So to give our invocation this morning, the Chair recognizes Reverend Tuck Bartholomew, Senior Pastor of City Church of Philadelphia. He is here today as the guest of Councilman Oh.

REVEREND BARTHOLOMEW: Thank you, Council President. It's an honor to be here. I thank you, Councilman Oh, for the invitation. My name is Tuck Bartholomew and I'm Pastor of City Church in West Philadelphia, and thank you for this opportunity and thank you for the

3                        Would you pray with me.

4                        Our Father in heaven, fount of  
5           wisdom and creator of justice, author of  
6           all things good and beautiful, we give  
7           you thanks for the great love that you  
8           have for all people in all places and  
9           especially for the people that inhabit,  
10          create, and sustain the neighborhoods we  
11          call Philadelphia. You know our  
12          greatness, beauty, and resources. You  
13          know our struggles, sorrows, and  
14          failures.

15                      We are a city of intelligence,  
16          knowledge, wealth, imagination,  
17          creativity, but we do not experience  
18          these graces equally across all  
19          neighborhoods and households in our city.  
20          And for this purpose, you have ordained  
21          and called these men and women to roles  
22          of political and civic leadership to seek  
23          the common good of the people of  
24          Philadelphia. We ask that their lives,  
25          individually and collaboratively as a

2    Council, would be marked by humility,  
3    hope, wisdom, and courage; that their  
4    work would build and strengthen those  
5    values and experiences of truth,  
6    goodness, beauty, prosperity, justice,  
7    and health that have always made great

9            Lord, you hear the cry of the  
10   poor, the marginalized, the refugees, the  
11   children of our city, the homeless, and  
12   all really that struggle to find their  
13   way in life. We ask that every person  
14   across the neighborhoods of our city  
15   would become those that use their  
16   relative power and resource for the sake  
17   of those that you both hear and love. We  
18   ask these things in the name of Jesus  
19   Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns  
20   with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit,  
21   one God, now and forever.

4 At this time, I would dispense  
5 with the regular order of business and I  
6 would like to recognize and I want to  
7 thank everyone who has taken time out of  
8 their busy day to come down to witness  
9 your government in action. We hope your  
10 stay here today is a pleasurable one and  
11 also a knowledgeable one. So we really  
12 appreciate you coming down. So, again,  
13 thank you very much.

14 At this time, the Chair  
15 recognizes Councilman Green, who will  
16 present a resolution honoring Peirce  
17 College. Would James Mergiotti and those  
18 accompanying him please join the  
19 Councilman at the podium.

20 (Councilmembers and guests  
21 approached podium.)

22 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: And  
23 joining Councilman Green, we have  
24 Councilman Johnson, Councilman Oh, and  
25 Councilman Squilla.

2 COUNCILMAN GREEN: Good  
3 morning. Good morning. Good morning.  
4 Today is back to school, I guess, for  
5 members of Council, and yesterday I  
6 experienced back to school for my son.  
7 So I think it's very fitting that we  
8 honor a very outstanding institution of  
9 higher education that's often overlooked  
10 but does such great work in our city, and  
11 today we'll be presenting this resolution  
12 to Peirce College.

13 We're honoring Peirce College  
14 for its 150 years of providing an  
15 affordable education to working class  
16 students.

17 Whereas, Thomas May Peirce  
18 founded the Union Business College in  
19 1865 to deliver a new kind of practical,  
20 business education in the post-war years,  
21 in its first year enrolling 550 students,  
22 many ex-Civil War soldiers who needed  
23 special teaching to land a career; and

24 Whereas, ahead of its time in  
25 19th Century America, Dr. Peirce also

2   offered career-oriented education to  
3   women, with enrollment reaching 300 women  
4   by 1888, in a tradition that continues  
5   today, where Peirce College being a  
6   leading provider of part-time business  
7   education for Pennsylvania women; and

8           COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Whereas,  
9   Peirce College, which resides in the 2nd  
10   Councilmanic District, growth and  
11   recognition came hand in hand as the  
12   renamed Peirce College of Business moved  
13   to larger facilities, drawing  
14   commencement speakers like John  
15   Wanamaker, Andrew Carnegie and several  
16   ex-presidents, including Benjamin  
17   Harrison, Grover Cleveland, Theodore  
18   Roosevelt and William Howard Taft; and

