15 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

16 Thank you. It has been moved and
17 properly seconded that the Journal of the
18 meeting of Thursday, September, 8th, 2016
19 stand approved.

20 All those in favor say aye.

21 (Aye.)

22 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

23 Those opposed?

24 (No response.)

25 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The

11 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
12 Chair thanks the gentleman.

13 The Chair now recognizes
14 Councilman O'Neill.

15 COUNCILMAN O'NEILL: Thank you,
16 Mr. President. On behalf of the
17 republicans, there are no requests for
18 leave of absence.

19 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
20 Chair thanks the gentleman.

21 At this time, I would like to
22 dispense with the regular order of
23 business and I would like to welcome and
24 I really want to thank everyone who has
25 taken time out of their busy day to come

3 action. I hope that your day here is a
4 pleasurable one and a knowledgeable one,
5 and I hope you enjoy it so much that you
6 come back again. So, again, thank you so
7 much for being here today.

8 At this time, the Chair
9 recognizes Councilwoman Quinones-Sanchez,
10 who will present a resolution recognizing
11 Luis Figueroa. Would Mr. Figueroa and
12 those accompanying him please join the
13 Councilwoman at the podium.

14 (Councilmembers and guests
15 approached podium.)

16 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: And
17 joining Councilwoman Quinones-Sanchez, we
18 have Councilman Johnson and Councilman
19 Oh.

20 COUNCILWOMAN SANCHEZ: Good
21 morning, colleagues. It is only fitting
22 as President Obama does his annual
23 recognition of the commencement of
24 Hispanic Month, September 15th through
25 October 16th, that we would be here, we

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2 would kick it off by recognizing an
3 amazing individual who is doing amazing
4 things, not just because he's a young
5 Puerto Rican male, not just because he's
6 very humble, not just because he grew up
7 in the Hunting Park section that I also
8 grew up with, not just because he's from
9 Philadelphia, not just because he's
10 blessed with a wonderful voice, but
11 because he is an ambassador for the City
12 of Philadelphia. And I'm very proud to
13 introduce to some of you a young man that
14 will continue to put Philadelphia on the
15 map, because he's going to do fabulous
16 things.

17 For those of you who don't know
18 him, he has been a singing sensation for
19 many years, and he is a product of
20 Philadelphia public schools and the GAMP
21 program. So we are extremely, extremely
22 proud to have Luisito Figueroa on an
23 international stage, proud of his
24 Philadelphia roots, proud of his Puerto
25 Rican roots. And he is joined here by

2 his mother, and when we finish the
3 presentation, he can speak to how
4 Philadelphia has shaped him and for us to
5 recognize him today and thank him. For
6 the ambassador role that he takes for
7 Philadelphia for me is really an honor.

8 I had an opportunity to catch
9 up with him. I know him since he was
10 very young. He is off in a couple of
11 months to film the Latino version of
12 Empire, another Philadelphia-based show.
13 He is going to be filming in Mexico, and
14 he has an incredible role to play in that
15 series. And his mother is worried about
16 him being in Mexico, and I'm saying, hey,
17 he's on a national, international stage
18 and we're very proud of him, and we look
19 forward to the series coming out. It
20 will be sponsored by Telemundo. So we
21 know that it's going to take him to a
22 total other level.

23 So I'm very, very, very proud,
24 because he is an amazing and humble young
25 man. And I think at a time when our men

3 look up to, this is one of those men.
4 God-fearing, very good Puerto Rican
5 values. So I'm very, very proud of him.

6 So recognizing, congratulating,
7 and honoring Luis Figueroa on being named
8 the 2016 Premios Juventud Winner.

9 Whereas, Luis Figueroa, born in
10 Philadelphia to musically talented Puerto
11 Rican parents, is a singer-songwriter,
12 YouTube sensation with over 3.2 million
13 views -- you can look him up --
14 all-around entertainer; and

15 Whereas, at age four, Luis
16 began his artistic journey, performing in
17 schools, churches, at various events
18 around the country, capturing the
19 attention of audiences and leaving them
20 in awe after every performance. Always
21 had an incredible stage presence.

22 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Whereas,
23 Luis' musical career first sprouted when
24 he performed at the International Latin
25 Music Hall of Fame in New York alongside

2 major Latin singers like Johnny Albino,
3 Joe Cuba, and Graciela. Luis was later
4 selected to perform on the
5 internationally recognized evening show
6 "Sabado Gigante" hosted by Don Francisco;
7 and

8 Whereas, in 2003, Luis sang on
9 the wildly-viewed television program
10 "Star Search" alongside contestant David
11 Archuleta and made it to the finals. In
12 July 2005, he held the title Teen Idol in
13 Philadelphia Lights of Liberty Show; and

14 Whereas, after performing with
15 salsa pioneer Johnny Rivera, an
16 opportunity arose for Luis to sing on a
17 salsa album titled "Transito", produced
18 by Marc Anthony and Angel Fernandez, with
19 famous salsa artists including Rey
20 Sepulveda, Tito Allen, and Johnny Rivera.
21 Figuerola performed "Esta Cobardia" on the
22 album; and

23 COUNCILMAN OH: Whereas, in
24 2007, Luis was a Top 40 finalist on
25 American Idol. Luis graduated from the

2 Girard Academic Music Program and went on
3 to further his musical career at Berklee
4 College of Music in Boston, where he was
5 selected each year out of hundreds of
6 students to perform in Berklee's Singers
7 Showcase, the biggest vocal show at the
8 college; and

9 Whereas, this year Figueroa
10 received a Premios Juventud award for his
11 cover of "Flor Palida", which he later
12 performed at the award show alongside
13 Marc Anthony; and

14 Whereas, Luis Figueroa has
15 recently been signed with Marc Anthony's
16 entertainment company, Magnus Media, for
17 an exclusive production deal. Luis has
18 been a role model and an inspiration for
19 the Latino community throughout the City
20 of Philadelphia and nationwide due to his
21 tremendous accomplishments; therefore, be
22 it

23 COUNCILWOMAN SANCHEZ:

24 Resolved, by the Council of the City of
25 Philadelphia, we herby recognize,

2 congratulate, honor, and thank Luis on
3 being named the 2016 Premios Juventud
4 Winner.

