11 effective management of medication; and

12 COUNCILWOMAN GYM: Whereas,
13 pharmacists have a significant role in
14 assessing patients' medication management
15 and referring them to physicians; and

16 Whereas, the University of the
17 Sciences Philadelphia College of Pharmacy
18 is the first pharmacy college established
19 in North America; and

20 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL:
21 Whereas, the Philadelphia College of
22 Pharmacy Student Society of Health System
23 Pharmacy (PCP SSHP) is a student run
24 organization at the University of the
25 Sciences that was created to make

10 the community with student-provided
11 services, PCP SSHP in partnership with
12 other pharmacy-focused student
13 organizations, including the American
14 Pharmacists Association Academy of
15 Student Pharmacists, from the University
16 of the Sciences are providing a health
17 fair on October 27th, 2016 in the City
18 Hall Courtyard open to all who would like
19 to gain a greater understanding of their
20 health and health choices; now,
21 therefore, be it

13 MR. DORIAN: Hello, everyone.
14 It's great to be here this morning. So,
15 yeah. I just wanted to thank
16 Councilwoman Blackwell so much for
17 allowing us to be here this morning. My
18 name is Chris and I'm here on behalf of
19 the Philadelphia College of Pharmacy
20 Student Society of Health Pharmacy, which
21 is the chapter of the American Society of
22 Health System Pharmacists, and we're
23 advocating for provider status always.
24 That's a big issue. So if you're
25 interested in legislative action, we'd

2 love to go on our website, you check that
3 out.

4 But the message we want to get
5 across here with my colleague, Kevin,
6 from the American Pharmacist Association
7 Academy of Student Pharmacists, what we
8 really want to push across here is that
9 pharmacists are here to provide care. In
10 school the main thing we've learned about
11 is the provision of care and making you
12 healthier and making Philadelphia
13 healthier. We have a wonderful, very
14 large number of health science
15 universities in Philadelphia, like the
16 University of the Sciences, and
17 ultimately our goal as students and our
18 goal as we enter practice is to make the
19 world healthier.

20 We really want to be a resource
21 for you, and we want you to see us as
22 students as a resource for you, and we
23 want you to see your pharmacist as a
24 resource for you. Pharmacists provide
25 care. And with October Pharmacist Month

3 what we're promoting here is know your
4 medicine, know your pharmacist. So if
5 you have a good relationship with your
6 pharmacist, they can really make you
7 healthier, and that's what we're here for

10 MR. PAK: So I just want to say
11 thank you for having us here today. As
12 stated before, pharmacy is the birth
13 place -- birth place is in Philadelphia,
14 not just Philadelphia as our birth place
15 of our nation. Back in 1821, pharmacy
16 was a very different thing. We have a
17 difference in the amount of education,
18 our abilities, and our roles that we play
19 as professionals in the health system.
20 Unfortunately, because of legislation,
21 that's what's holding us back from
22 providing care to the society.

25 profession and so we can help with

17 Anniversary.

18 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
19 Today's Final Passage Calendar.

20 CHIEF CLERK: And a privileged
21 resolution recognizing November 2016 as
22 Pancreatic Cancer Awareness Month in
23 Philadelphia in honor of pancreatic
24 cancer patients, care givers, survivors,
25 and those who have succumbed to the

3 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Also

11 COUNCILMAN JONES: Thank you,

18 CHIEF CLERK: John Cooper,
19 commenting on a resolution introduced by
20 Councilman Oh today.

21 (Witness approached podium.)

22 MR. COOPER: Good morning.

23 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good
24 morning.

25 MR. COOPER: Thank you for

2 having me.

3 Basically I'm here to testify
4 on the IMD exclusion. Basically to keep
5 it short and sweet, Council, anyone in
6 the City is aware of the heroin and
7 opioid epidemic that we have going on.

8 The IMD exclusion is the government -- is
9 being implemented by the government, CMS,
10 Community for Medicaid Services, to cut
11 the federal Medicaid match to the state
12 for drug and alcohol and mental health.