19           Whereas, Peirce moved to its  
20   current location, a state of the art  
21   facility with a library, restaurant,  
22   gymnasium, showers, bowling alley --  
23   bowling alley? -- elevators and filtered  
24   drinking water delivered to fountains  
25   every day. In 1915, the same year a

2 Building and Loan Association was formed  
3 to help students invest their earnings  
4 and support their income; and

5           Whereas, during World War I,  
6 special "War Courses" were taught free of  
7 charge to Armed Forces members designed  
8 to meet the demand for clerical workers,  
9 and during World War II, Peirce again  
10 prepared both civilian and government  
11 workers for their roles in the operation  
12 of the modern military; and

13           COUNCILMAN OH: Whereas,  
14 throughout the 1950s, Peirce offered  
15 specialized certificate programs to  
16 growing occupations, like medical,  
17 airline, secretaries and receptionists;  
18 and

19           Whereas, through the 1970s and  
20 1980s, Peirce's position as the leader in  
21 business education was fueled by interest  
22 in practical business and technology  
23 programs, such as its newly launched  
24 computer-related courses; and

25           Whereas, the 1990s saw a need

2   for corporations and government agencies  
3   to guarantee a quality workforce, the  
4   Corporate College was opened and the  
5   Business Administration Degree was  
6   delivered to students entirely at their  
7   respective places of employment; and

8           COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Whereas,  
9   in 1997, Peirce began offering a Bachelor  
10   of Science degree for programs in  
11   Business, Healthcare, Information  
12   Technology, Court Reporting and Paralegal  
13   Studies, the only bachelor's degree  
14   program in Paralegal Studies in  
15   Philadelphia to be approved by the  
16   American Bar Association; and

17           Whereas, at the turn of the  
18   21st century, Peirce became one of the  
19   first schools to offer online degrees  
20   with Peirce Online, enabling students to  
21   access quality Peirce courses through the  
22   Internet; and

23           Whereas, in 2013, Peirce  
24   College launched its first master's  
25   degree program, marking the latest

2 milestone in the rich history of one of  
3 America's oldest colleges; and

4           Whereas, today, Peirce College  
5 continues the tradition of excellence and  
6 their mission of helping working adults  
7 advance their careers through flexible  
8 courses offered on campus or online; now,  
9 therefore, be it

10           COUNCILMAN GREEN: Resolved, by  
11 the Council of the City of Philadelphia,  
12 that Council does honor Peirce College  
13 for its 150 years of providing an  
14 affordable education to working class  
15 students.

16           Resolved further, that an  
17 engrossed copy of this resolution be  
18 presented to Peirce College, evidencing  
19 the sincere admiration and respect of  
20 this legislative body.

21           Congratulations on your  
22 anniversary.

23           (Applause.)

10   City Plan Balfour Street from Ontario  
11   Street to Russell Street; and

12                   An ordinance amending Chapter  
13   19-3200 of The Philadelphia Code,  
14   entitled "Keystone Opportunity Zone,  
15   Economic Development District, and  
16   Strategic Development Area," by providing  
17   for additional Keystone Opportunity  
18   Expansion Zones, all under certain terms  
19   and conditions.

23 Smith School, because there are a lot of  
24 people who are suffering from the  
25 transfer going to either Stanton or to

3 that school.

4 We do not need any more condos.  
5 We really need the school. The area is  
6 being swamped by cars. There's no  
7 parking. People are complaining because

10 before they can find a place to park. We  
11 are asking Council to really rethink  
12 saving Smith School.

13 I've heard about two incidents  
14 where a parent got locked up because her  
15 child was sent out of the area. She had  
16 to pay \$2,000 for a fine, plus she lost  
17 her home while she was fighting in  
18 conservation and she had to come out and  
19 take her children to a shelter.

20 Please rethink saving Smith  
21 School. That's all I ask.

18 We need Smith School. Our  
19 children need an education. Education  
20 starts in the early stages, not in the  
21 5th, 6th, 7th, 8th grade. We have plenty  
22 of children in our area that's traveling  
23 far, that's being bused, as far as  
24 getting on the bus at 5:30 in the morning  
25 and not getting to school sometimes until

2 9:30. That's not right.

3 We need a school at Smith  
4 School, whether it's from kindergarten,  
5 preschool to 4th or preschool to 12th. I  
6 know the hood is overlapping with condos

8 in with children and moving back out, and  
9 I have asked them why, because there's a  
10 few on my block, and the lady says  
11 there's no school. I asked her where did  
12 she relocate to.