5 And we further resolve that a
6 copy of this resolution is presented to
7 him as sincere evidence of our respect
8 and admiration of this legislative body.

10 (Applause.)

11 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
12 Chair recognizes Mr. Figueroa for
13 remarks.

14 MR. FIGUEROA: Hello. Good
15 morning, and thank you. I'm speechless
16 to be back in Philadelphia after so many
17 years of living in Los Angeles and
18 traveling the world. It's been a
19 whirlwind of a year for me, and to be
20 recognized by my city is one of the
21 things that I never really imagined. So
22 thank you guys for being here this
23 morning. Thank you for sharing this
24 award with me, this resolution. And this
25 one is for the City.

10 present a resolution honoring Lolly
11 Galvin. Would Ms. Galvin and those
12 accompanying her please join the
13 Councilman at the podium.

14 (Councilmembers and guests
15 approached podium.)

16 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: And
17 joining Councilman Domb, we have
18 Councilwoman Blackwell, Councilwoman Gym,
19 and Councilman Henon.

20 COUNCILMAN DOMB: Today we are
21 honoring and recognizing Lolly Galvin and
22 the "Philly Street Cuts" project, which
23 offers free haircuts to people
24 experiencing homelessness in
25 Philadelphia.

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2 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL:

3 Whereas, Lolly Galvin is the founder of
4 the Dignity Project, through which she
5 raised \$14,000 to travel to fourteen U.S.
6 cities with friend Nicole LePera, to
7 deliver "dignity bags" filled with
8 toiletries and necessities for the
9 homeless; and

10 Whereas, now, back in
11 Philadelphia, Ms. Galvin wanted to help
12 people on her own streets and has teamed
13 up with local hairstylists Em Breslin,
14 Alicia Loughery, Dana DiGuisseppe and
15 Jennifer Louise to offer free haircuts to
16 people experiencing homelessness and to
17 help them transform these individuals
18 right where they are located; and

19 COUNCILWOMAN GYM: Whereas, the
20 idea for Philly Street Cuts resulted from
21 the discovery of Mark Bustos, a
22 hairstylist who provided haircuts in New
23 York to New York's homeless population;
24 and

25 Whereas, the Philly Street Cuts

2 project has generated such a positive
3 buzz around the City that Ms. Galvin has
4 been contacted by enough stylists
5 offering their services, that haircuts
6 could be given 24 hours a day; and

7 Whereas, Ms. Galvin uses the
8 hashtag "PhillyStreetCuts" to help spread
9 the word of the project and uses before
10 and after photos to show the positive
11 impact that the haircuts are making for
12 each individual; and

13 COUNCILMAN HENON: Whereas,
14 "The whole thing is simple, but that's
15 what people overlook," Ms. Galvin said.
16 "It's a silent statement of what you can
17 do for a stranger. I want people to see
18 a demonstration of humanity"; now,
19 therefore, be it

20 Resolved, that the Council of
21 the City of Philadelphia hereby honors
22 and recognizes Lolly Galvin and the
23 "Philadelphia Street Cuts" project, which
24 offers free haircuts to people
25 experiencing homelessness in

2 Philadelphia.

3 (Applause.)

4 COUNCILMAN DOMB: I just want
5 to say, though, for the record, for
6 myself when I get a haircut, it's like
7 one-third of the normal price because I
8 don't have that much hair.

9 (Laughter.)

10 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
11 Chair recognizes Ms. Galvin for remarks.

12 MS. GALVIN: Well, thank you,
13 everyone. I really appreciate it, and I
14 want to thank the people on stage with me
15 who are very selfless and go out with me
16 and do this and are dedicated, and we're
17 staying in Philadelphia to give. So
18 thank all of you.

19 (Applause.)

16 body an ordinance authorizing the
17 revision of lines and grades on a portion
18 of City Plan No. 246 by striking from the
19 City Plan and vacating the legally open
20 portion of Saybrook Street from 45th
21 Street to Melville Street and striking
22 from the City Plan 45th Street from
23 Woodland Avenue to Linmore Street; and

24 An ordinance authorizing the
25 revision of lines and grades on a portion

2 of City Plan No. 327 by striking from the
3 City Plan Herschel Road from Peyton
4 Street to Priestly Street; and

5 An ordinance authorizing the
6 Commissioner of Public Property to
7 acquire fee simple title or a lesser
8 interest such as an easement, by
9 purchase, condemnation or otherwise, in
10 parcels of land along the Delaware River
11 and the Delaware River Trail connecting
12 to Penn Treaty Park; and

13 An ordinance authorizing the
14 Bond Committee to sell bonds at public or
15 private negotiated sale, to provide funds
16 toward various capital municipal
17 purposes; providing for appropriations to
18 the Sinking Fund Commission for the
19 payment of such bonds; authorizing
20 agreements to provide credit or payment
21 or liquidity sources for the bonds in
22 connection with issuance of the bonds,
23 and certain other actions; and

24 An ordinance amending Chapter
25 19-1400 of The Philadelphia Code,

2 entitled "Realty Transfer Tax," by
3 closing certain loopholes, including by
4 amending the definition of "value" as it
5 relates to acquired real estate
6 companies, the definitions of "real
7 estate company" and "acquired real estate

10 Commissioner of Public Property to accept
11 an assignment of an easement agreement
12 pertaining to property along the Delaware
13 River bounded by North Delaware Avenue,
14 Penn Treaty Park, the Delaware River and
15 Shackamaxon Street (extended to the
16 Delaware River), commonly known as 1143
17 through 51 Delaware Avenue, all under
18 certain terms and conditions.