13 In the midst of everyone being
14 aware of the crisis that we're in, to cut
15 treatment in any facility with more than
16 16 beds, I plead with you. It passed in
17 the House yesterday 194 to 0. To urge
18 the President to please intervene and
19 stop this.

20 Basically all I have to say
21 about it.

22 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

23 Thank you so much for your testimony,
24 sir.

25 CHIEF CLERK: Robert Taylor,

3 (Witness approached podium.)

4 MR. TAYLOR: Good morning.

5 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good
6 morning.

7 MR. TAYLOR: Ladies and
8 gentlemen, I'm Robert Taylor, President
9 of Transport Workers Local 700 and WPEB
10 88.1 co-host on the Jasper Jones Show. I
11 am commenting on Resolution 160930
12 calling on SEPTA and the Transport
13 Workers Union 234 to reach a long-term
14 agreement.

15 Naturally, I support this
16 resolution, and I want to thank
17 Councilmembers Johnson, Parker, Domb,
18 Squilla, Sanchez, Blackwell, and Henon
19 for their sponsorship.

20 Indeed, while we pray that a
21 strike can be averted, nevertheless any
22 agreement must protect the rights and
23 livelihood of the SEPTA workforce.

24 I also support Mr. Danihel, who
25 should be up here shortly, in his quest

2 for the protection of property rights,
3 individual rights reform outlined in the
4 great Declaration. As Frederick Douglass
5 said, the principles contained in the
6 Declaration of Independence are saving
7 principles. Stand by those principles.

9 places, and against all foes, whatever
10 the cost.

11 Thank you for your time.

12 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

13 Thank you so much for your testimony,
14 sir.

15 CHIEF CLERK: Pam Africa,
16 commenting on 160923.

17 (Witness approached podium.)

18 MS. AFRICA: Good morning.

19 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good
20 morning.

21 MS. AFRICA: I'd like to thank
22 Councilwoman Jannie Blackwell and Cindy
23 Bass for introducing this resolution, and
24 I'd like to thank the power of the word,
25 WURD 900, for helping to expose the

2 injustices that's happening in the
3 prison.

4 For over a year and a half,
5 I've been investigating the water in the
6 prisons, and, you know, I've been given
7 the runaround for a while. The water
8 inside the prisons -- and I'm speaking
9 especially right now on Graterford, which
10 I have a copy of a newspaper article that
11 talks about the dangers of the water.
12 It's causing cancer, destroying inmates'
13 reproductive organs, and a whole list of
14 things that's happening. And in
15 Graterford Prison, in order for inmates
16 to drink clean water, they got to buy it.

17 In Mahanoy Prison, come to find
18 out that each prisoner is given three
19 cups of water three times a day. The
20 water is black and it's oily, and it's
21 causing dangerous skin diseases and
22 people are also dying from the water.

23 In Frackville Prison, the
24 water -- each inmate is given one gallon
25 of water a day. And this is a war crime.

2 Water is a necessity of life.

3 On 20/20 a few months ago, an
4 inmate as he was coming in and Mr. Wetzel
5 was bringing him through, an inmate ran
6 in front of the camera and he said, an
7 elder, he said, You got to help us. The
8 water smells like goose poop and chlorine
9 bleach. He said, We're dying in here.
10 We're dying from the water. And our
11 inmates in there who have got to wash and
12 clean themselves who have sores and
13 things on them is suffering from this.
14 They can't clean themselves, so they're
15 getting heavily infected. Also it speaks
16 about the diseases in the prisons.

17 I want to especially talk about
18 hepatitis C. Hepatitis C is a disease
19 that affects the liver, and in order for
20 you -- the protocol for the prison is one
21 that states that in order for you to get
22 the hepatitis C cure, you would have to
23 be bleeding from the vessels in your
24 chest. You would have to be bleeding
25 from your esophagus or a majority of your

2 liver would have to be calcified with
3 cirrhosis of the liver. This is a
4 horrible, torturous disease that is
5 happening from the statistics, because I
6 do investigative work. It's up to 7,000
7 inmates who have active hepatitis C. In
8 order for you to get the cure, you would
9 have to be on a list, and the following
10 description that I gave is where you
11 would have to be.