13 She said Ardmore.

14 I said why.

15 She says because there's a  
16 school. It's imperative that we have a  
17 school where we live so our children can  
18 get home and neighbors can watch them get  
19 into the front door.

20 I love my community and I love  
21 where we're at. I feel sorry for the  
22 newcomers that's just having babies and  
23 they're talking about moving out. We  
24 talk about saving the community. How we  
25 want to save the community if we don't

2    have no school? So that's showing me  
3    education is not the key, but you're  
4    selling education to profit over condos  
5    and houses, and that's not fair to our

11                   Are there any speeches on the  
12 part of the minority?

13                   And the Chair recognizes  
14 Councilman Oh.

15                   COUNCILMAN OH: Thank you very  
16 much, Council President. I raise an  
17 issue and I believe it is being corrected  
18 as we sit here, but unfortunately it has  
19 not been corrected for over a year and,  
20 that is, that this Council body passed  
21 legislation creating a tax credit for  
22 employers who hire returning veterans in  
23 the City of Philadelphia. That was  
24 amended to increase to \$5,000 for a  
25 full-time employee per year for three

2 years. It was brought to my attention  
3 last year that the City's website  
4 provided outdated information, which  
5 stated that that tax credit ended in  
6 2014. It provided an outdated worksheet  
7 and application form, and unfortunately  
8 that means that employers cannot process  
9 the application for the tax credit. Now  
10 there is no mention of this tax credit on  
11 the current Revenue website and,  
12 therefore, nobody can apply for this tax  
13 credit.

14 I did raise this issue several  
15 times. I believe it is now being  
16 addressed, but I am letting people know  
17 that the City of Philadelphia does have a  
18 tax credit for employers who hire  
19 returning veterans, and that tax credit  
20 is in effect from June 2014 to June 2020.  
21 And so I do urge the Administration to  
22 correct that as quickly as possible.

23 Thank you very much.

24 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

25 Thank you, Councilman. Thanks for

2 bringing that to our attention.

3           Speeches on the part of the  
4 majority?

5           The Chair recognizes Councilman  
6 Jones.

7           COUNCILMAN JONES: Thank you,  
8 Mr. President. Thirty-two years ago we  
9 started celebrating nationally Minority  
10 Enterprise Development Week, and it's  
11 been an ongoing celebration in the City  
12 of Philadelphia and we are, in the first  
13 week of October, going to celebrate it  
14 again.

15           But more recently in these  
16 Chambers, it was recognized the  
17 importance of small business to the local  
18 economy. It started with the beverage  
19 tax debate last session, and I think it  
20 was Councilwoman Parker raised the issue  
21 of the lack of ownership by local  
22 businesses on the commercial corridors  
23 that would be impacted by the sugary  
24 drinks tax. And thinking about it, I  
25 thought about it, and over those 32

2 years, it is true the local ownership,  
3 whether it's replaced by national chains  
4 or whether mom and pop shops just have  
5 gone a different direction, local  
6 ownership has decreased on our corridors.

7 It was again raised yesterday  
8 by, I believe, Councilman Green talking  
9 about a strategy that the City of  
10 Philadelphia needed to have to really  
11 address this issue to make sure that  
12 people who live here, who benefit by  
13 living here, should also benefit in the  
14 consumption of goods and services in the  
15 City of Philadelphia.

16 By way of impact, small  
17 businesses represent 98 percent of all  
18 new growth in America, and in  
19 Pennsylvania, I believe we have 98.2  
20 percent of the employment that is done is  
21 done by small businesses, other than  
22 government, other than big universities.  
23 It is the small businessman that makes  
24 this happen, but in particular, in our  
25 neighborhoods, at the micro level.

2                   When we think about the impact  
3 of Denise's Bakery on North 22nd Street  
4 and how she is a fixture of that  
5 community or whether you talk about the  
6 McDonald's that was introduced a  
7 resolution recognizing the independent  
8 owners and what John Dawkins says meant  
9 to individual communities throughout  
10 Philadelphia or whether you talk about  
11 Marta Diaz who used to have a butcher  
12 shop and she lived above it for dozens  
13 and dozens of years, that that kind of  
14 merchant, that kind of entrepreneur on  
15 the 100 commercial corridors is the glue  
16 of most communities. And I'm calling on  
17 the Commerce Department, in conjunction  
18 with us, to develop an attraction and  
19 ownership strategy locally.