24 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL: Thank
25 you, Mr. President. I would like to

9 Thank you. All those in favor of --
10 Councilwoman, you want to --

11 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL: Yes.

12 Thank you, Mr. President. This is KOZ
13 zone, a very, very difficult matter this
14 morning. All of us -- I don't know
15 anybody who doesn't want development in
16 their district or in their city. I don't
17 know anyone who doesn't want a KOZ,
18 Keystone Opportunity Zone, consideration
19 for all that it implies, city and state,
20 in our district.

21 However, I'm asking to amend
22 this for certain bills today so that we
23 don't hold up all the legislation next
24 week because of the fact -- I'm grateful
25 to represent, Mr. President, my district.

2 We have a lot of development going on,
3 but experience is the best teacher.

4 We're told -- we haven't seen it, but
5 we're told all of the sudden today,
6 because I've been working on this all
7 morning, calling around on it, that there
8 is inclusion in numbers with regard to
9 Wexford and certainly Drexel University.

10 We have found, however, many of you were
11 here two years ago when we did University
12 City High School and we tore it down and
13 at the same time we did a hotel at 33rd
14 and Chestnut. Well, the record shows two
15 years later that they didn't do inclusion
16 on 33rd and Chestnut, and I am afraid to
17 take the chance to not have inclusion on
18 these major projects. And I also want
19 all my institutions to know, no matter
20 how much I love them, we have to make
21 sure that people in our area are not
22 gentrified and that they feel they have a
23 chance for jobs on all of these major
24 projects that exist.

25 And so, therefore, we want to

2 amend this. I understand that this may
3 be held up, and I understand that next
4 spring they'd get another chance, so
5 hopefully we won't hurt them, but I want
6 all my institutions to know we're serious
7 about inclusion. We are serious about
8 people in our area working on these jobs,

10 this is the day, this is the time and
11 we're there.

12 So I move for its adoption.

15 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL: Thank
16 you.

17 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

18 You're welcome.

19 Mr. Decker, please read any
20 other bills on the First Reading Calendar

22 CHIEF CLERK: Bill No. 160612,

25 COUNCILMAN HENON: Thank you,

13 COUNCILMAN HENON:

14 Mr. President, I'd like to make a
15 correction on the record. 160330 is not
16 being called up. It is being amended by
17 the sponsor of the bill today.

18 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

19 Thank you, Councilman.

20 Before considering these
21 resolutions and bills on the Final
22 Passage Calendar today, we will have our
23 public comment session. It will go as
24 follows:

25 If you are interested in

19 CHIEF CLERK: Reverend Walter
20 Barnes, commenting on 160747.

21 (Witness approached podium.)

22 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good
23 morning.

24 REVEREND BARNES: Good morning,
25 Mr. President and to all the members of

2 City Council. As stated, my name is

3 Reverend Walter Barnes, an Associate

4 Minister at the Triumph Baptist Church.

5 And let me pause for a second to extend

6 greeting to all of you the way and the

7 manner that we do at the Triumph Baptist

8 Church, and we do it by saying "victory."

9 I am here today to speak on

10 behalf of our congregation. This year

11 marks a milestone for our path to Pastor

12 James S. Hall, Jr., and we are

13 celebrating him for having preached for

14 65 years, having been pastoring for 64

15 years and pastoring the Triumph Baptist

16 Church for 47 years.

17 Many of you know that Reverend

18 Dr. James S. Hall, Jr. is a Senior Pastor

19 in this city. He's also regarded as an

20 elder statesman throughout our nation,

21 and in his own right, he is a legend.

22 And so we, the members of the Triumph

23 Baptist Church, we feel that he deserves

24 recognition in a visible highly and

25 memorable way that acknowledges and

2 rewards him for his services across the
3 years that he has rendered in the
4 Nicetown-Tioga community and the City of
5 Philadelphia at large. And for those
6 reasons, we ask all of you for your
7 unanimous support on this resolution.

8 I'd also like to thank
9 Councilwoman Cindy Bass for having
10 introduced this resolution.

11 Thank you very much for this
12 time, and God bless you.

13 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
14 Thank you for your testimony, sir.
15 (Applause.)

16 CHIEF CLERK: Bob Bundgo,
17 commenting on 160659 and 160365.

18 (Witness approached podium.)

19 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good
20 morning, sir.

21 MR. BURGE: My name is Bob
22 Burge.

23 I support Mr. Oh and Mrs. Gym's
24 audit. We need to audit all our
25 departments, and it's a good start with

2 starting with the parking, but we need to
3 do that to all our departments, and I
4 commend the Councilman for doing that.

5 The other bill that I'm going
6 to talk about is the one that we need to
7 really address, because our neighborhoods
8 are getting trashed. We need to put some
9 new laws into effect about getting this
10 garbage and these abandoned houses taken
11 care of. Our neighborhoods deserve more
12 things. We need to get these property
13 owners to take care of their properties,
14 and the City Council has to start there,
15 to get these out-of-state people that own
16 these properties -- there's a lot of
17 out-of-state people own these properties
18 and they just don't care about them, and
19 I'd like the commercial about stop
20 trashing Philadelphia. And that's not
21 just the property owners; that's the
22 people on the streets.

23 There's a lot of streets in the
24 City of Philadelphia, a lot -- and you
25 wouldn't believe up in Northeast where

2 I'm residing right now, there's a lot of
3 trash on those streets. People don't
4 care. We need to start caring about our
5 neighborhoods and our streets and start
6 making the City a part of caring about
7 our city and how we affect -- be part of
8 the solution, not the problem, and stop
9 trashing Philadelphia.

