney General

2           Loretta Lynch for public service and  
3           politics. In slot No. 21, it's Oprah  
4           Winfrey, of course, around media and  
5           entertainment. No. 13, Michelle Obama.  
6           No. 7, Sheryl Sandberg, executive with  
7           Facebook and, of course, author of the  
8           book Lean In. In No. 4 for philanthropy,  
9           Melinda Gates.

10                   This week the ultimate glass  
11           ceiling was shattered across the United  
12           States of America. For the first time  
13           ever, a woman will be a major party's  
14           nominee to become President of the United  
15           States. She ranked No. 2 on the Forbes  
16           list of the world's most powerful women,  
17           Secretary of State Hillary Clinton.

18                   What's the small cliff note  
19           women's history lesson? In the early  
20           1800s, women were second-class citizens.  
21           Women were expected to restrict their  
22           sphere of interest to the home and the  
23           family. Women were not encouraged to  
24           obtain a real education or pursue a  
25           professional career. After marriage,

2                   women did not have the right to own their  
3                   own property, keep their own wages or  
4                   sign a contract. In addition, all women  
5                   were denied the right to vote.

6                   Only after decades of intense  
7                   political activity did women eventually  
8                   win the right to vote. And in women's  
9                   history class, we would know that it was  
10                  the 19th Amendment in 1920 that granted  
11                  us the right to vote.

12                 Almost 100 years later, the  
13                 significance of Hillary Clinton being a  
14                 presumed nominee is not just a victory  
15                 for women; it's a victory for the nation.  
16                 And we have to be reminded that she and  
17                 President Barack Obama stand on the  
18                 shoulders of the former Congresswoman  
19                 Shirley Chisholm. Shirley Chisholm was a  
20                 pioneer for her generation, a woman of  
21                 many firsts - the first African American  
22                 Congresswoman from New York, the first  
23                 African American to run for President,  
24                 the first woman to run for President in  
25                 1972.

2                   As a woman and as an African  
3 American woman in the halls of  
4 government, I am reminded that excellence  
5 is not an act. It has to be a habit.

6                   This morning I salute Secretary  
7 of State Hillary Clinton, who will be the  
8 first woman to be a major party's nominee  
9 to become President of the United States,  
10 a woman focused on building bridges and  
11 not walls. This is an important moment  
12 for Philadelphia as we look to host the  
13 Democratic National Convention, and it is  
14 an important moment for the nation.

15                   Thank you, Mr. President.

16                   COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

17 Thank you, Councilwoman.

18                   The Chair recognizes Councilman  
19 Greenlee.

20                   COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: Thank  
21 you, Mr. President. I usually don't  
22 speak on issues outside City Council, but  
23 there was an article in the newspaper  
24 today that made the few hairs still on my  
25 head stand up, and I have to -- I felt I

2           had to comment. I'm talking about an  
3           article talking about House Bill No.  
4           1947. That's a bill that would give  
5           victims of abuse to the age of 50 instead  
6           of 30 to sue their abusers or the  
7           institutions that employ or supervise  
8           them. And the story relates how  
9           apparently the Catholic church -- and  
10          I'll state real fast that I'm Catholic.  
11          The Catholic church has worked real hard,  
12          apparently through the coordination of  
13          Archbishop Chaput's office, to  
14          aggressively go after any legislator,  
15          particularly Catholic legislator, that  
16          voted for this bill. The bill has passed  
17          the House, is now waiting passage in the  
18          Senate.

19                    I know some people might not  
20          like me saying this, but when I saw this  
21          story, I quickly thought of the Academy  
22          Award-winning movie I guess just last  
23          year called Spotlight where it was a  
24          story about the Boston Globe and their  
25          expose on clergy abuse. And there was, I

2                   thought, a pretty moving scene in that  
3                   where the actor Mark Ruffalo, the  
4                   character he was portraying, who is  
5                   Catholic, was also talking to other  
6                   reporters that are Catholic expressing  
7                   his frustration that the paper wasn't  
8                   moving fast enough on this issue and he  
9                   yelled out, It could have been me, it  
10                  could have been you, it could have been  
11                  anybody. And I guess I relate to that  
12                  because as a Catholic growing up in the  
13                  '60s, it could have been me. Luckily for  
14                  me, it wasn't, but I know somebody that  
15                  was, and this is a very, very  
16                  heart-wrenching issue to have to deal  
17                  with if you were a victim. Oftentimes  
18                  you internalize it for a long time, from  
19                  what I understand. I saw the effect it  
20                  had on this gentleman. I didn't know him  
21                  that well, but I knew him well enough to  
22                  see what it did to him.

23                  Giving that person extra time  
24                  to try to work all this out and then get  
25                  proper justice to me is a fair law, and

2                   to try to say, as apparently has been  
3                   done, that somehow you're betraying your  
4                   faith by being against this bill just  
5                   seems terribly off base.

6                   For example, State  
7                   Representative Martina White from  
8                   Northeast Philadelphia apparently was  
9                   told that a priest told her aide that she  
10                  was not welcome at some events because  
11                  she was in support of House Bill 1947.

12                  So the only thing I can say to  
13                  Representative White is, don't be  
14                  discouraged. You did the right thing. I  
15                  hope the Senate passes the bill and I  
16                  hope this becomes law, just speaking for  
17                  myself. And at the end of the story,  
18                  there's a quote from Representative Nick  
19                  Miccarelli, and it's one of those things  
20                  I would like to say I wish I could have  
21                  said. He states, I quote, "I would much  
22                  rather be chastised from the altar than  
23                  to be damned for not allowing justice to  
24                  be done," unquote.

25                  And let me just add that,

2                   again, as a Catholic, the church right  
3                   now I know is going after legislators on  
4                   this bill, but if they choose to widen  
5                   their scope and go after Catholic office  
6                   holders who support that bill, the name  
7                   is Greenlee, G-R-E-E-N-L-E-E.

8                   (Applause.)

9                   COUNCILMAN GREENLEE: And to  
10                  steal Councilwoman Reynolds Brown's line,  
11                  when they print that name, they could put  
12                  it in bold, underlined, with exclamation  
13                  points.

14                  Thank you, Mr. President.

15                  COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

17                  (Applause.)

4           One is that the water rates in  
5           Philadelphia will rise by nearly 10  
6           percent in the next two years. Bills are  
7           slated to go monthly from 67.43 to 74.05,  
8           and that's pretty rough. The Water Rate  
9           Board said that they're going to try to  
10          study and implement an income-based  
11          assistance program. My question is, why  
12          couldn't you figure that out at the same  
13          time you were talking about raising  
14          rates? But it's always that way. As you  
15          all know, I'm still waiting from June  
16          14th last year for people to be made  
17          whole on North 52nd Street.

18                   So I'm hoping that since  
19          they'll say next spring they're going to  
20          come out with a water assistance rate  
21          based on income, that that happens. So  
22          that's something we should watch, because  
23          I'm not encouraged, not when it comes to  
24          the Water Department.

25                   The second thing I'd like to

2           let everyone know is, my state  
3           representative, Dr. James R. Roebuck,  
4           188th District -- in fact, he was chosen  
5           by Lucien Blackwell -- and his wife was a

8           Meredith School. She played music for  
9           many churches. In fact, she passed from  
10          lung cancer. Her funeral is tomorrow  
11          across the street. She played at that  
12          church as well. And I hope that all of  
13          you will extend condolences. Keep Jim in  
14          your prayers. He's also one of my  
15          committeemen in the 46th Ward. And she  
16          was a wonderful person, a good person,  
17          and loved her neighborhood.