20                   This is something that Wilson  
21 Goode and I have talked about, even  
22 before either one of us was elected, at  
23 PCDC, but we want to reinvigorate that  
24 kind of thought process as we deliberate  
25 in our budget.

2           So to that end, Councilwoman  
3 Parker and myself are co-sponsoring a  
4 small business workshop. It's called  
5 Ready, Set and Grow, on October 3rd, and  
6 it's going to be at the local -- what is  
7 that -- pipeline right across the street,  
8 but it's going to be with the intention  
9 of figuring out how we can get more  
10 Philadelphians to benefit from the local  
11 economy and keep that synergy of money in  
12 the community.

13           Thank you, Mr. President.

14           COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

15 Thank you, Councilman. Good point.

16           The Chair recognizes  
17 Councilwoman Gym.

18           COUNCILWOMAN GYM: Thank you  
19 very much, Mr. President, and good  
20 morning still to all of our colleagues.  
21 We're moving very quickly today.

22           On Tuesday, the Supreme Court  
23 of Pennsylvania will determine if  
24 children across this Commonwealth deserve  
25 their day in court. Our state system of

2       funding our public schools is seriously  
3       broken, and next week we will have, for  
4       the first time in more than a decade, a  
5       chance to hear a different way of looking  
6       at how we fund public education.

7           Local communities have too  
8       often been forced to pick up what has not  
9       been funded at the state level. This  
10      body in particular has delivered funding  
11      to the Philadelphia public schools by  
12      more than \$400 million in the last five  
13      years, but it's not sustainable. And  
14      this is a state that ranks at the bottom  
15      of the nation in terms of the funding gap  
16      between the poorest school districts and  
17      the wealthiest school districts.

18           We don't have to go outside of  
19      Pennsylvania to -- or outside of  
20      Philadelphia to understand what that  
21      looks like. It means that we had 77  
22      students in a gym class at Mastbaum. It  
23      means that we had hundreds of teacher  
24      vacancies last year. We've done a huge  
25      lift at the local level and we've gone as

2 far as we can, and it's time for  
3 Harrisburg to step up. It's time for us  
4 to have a serious conversation about what  
5 it looks like and what it takes to fund  
6 our schools, but ultimately it's going to  
7 come through a mandate that's  
8 constitutionally based, that's delivered  
9 with force and emphasis, and we're going  
10 to look forward to having that day in  
11 court. But beforehand, I want to thank  
12 all my colleagues and particularly  
13 Councilwoman Blackwell, Councilmembers  
14 Domb, Green, Henon, Quinones-Sanchez,  
15 Reynolds Brown, Squilla, and Oh, who are  
16 going to come together and sponsor a  
17 singing concert for our schools on  
18 Monday, the 12th. We welcome everybody  
19 out to Dilworth from 2:00 to 6:00 p.m.  
20 We're taking it over. We've got marching  
21 bands, step teams. They're all coming  
22 in. We've even got somebody from Erie  
23 coming in all the way over here.  
24           We welcome any and all  
25 colleagues to come and say a few words to

2       talk about what it means to have a voice  
3       on school funding and seeking justice for  
4       our young people all across the  
5       Commonwealth, not only just for  
6       Philadelphia but for all children.

7           And then on Tuesday, we welcome  
8       you here in City Hall in the Supreme  
9       Court to hear a case that's been a long  
10      time coming.

11           So thank you very much, Council  
12      President. Thank you very much to my  
13      colleagues too.

14           COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

15      Thank you, Councilwoman.

16           The Chair recognizes Councilman  
17      Domb.

18           COUNCILMAN DOMB: Thank you,  
19      Council President. I want to also thank  
20      you for the hearing yesterday on what I  
21      would view as the financial health of the  
22      City. I personally loved it, and I think  
23      it's such an important issue, because  
24      without a healthy city, we all have  
25      nothing. And I think what this hearing

2   pointed out to us was that cities of our  
3   size that have a population base of  
4   500,000 to 4 million, we, according to  
5   our three rating services, are at the  
6   lowest level of ratings, and it's because  
7   of fund balance and pensions.