10 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

11 Thank you for your testimony, sir.

12 CHIEF CLERK: Bob Previdi,
13 commenting on 160744.

14 (Witness approached podium.)

15 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good
16 morning.

17 MR. PREVIDI: Good morning,
18 Council President. My name is Bob
19 Previdi. I'm with the Bicycle Coalition
20 of Greater Philadelphia. For the last
21 year and a half, I've been working with
22 the Bicycle Coalition on Vision Zero, a
23 concept to try to reduce the number of
24 crashes in the City. We've been working
25 closely with the Administration, and

2 towards that effort, we have been
3 lobbying in Harrisburg with Channabel
4 Latham-Morris. Her son tragically died
5 this past April in a crash on Market
6 Street. She wanted to lobby for some
7 legislative change. We did that. We
8 lobbied for the red light extension for
9 the cameras on Roosevelt Boulevard, but
10 Roosevelt Boulevard needs a little bit
11 more. We've been working with AAA and
12 we've held a forum with the Insurance
13 Institute of Highway Safety.

14 Roosevelt Boulevard the last
15 five years, according to PennDOT, has
16 3,000 crashes, nearly 3,800 people
17 injured, and 51 fatalities. It's a
18 roadway that needs more help, and there
19 is technology out there to help it.
20 We've been working very closely and I
21 thank Councilman Al Taubenberger and
22 Representative John Taylor, who is having
23 a hearing here in this room tomorrow at
24 10 o'clock. You're all invited. We're
25 going to try to get speed cameras for the

2 Roosevelt Boulevard and finally try to
3 set a new tone for that roadway.

4 And I thank you for your time.

9 (Witness approached podium.)

10 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good
11 morning.

12 MR. DANIHEL: Good morning.
13 Here again.

14 Ignorance is not bliss.
15 Deplorable is how the people, your boss,
16 are being treated by their employees,
17 which are you. As people chauffeur, you
18 did not nor will you ever own the
19 people's car. In this representative
20 form of government, you in Council must
21 vote the people's will and, if they ask,
22 must produce evidence to back up the way
23 you vote. Accountability and
24 transparency are paramount.

25 Deplorable is the attitude that

2 the government agents and agencies know
3 better and fail to listen to the
4 sovereign people. Possibly criminal is
5 your inaction after being duly informed
6 multitudes of times of possible
7 violations of 42 USC 1982, 1983, 1985,
8 1986, Fourth and Fifth Amendments of the
9 Constitution and others unnamed. Your
10 stone-cold silence makes one want to
11 provide hearing aids so that you can hear
12 the people's cries.

13 After 1038 West Wyoming was
14 taken without compensation, possibly
15 stolen, then no trial was allowed, lack
16 of due process, transferred by the
17 Sheriff at the request of the
18 Redevelopment Authority of Philadelphia,
19 all without proper notice served. Your
20 response should be to audit, stop doing
21 business with any and all agencies until
22 such time as they can demonstrate that no
23 laws were violated.

24 No home, no payment, no jury
25 trial is egregious. Your continued

2 behavior of avoidance is very egregious.
3 Shut the RDA, the Sheriff, and the Law
4 Department down until a proper

19 CHIEF CLERK: A resolution

20 calling on the General Assembly of the

21 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to support

22 House Bill 2233 of the 2015-'16 session,

23 currently before the Committee on

24 Transportation, which amends Title 75 of

25 the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes

3 devices and providing for a pilot program

6 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
7 Chair recognizes Councilman Taubenberger.

8 COUNCILMAN TAUBENBERGER: Thank
9 you, Mr. President. I'd like to thank my
10 co-sponsors, Councilman O'Neill,
11 Councilman Henon, Councilman Johnson, and
12 Councilwoman Parker, and I move for the
13 adoption of the resolution.

14 (Duly seconded.)

15 COUNCILMAN OH: Council
16 President, can I be heard on that
17 resolution?

18 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
19 Sure. The Chair recognizes Councilman
20 Oh.

21 COUNCILMAN OH: Thank you very
22 much. First of all, I did stop by to see
23 Councilman Taubenberger and applaud his
24 actions on behalf of public safety. It's
25 a very serious issue, and I know that all

2 the Councilmembers involved are
3 interested in protecting lives first. I
4 do understand that.

5 The issue that I've raised in
6 requesting that this resolution be tabled
7 until after tomorrow, we do have a
8 hearing at 10 o'clock. Unfortunately I
9 did look at my calendar and I'm not
10 available, but I will be communicating
11 with the bill sponsor, State
12 Representative John Taylor, because as it
13 is right now, whenever a speeding
14 violation issued by the City of
15 Philadelphia or the State Police, the
16 City gets 50 percent of the ticket, and
17 right now for 2016 to date, we've
18 received \$219,000. We anticipate
19 probably about a half million dollars
20 from those violations.

21 I know this is not about the
22 money, but there is an issue about the
23 money. I think we can have safety and
24 also the revenues that, quite frankly,
25 we've been denied by the state. And

2 we're not getting the money from the
3 state, and there are laws that seem to be
4 coming out of Harrisburg recently that
5 cut into the revenues that we are
6 receiving.

7 I simply would like to raise or
8 notify Philadelphia State Representative
9 John Taylor, who chairs this committee,
10 that our city could really benefit from
11 retaining the 50 percent of these
12 revenues that we do receive. Quite
13 frankly, they could also be identified in
14 his bill for some specific use around
15 safety in Philadelphia if he chose to do
16 so. I don't think anybody would fault
17 him for that. He is a Philadelphia state
18 legislator.

19 The other thing I would say is
20 that when the radar comes in, it will
21 send a bill to everyone who is going
22 above 11 miles per hour above the speed
23 limit. That's fine. But the projections
24 on the revenues that this radar will
25 produce is unknown. It could be quite

2 high. I think, first of all, we want to
3 try any pilot program that will save
4 lives, save accidents, but at the same
5 time, we have a lot of needs in this city
6 that the denial of state funds is
7 actually hurting, and here is a solution
8 to public safety that does not have to
9 deny the City the revenues that typically
10 come to the City and currently do.

11 So I don't want to set a new
12 precedent here with this bill and,
13 therefore, I would ask the sponsor to
14 table it until after tomorrow's hearing.

15 Thank you.

16 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

17 Thank you, Councilman.

18 The Chair recognizes Councilman
19 Taubenberger.

20 COUNCILMAN TAUBENBERGER: Yes.

21 Thank you.

22 And, Councilman Oh, thank you
23 for your visit to my office, but we've
24 also done some research, and the dollars
25 that are generated by handwritten

2 tickets, speeding tickets in the City of
3 Philadelphia, that 50 percent you speak
4 of goes back to the First Judicial
5 District, which I can understand. They
6 target with the hearing enforcement. But
7 also under the legislation that has been
8 proposed, 50 percent also comes back in
9 the form of a grant from PennDOT for road
10 improvement in the City of Philadelphia,
11 very similar to the red light camera,
12 which have also on Roosevelt Boulevard
13 and other jurisdictions have been very
14 successful in curtailing accidents and
15 getting people to drive respectfully and
16 accordingly to the laws that have been
17 set up.

18 I believe this is something
19 that's much needed, and when it all comes
20 down to it, it is about safety and it is
21 a project that actually works, and we
22 need it.

23 Thank you.

24 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

25 Thank you.

2 Councilman, did you need to be
3 recognized again?

4 COUNCILMAN OH: Yeah. I'll
5 just simply clarify that the information
6 I received is from PennDOT. This is the
7 money that -- they list all the
8 jurisdictions in Pennsylvania, and the
9 portion that we've received from --
10 transferred from the State Police since
11 January of this year to June 1st, 2016 is
12 \$219,358.02, and that is money that can
13 go to providing for safer streets. And I
14 do have an issue with the red light
15 camera, and I think we've discussed that.
16 I have an issue with the fact that there
17 are state laws that specifically require
18 or dictate that the money collected from
19 the streets of Philadelphia go to
20 different silos and not to the City of
21 Philadelphia, and that we are still
22 waiting for the money that was promised
23 to the School District and we haven't
24 received that.

25 And so, yeah, there is the

2 choice of the state to make a grant to
3 certain entities, but they don't have to
4 do that, and we are denied those funds.

5 So, again, as with other
6 legislation that seems to target
7 Philadelphia and take the revenues that
8 we would otherwise receive to use for
9 public safety and other things, I
10 certainly would like the opportunity for
11 us to communicate to the bill sponsor to
12 seek an amendment before we all vote to
13 support that bill.

14 Thank you.

15 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

18 that the Councilman is prepared to hold

9 that you can give it to. But more
10 importantly, we have a CD. It's a CD
11 that consists of 14 original songs
12 written and performed by some of the
13 winners of PHL LIVE, and they range from
14 gospel to hip-hop, to folk music, to
15 rock. And, again, these are our local
16 artists. We wish them well. They're an
17 important part of our creative economy
18 and our economic future.

19 Thank you very much.

20 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

21 Thank you, Councilman.

22 And on the part of the
23 majority, the Chair recognizes Councilman
24 Henon.

25 COUNCILMAN HENON: Thank you,

2 Council President.

3 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Oh,
4 I'm sorry. Hold on, Councilman. I
5 didn't see. Councilman Taubenberger.

6 COUNCILMAN TAUBENBERGER: Yes.
7 I am part of the minority and --

8 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: I'm
9 sorry.

10 COUNCILMAN TAUBENBERGER: I'd
11 just like to have a word. I don't always
12 push the button.

13 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
14 You've been taking some liberal votes
15 here lately. I don't know.

16 (Laughter.)

17 COUNCILMAN TAUBENBERGER: I
18 just wanted to thank my colleagues for
19 the support of the speed camera
20 resolution, but I also would like to
21 invite them to the state Transportation
22 Committee hearing, which is in these
23 Chambers tomorrow at 10:00 a.m., and it
24 is -- after much discussion with a lot of
25 folks, speed cameras on Roosevelt

2 Boulevard can be a great tool. The speed
3 cameras have worked in many other cities,
4 particularly Washington, DC, to reduce
5 speeds and car crashes.

6 And I want to thank my
7 colleagues for letting us use the
8 Chambers, and a special thanks to Mike
9 Decker for helping to arrange this. This
10 is an opportunity for anyone who wants to
11 speak on this issue or want some
12 amendments to be here or send their
13 communication. That is here tomorrow
14 under the leadership of Chairman John
15 Taylor, and that's here at 10:00 a.m.
16 tomorrow to talk about this and take
17 public testimony.

18 Council President, thank you
19 very much for my time.

20 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

21 Thank you, Councilman.

22 The Chair now recognizes
23 Councilman Henon, speeches on the part of
24 the majority.

25 COUNCILMAN HENON: Thank you,

2 Council President. I will always be glad
3 to defer to somebody that's going to
4 compliment our Chief Clerk, because you
5 don't want to upset him when it comes to
6 this body's process.

7 But today not just myself but
8 along with other members co-introduced
9 and co-sponsored a resolution that's
10 calling on the General Assembly to amend
11 the Pennsylvania Construction Code Act to
12 exempt the cities of the first class,
13 which is obviously just the City of
14 Philadelphia and our Commonwealth, and
15 for those cities to adopt their own
16 construction codes.