8           And I also want to commend Matt  
9   Stitt and Bob. They did a great job with  
10   putting together the information for us  
11   for this hearing. But I want to really  
12   call to the fact that this is such an  
13   important issue for the future of our  
14   city, not today but just in five, ten,  
15   and 15 years. This is the long term we  
16   need to tackle. We need to have a goal  
17   and get this fixed. And two big areas  
18   which I've been talking about and  
19   everyone is talking about is collecting  
20   our delinquent taxes across the board and  
21   fixing OPA, especially in the commercial  
22   assessments. Those two areas we believe  
23   are in excess of a hundred million  
24   dollars that could come to the City every  
25   year. So tackling those is crucial, and

2 most important is keeping our bond rating  
3 where it is or raising it and not letting  
4 it deteriorate. That's a real focus that  
5 I appreciate your calling that hearing  
6 yesterday, because I think that's very,  
7 very important.

8 Thank you.

9 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

10 Thank you. And thank you for your dogged  
11 persistence on this very important issue.

12 The Chair recognizes  
13 Councilwoman Bass.

14 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Thank you,  
15 Mr. President. I just wanted to invite  
16 everyone out for our Responsible Business  
17 Operations bill signing, which is going  
18 to be held next Monday, September 12th at  
19 4:00 p.m. at 5708 Germantown Avenue, and  
20 anyone who knows that location, which is  
21 Germantown and Cheltenham, the business that  
22 was there, which is now shuttered, was a  
23 notorious, what we call, stop and go,  
24 which was closed by the Liquor Control  
25 Board, and we're having our business bill

2 signing there because we want folks to  
3 know that there are new tools out there  
4 that are available, so that if you have a  
5 nuisance business in your neighborhood,  
6 there are things that can be done. And  
7 so if you have a business that has  
8 illegal consumption of alcoholic  
9 beverages outside of the property,  
10 illegal drug activity, litter on the  
11 sidewalks, unlawful street or sidewalk  
12 obstruction, gambling, loitering, public  
13 urination or defecation, that these are  
14 all behaviors that will come under fire.  
15 And some people will say, Well, I've  
16 never seen businesses like that. People  
17 have said to me, Where is this kind of  
18 thing happening? Well, there it is.  
19 It's happening all over the City of  
20 Philadelphia, but typically in certain  
21 neighborhoods.

22 And so we want to attack the  
23 problem at the root. We want to let  
24 folks know that if you operate a  
25 business, you cannot stay inside and say

2       there's nothing I can do about what's  
3       happening outside. I'm responsible for  
4       what happens outside on the sidewalk of  
5       my home, and they're responsible for what  
6       happens outside on the sidewalk of their  
7       business. And so we want folks to know

9       sort of way against the businesses that  
10      operate in our neighborhood that provide  
11      the important goods and services that we  
12      need, but there has to be a way of  
13      operating, and we don't just want  
14      businesses to deliver a product. We want  
15      them to deliver an experience.

16                 And so we'd love to work with  
17      those who are interested in working with  
18      us, but the bill signing will be next  
19      Monday, September 12th at 4:00 p.m. and,  
20      again, at 5708 Germantown Avenue, which  
21      is Germantown and Cheltenham.

22                 Thank you.

6 32nd anniversary of Philadelphia MED

9 and remind all of us that a strategic  
10 approach is important. And just today in  
11 keeping with that goal, Councilwoman  
12 Sanchez and I introduced a bill that  
13 hopefully will be successful in not only  
14 incentivizing but developing sound  
15 criteria for creating a nexus for local  
16 businesses and then offering them some  
17 level of tax credit towards that end.  
18 More will be held on that bill when it  
19 moves towards committee.

20 And as a friendly reminder for  
21 MED Week, a number of workshops are  
22 taking place. My focus is on the rebuild  
23 and making sure we do that in a way  
24 that's acceptable to this legislative  
25 body. So I'm asking members to please

18       out tomorrow to my 12th annual Peace Not  
19       Guns memorial basketball game. That's  
20       where members of the Point Breeze Youth  
21       Development Basketball league will play  
22       members of the Philadelphia Police  
23       Department, all in the effort of building  
24       the relationships between our law  
25       enforcement community and members of the

2 Point Breeze community. But also we take  
3 this event to highlight the issue of  
4 youth gun violence that's taking place  
5 here in the City of Philadelphia.