17 In 1999, the Commonwealth
18 created Pennsylvania Construction Code
19 Act. It used to be called the UCC, and
20 politics interfered with good policies,
21 which now has interfered with our ability
22 for enforcement, and there's a cost to
23 that. And with the kinds of construction
24 and gentrification and the expansion of
25 all our neighborhoods, I think it's

2 important that we attempt to exempt the
3 cities of the first class from that so we
4 can adopt our own codes.

5 Currently, we are -- well, in
6 an attempt to streamline our uniform
7 building codes across the state. We're
8 trying to fix that, and we can do that if
9 we are simply exempted from that.

10 We are operating off of the
11 2009 Construction Code. That means all
12 the codes across the Commonwealth of
13 Pennsylvania. We are operating --
14 because it's uniformed. We are operating
15 off of 2009. The next time we'll be able
16 to adopt any kind of code, it will be
17 2017. We just went through -- you
18 appointed a special committee on
19 demolition. We've had this construction
20 boom. Permits are up. People are going
21 to work. We're looking at KOZ
22 legislations, and we have our code
23 enforcements with old tools. I mean, our
24 code enforcements, our L&I instructors
25 are taking certifications to get up to

2 date in our energy codes. We're passing
3 energy codes here. Blondell,
4 Councilwoman, our colleague Councilwoman
5 Blondell Reynolds Brown, has done amazing
6 work with energy. We have the Committee
7 of Energy, and we can't even enforce our
8 new energy codes. We can't enforce our
9 new fire codes for our first responders
10 and public safety under the 2009 code.

11 I'm stressing this with a
12 little sense of urgency to ask the state
13 Legislature to understand that
14 Philadelphia is uniquely positioned as a
15 city of the first class and be allowed to
16 be exempt from that so we can adopt
17 better, safer practices, more energy
18 efficiency practices. And as we
19 appropriate on these never-ending cutting
20 budgets as we have over the last decade
21 or so, not to cut our -- continue to cut
22 the budgets for L&I and give our first
23 responders, our L&I inspectors the tools
24 instead of -- I mean, just imagine this.
25 We're operating off of 2009 codes. You

2 have inspectors who are being certified,
3 and we have great inspectors who are
4 certified up-to-date codes that are
5 adopted nationally everywhere else and
6 approved by national associations.
7 Instead they have to go out and get five
8 books and know five different codes and
9 regulations and energy codes. It makes
10 no sense.

11 So I'm asking -- I want to
12 thank this body for its attention, and
13 I'm urging the General Assembly and our
14 Governor to please exempt the city of
15 first class, Philadelphia, to adopt its
16 own uniform construction code.

17 So thank you.

18 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

19 Thank you, Councilman.

20 The Chair recognizes Councilman
21 Johnson.

22 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Thank you,
23 Council President. Just two brief
24 announcements. One, last evening we had
25 an opportunity to host a Stop the

2 Violence basketball game with members of
3 an organization actually from your
4 district, Council President, by the name
5 of the Bomb Squad. They brought about 60
6 or 70 young people from North
7 Philadelphia to South Philadelphia, and
8 it was the North Philly versus South
9 Philly Stop the Violence basketball game,
10 which South Philadelphia won. We won,
11 but it was a real inspiring and
12 encouraging experience, because in the
13 midst of the shootings that we read every
14 evening on the 11 o'clock news, there are
15 people who are on the ground who are foot
16 soldiers doing the hard work to address
17 this issue of youth gun violence.

18 So I want to make sure that we
19 as a body, we as a city continue to keep
20 this as a priority. Because I'll always
21 recognize that in order for us to move
22 forward as one city, everybody progress
23 moving forward, we have to make sure we
24 find ways to address the issue of youth
25 gun violence, and for those young men who

2 decide to pick up guns and who do not
3 want to do the right thing based upon
4 their choices, then they have to be dealt
5 in the appropriate manner. But there are
6 young people and there are community
7 leaders who are out there advocating and
8 fighting a good fight to make sure our
9 neighborhoods are safe. And so that was
10 a good experience.

11 And last Friday some
12 Councilmembers came down for our annual
13 Peace Not Guns memorial basketball game.
14 And, again, these are organizations that
15 are on the ground doing the hard work to
16 make sure all of us are safe.

17 And so that's where my head is
18 at in terms of making sure our
19 neighborhoods are safe and continue
20 pushing that agenda aggressively.

21 Following up on what Councilman
22 Curtis Jones talked about, acknowledging
23 the Lutheran Settlement House, who will
24 be hosting their Men Can rally, speaking
25 out against domestic violence, that's

2 going to take place on October the 5th.
3 And I thank Council President -- I mean
4 Councilman Curtis Jones for introducing
5 that resolution. As a follow-up, on
6 October the 8th, I'll be hosting my
7 second annual 5K walk/run against
8 domestic violence at FDR Park.
9 Councilman Derek Green is also partnering
10 with me. So if any of my colleagues who
11 have an interest in this issue want to
12 sign up a team, please contact my office
13 and come and take a walk for a very
14 important issue. And that's October the
15 8th at FDR Park, our second annual 5K
16 walk/run against domestic violence.

17 Thank you very much, Council
18 President.

19 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
20 Thank you, Councilman. Thank you for
21 your continued good work.

22 The Chair recognizes
23 Councilwoman Parker.

24 COUNCILWOMAN PARKER: Thank
25 you, Mr. President. I just wanted to

2 take this opportunity to thank my
3 partners, Reverend Dr. Alyn Waller, the
4 entire Enon Tabernacle Baptist Church
5 family, Future Minds, and State
6 Representatives Tonyelle Cook-Artis as we
7 all join together to sponsor the 9th
8 annual College Vocational and Labor
9 Information Fair taking place this
10 Saturday, September the 17th at Enon
11 Tabernacle Baptist Church located at 2800
12 West Cheltenham Avenue.

13 When we started organizing this
14 event nine years ago, we recognized that
15 not every child who is interested, every
16 parent who is raising a child or
17 grandparent who is raising a child has
18 the ability to write a check for tuition.
19 And we also recognize that not all of our
20 young people are interested in attending
21 a traditional college or a university,
22 and that is when we included the
23 vocational and the labor aspect to our
24 fair.

25 We are proud that it has turned

2 out to be one of the largest events that
3 I've hosted in my ten-year career as a
4 member of the Pennsylvania House. The
5 staff has instructed me to say for the
6 record that the scholarship information
7 guide that we distributed will be
8 distributed on a first come, first served
9 basis. So while we start at 11 o'clock,
10 if you make it in the door at 1:59 and we
11 do not have any scholarship books
12 available, please note that they're there
13 on a first come, first served basis.

14 I thank my partners, and I'm
15 really looking forward to it.

16 Thank you, Mr. President.

17 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

18 Thank you, Councilwoman. Good work.

19 The Chair recognizes
20 Councilwoman Bass.

21 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Thank you,
22 Mr. President.

23 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

24 You're welcome.

25 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: I wanted to

2 also thank you, Councilman Greenlee, and
3 also Councilwoman Blondell Reynolds Brown
4 for coming out to our bill signing
5 earlier this week around the nuisance
6 business bill, which we're really excited
7 about, because we think that it's going
8 to have a major impact in our
9 neighborhoods, particularly around stop
10 and go's, which are a huge problem
11 throughout the City of Philadelphia,
12 where businesses conduct a number of
13 activities or allow a number of
14 activities to be conducted outside the
15 doors of their property, of their
16 business, and really step back and say,
17 Well, there's nothing I can do about it,
18 or I told them to leave and they won't go
19 and, you know, all sorts of things that
20 basically say there's nothing that they
21 can do about the situation that occurs
22 right outside their doors. But I would
23 say, as I've said before, I'm responsible
24 for what's happening on my sidewalk at my
25 home, as are all of us and as they are as

2 well, and recognizing that there is a
3 connection between the way you conduct
4 your business and the traffic and
5 activity that is as a result of that
6 business.

7 But one other thing that I just
8 wanted to mention briefly that happened
9 late last week that I don't know if it
10 got as much attention as I would like for
11 it to get is work that was done by the
12 City of Philadelphia's Health Department
13 and its Commissioner, Commissioner
14 Farley, around smoking and the impact of
15 smoking in low-income neighborhoods and
16 that there's actually action being taken
17 by the Health Department and by the
18 City's Board of Health to address this
19 issue, because Philadelphia has 3,455
20 active tobacco retailers, more than
21 double the number per capita as
22 Washington, DC, Chicago, San Francisco,
23 New York, and Los Angeles. And I think
24 that that's really something that we need
25 to be paying attention to, because these

2 tobacco retailers are much more likely to
3 be into low-income and minority
4 neighborhoods.

5 And so there's been an
6 extensive amount of work that's been done
7 by the Health Department to address this
8 issue and that tobacco retailers will no
9 longer be able to establish themselves
10 within 500 feet of a K through 12 school,
11 and also retailers who are cited three
12 times within two years will not be
13 allowed to sell tobacco products for one
14 year, which is similar to our nuisance
15 business bill.

16 All of these things combined
17 really go a long way in terms of making
18 sure that we limit access to young
19 people, underage people, to tobacco
20 products and also that they're not as
21 heavily marketed in our neighborhoods as
22 they are right now.

23 So I just wanted to really
24 commend the Health Department and the
25 City's Board of Health for all of their

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2 work on this as we continue to work on
3 these nuisance business issues.

4 Thank you, Mr. President.

5 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

6 Thank you, Councilwoman. And, again,
7 great bill you passed.

8 The Chair recognizes Councilman
9 Green.

10 COUNCILMAN GREEN: Thank you,
11 Council President. This week, as many of
12 you have probably read in the papers in
13 reference to the rise in income not only
14 in the City of Philadelphia but across
15 the Commonwealth and the nation, but
16 poverty is still a major issue in this
17 city. Our President was here in
18 Philadelphia for a rally and talked about
19 poverty as part of his remarks, and
20 sometimes when we forget, although
21 poverty is one of our probably number one
22 issues in the City, that we already have
23 a roadmap to address poverty in our city.
24 And when I talk about that roadmap, we
25 forget about the legacy of Reverend Leon

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2 Sullivan.

3 And so it was an honor to be
4 with you, Council President, as well as
5 Councilman Oh and Senator Kitchen and
6 State Representative Dwight Evans
7 yesterday for a historical marker that
8 was placed at Progress Plaza
9 acknowledging the legacy and history of
10 my fraternity brother, Reverend Leon
11 Sullivan, for all the work he has done.
12 And we need to remember and to tell our
13 young people and those around us that we
14 do have a way to address poverty, and
15 it's through economic justice and
16 collectively pulling our resources
17 together, and that's what he did as the
18 lion of Zion, and it was a pleasure to be
19 there for that event yesterday at
20 Progress Plaza.

21 I also want to remind people
22 and make an announcement regarding an
23 important conference that will be held
24 this Saturday starting at 10:00 a.m. My
25 good friend Terri Matthews, who is the

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2 founder of Jaden's Voice, will be hosting
3 her first annual autism conference, Is It
4 Only Me, and it's going to be from 10:00
5 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. at the Hilton on City
6 Avenue. And one of the good things about
7 this conference, we will also have a
8 panel of fathers. And recently we
9 learned there was a young man that
10 actually committed suicide who had a
11 child on the autism spectrum, and too
12 often men don't talk about the issue that
13 we deal with as fathers and all the
14 challenges, because we hold that
15 information too much inside.