6 Throughout the summer we have  
7 seen several little children being shot  
8 as well as on a daily basis young men  
9 being murdered. And so we use this type  
10 of an event to highlight that issue, but  
11 also look forward to continue working  
12 with you, Council President, after you go  
13 after lost and stolen guns and making  
14 that a priority not only in this city but  
15 also at the state, and hopefully those  
16 who are elected on the federal level will  
17 begin to take on this -- will begin to  
18 champion this issue on the federal level,  
19 on the state level, because at the end of  
20 the day, we will never continually  
21 progressively move this city forward if  
22 the City isn't safe.

23 And so tomorrow, 6 o'clock,  
24 Chew Playground. I know Councilman  
25 Jones, one of my celebrity judges who

2 will judge the actual slam dunk contest.

3 So I thank him for coming out and

4 participating with several other

5 individuals, but for the most part, I

6 invite all of my colleagues to come out.

7 I know Councilwoman Parker, who has a

8 birthday Friday evening -- I want to put

9 out there on the spot. She's probably

10 like going on 30 or something like that.

11 But nevertheless, she also expressed some

12 interest. And I invite everybody to come

13 on out. But at the end of the day, that

14 event will highlight, again, building

15 relationships between the law enforcement

16 community as well as highlighting the

17 issue of youth gun violence. That's 6:00

18 p.m., Chew Playground. This is my 12th

19 year doing it. We've been very

20 consistent on our mission of Peace Not

21 Guns.

22 Thank you very much, Council

25 Absolutely, Councilman. Thank you for

3       a man of the people in your community. I  
4       appreciate that so much.

5           The Chair recognizes Councilman  
6       Green.

7           COUNCILMAN GREEN: Thank you,  
8       Council President. I want to echo the  
9       comments of Councilman Johnson in  
10      reference to welcoming everybody back to  
11      Council. I want to commend my fellow  
12      colleagues in Council being proactive and  
13      addressing a lot of the issues that  
14      impact our city.

15           In that same vein, I want to  
16      remind people that tomorrow, 10 o'clock  
17      in the Public Health and Human Services  
18      Committee chaired by Councilwoman Bass,  
19      we will be having hearings on the impact  
20      of medical marijuana as it comes to the  
21      City of Philadelphia. Like some of the  
22      initiatives that other members of Council  
23      are working on, we need to be more  
24      proactive on issues as they come to  
25      impact the City.

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2 The state right now is  
3 currently drafting regulations on medical  
4 marijuana. About half of the states in  
5 the union have medical marijuana. That  
6 was a conversation I had during the  
7 summer at the National League of Cities  
8 conference. So as opposed to waiting and  
9 being reactive and waiting to see how the  
10 regulations will impact Philadelphia,  
11 tomorrow is the first step in having a  
12 conversation regarding this issue so we  
13 can be proactive in reference to this  
14 issue and also start to inform the public  
15 what type of impact medical marijuana may  
16 have in the City of Philadelphia. So I  
17 welcome all those in the audience and  
18 those who may be listening to come out to  
19 a hearing tomorrow at 10 o'clock.

20 Thank you.

22 Thank you so much, Councilman.

23 The Chair recognizes  
24 Councilwoman Parker. And happy birthday.

25 COUNCILWOMAN PARKER: Thank

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2 you. Thank you, Mr. President. I just  
3 wanted to for the record say a hearty  
4 thanks to our colleague Councilman Jones  
5 for his leadership with MED Week. I  
6 thank you for the very kind invitation to  
7 allow me to participate and join with you  
8 this year. Your kindness doesn't go  
9 unnoticed, because this is an important  
10 issue, but you've been at it a lot longer  
11 than I. So I just needed to state that  
12 for the record.

13 I also, Council President,  
14 wanted to echo your sentiments in regard

17 before he had the term "honorable" before  
18 his name, and I wanted to just note that  
19 for the record.

20 And although, Councilman, I  
21 will not be able to attend, I will have  
22 some community organizers from my  
23 district there and they will be watching  
24 Jones judge, how you structured it, and  
25 we will be trying to duplicate what

3 So I just needed to state that for the  
4 record.

5 Thank you, Mr. President.

9 there's a rule that I'm not supposed to  
10 make speeches from here. So I think this  
11 is a little different, though. I just  
12 wanted to promote something that's very

15 And as you all know, I grew up, born and  
16 raised in Strawberry Mansion.

17 (Applause.)

19 I got to tell you, we are going to have  
20 some of the best old-school bands out  
21 there. So it will be the battle of the  
22 bands. Come on out, hear some good  
23 music, some good food, and it's a great

8 to do a 5K, it's a pretty interesting