16 So this panel will be on
17 Saturday. There will be a day-long
18 conference and an opportunity to learn
19 more about the issues of autism for those
20 who may be dealing with autism as a
21 parent or a caregiver or provider, a
22 medical professional or community
23 partner. So I welcome everyone to come
24 out this Saturday from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00
25 p.m. for the first annual Is It Only Me

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2 Autism Conference being hosted by Jaden's
3 Voice at the Hilton on City Avenue.

4 Thank you.

5 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

6 Thank you, Councilman. Good information.

7 The Chair recognizes

8 Councilwoman Gym.

9 COUNCILWOMAN GYM: Thank you

10 very much, Mr. President. I just wanted

11 to thank my colleagues, especially my

12 co-sponsors to Bill No. 160015,

13 Councilmembers Jones, Parker,

14 Quinones-Sanchez, and Johnson, for

15 helping usher through a way of looking

16 and understanding tax incentives in the

17 City. I think Councilmember Green

18 mentioned yesterday's study, which I

19 think was also very important, but it's

20 important to also understand that

21 calculating aggregate wealth in the City

22 may not be the same thing as

23 understanding growing economic

24 inequality. And I think that that's an

25 important aspect to track and not just

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2 look at things in the aggregate.

3 This bill will actually help us
4 understand and will keep us in national
5 best practices and helping us understand
6 how the tax incentives that we use will
7 actually lead to the kinds of quality
8 jobs that we're talking about, even
9 beyond the job creation that we
10 celebrate. And I hope that it will
11 advance our public conversation on just
12 economic development for all
13 Philadelphians by helping bring into open
14 the actual impact of the tools that we're
15 using and maybe help us point our way in
16 more new and innovative directions in the
17 future.

18 So thank you very much to my
19 colleagues for helping me do that and
20 having us do that together.

21 The second thing I wanted to
22 say was, I also wanted to thank my
23 colleagues for the amazing turnout that
24 we had on Monday and Tuesday around the
25 Supreme Court fair funding act or fair

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2 funding case that went before the
3 Pennsylvania Supreme Court. I think it
4 was the first time that we've had a
5 chance to put forth this question of
6 whether Pennsylvania is doing its due
7 diligence around fair funding of young
8 people. And the best of Philadelphia did
9 come together on Monday and Tuesday to
10 stand up for Philadelphia students and
11 students all across the state. And I'm
12 incredibly proud to be a member of a body
13 whose actions had been backed up with our
14 words and our promises that we would do
15 right by young people in this city.

16 But we should also be very
17 conscious that the state put forward a
18 very stark and different argument, one,
19 that education is not a right in
20 Pennsylvania, it is a privilege for some,
21 and that inequity is inevitable and
22 unfixable within the State of
23 Pennsylvania. And in a state with a
24 funding gap between the poorest school
25 districts and the wealthiest school

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2 districts is the largest in the nation,
3 it's a reason why it was so important to
4 have this case go before the court, to
5 have all of us work together to bring new
6 justices to the court who can see this
7 argument through fresh eyes, and
8 hopefully we will work together for what
9 justice actually looks like for young
10 people.

11 So thank you very much to my
12 colleagues for all of that.

13 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

14 Thank you, Councilwoman.

15 The Chair recognizes
16 Councilwoman Quinones-Sanchez.

17 COUNCILWOMAN SANCHEZ: Yes,
18 Council President. Thank you. I just
19 wanted to remind folks that along with
20 the Philadelphia Art Museum, as I
21 mentioned earlier, we are celebrating
22 Mexican Independence Day. There is a
23 really good lunch provided by El Rey
24 after Council, and I ask my colleagues to
25 stop by. With us will be the new Consul

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2 General, Alicia Kerbar Palma, who will be
3 joining us, along with the President and
4 CEO of the Art Museum, Gail Harrity.

5 They have a wonderful exhibit that's
6 coming up at the Museum. Please, as we
7 kick off National Hispanic Month, join us
8 right after Council.

9 Thank you.

10 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

11 Thank you, Councilwoman.

12 The Chair recognizes Councilman
13 Oh.

14 COUNCILMAN OH: Thank you very
15 much, Council President. I wanted to
16 thank Councilwoman Helen Gym for her
17 leadership and activity on fair funding.
18 I do want to emphasize that many times
19 the conversation is fair funding and
20 equity throughout the state, Lower Merion
21 School District versus Philadelphia.
22 However, it is glaringly a problem that
23 in the City of Philadelphia, not in other
24 school districts, not a wealthy suburb,
25 but in the City of Philadelphia the

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2 disparity between schools - resources,
3 money, quality - is criminal.

4 It's a democratic society. A
5 school in one section of our city, a
6 public school, and another public school
7 in another section of our city are
8 starkly different. That has been allowed
9 and permitted to occur under our School
10 District, our Board of Education for
11 decades, mainly centered around race, but
12 around poverty and lack of influence.

13 And so this issue of equity and
14 fairness and equal opportunity for
15 children to have a good education not
16 only applies between our city and rich
17 suburbs, but right here in the City of
18 Philadelphia.

19 Thank you.

20 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

21 Thank you, Councilman.

22 There being no additional
23 speeches, the Chair recognizes
24 Councilwoman Reynolds Brown for a motion
25 to adjourn.

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2 COUNCILWOMAN BROWN: Thank you,
3 Mr. President. I move that City Council
4 stand adjourned until Thursday, September
5 22nd, 2016 at 10:00 a.m.

6 (Duly seconded.)

7 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

8 Thank you. It has been moved and
9 properly seconded that Council stand
10 adjourned until Thursday, September 22nd.

11 All those in favor?

12 (Aye.)

13 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

14 Those opposed?

15 (No response.)

16 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

17 Thank you all very much.