12 I'm concerned because I have a
13 brother named Mumia Abu Jamal in Mahanoy.
14 I have a brother by the name of Eddie
15 Africa, and in the other prisons, I have
16 other inmates and all who have this --
17 that is suffering under this.

18 Ten seconds.

19 Thank you, Councilwoman
20 Blackwell, because she's petitioning
21 Governor Wolf to do something about that.
22 Thank you for the power of the word, WURD
23 900. And long live John Africa for
24 giving us the strength to stand before
25 you.

2 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

3 Thank you so much for your testimony,
4 ma'am.

5 CHIEF CLERK: Joe Danihel,
6 commenting on 160925, 160931, 160929,
7 160935, and 160617.

8 (Witness approached podium.)

9 MR. DANIHEL: Okay. Last week
10 Council honored jurors and jury trials,
11 yet members of this Council, the City of
12 Philadelphia, the Mayor's Office, and
13 others elected to office have opposed my
14 right to trial, jury trial, for the
15 taking without due process or just
16 compensation of my home, 1038 West
17 Wyoming Avenue. Your actions speak
18 louder than your words. Twenty-two years
19 I have suffered at the hands of
20 government.

21 Last week, as in other weeks,
22 during my official decree, members of
23 this government got up and left the room.
24 This is egregious behavior. In my
25 opinion, they were acting like

2 three-year-olds that don't want to listen
3 to alleged crimes committed.

4 Inaction is and of itself a
5 crime. Can a firefighter refuse to fight
6 a fire? Elected leaders are oath and law
7 bound to act.

8 Again, I make an official
9 decree to de-fund and stop using
10 Philadelphia Redevelopment Authority,
11 District Attorney's Office, City
12 Comptroller's Office, and the Sheriff's
13 Department for the illegal transfer of
14 deed and lack of due process in the
15 matter of 1038 West Wyoming Avenue.

16 No just compensation was paid,
17 no jury trial was held, and no legal form
18 authorization to transfer was given by
19 me.

20 I further demand Council ask
21 the Governor, the U.S. Attorney General,
22 and the PA Attorney General's Office to
23 conduct three separate investigations so
24 that criminal charges may be filed for
25 violations of 42 USC 1982, 1983, 1985,

2 and 1986, 18 USC 2381, 2384, the U.S. and
3 PA Constitutions, among others unnamed.

4 I just want to leave you with
5 these parting words. It takes a lot of
6 cooperation to create and allow this
7 level of corruption to exist.

8 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
9 Thank you for your testimony, sir.

10 CHIEF CLERK: Michael
11 Robertson, commenting on 160930.

12 (Witness approached podium.)

13 MR. ROBERTSON: Hello,
14 everybody.

15 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good
16 morning.

17 MR. ROBERTSON: I am sure that
18 everybody in this room would like to see
19 a peaceful resolution to this SEPTA
20 strike and that everybody gets what they
21 want, but on November the 8th, something
22 very important is happening in this
23 country. As we all know, Pennsylvania is
24 a swing state. We all know that
25 Philadelphia is a very important

3 on this election. This SEPTA strike at
4 this time is really a problem. I'm
5 talking about one week. You can wait one
6 week for the most important election in
7 the history of this country.

8 I actually witnessed maybe a
9 week or so ago, I witnessed Councilperson
10 Clarke -- I mean President Clarke speak
11 on the integrity of -- the integrity that
12 we have here in the City as far as
13 elections and absurdity of that being
14 questioned. I may be preaching to the
15 choir, but if anyone in City Council can
16 sit these folks down and say can you
17 please wait for one week, because this is
18 too critical. I'm sure you can last for
19 a week, but this is too important. This
20 can affect people who maybe, you know,
21 live in West Philly and move to Nicetown
22 and still haven't changed their
23 registrations. This can have an impact,
24 and we need every vote.

25 So that's all I have to say.

2 and her efforts, along with yours,
3 Council President, and really all of my
4 colleagues are continually thwarted by
5 some of the things that do happen in
6 Harrisburg around this particular issue.

7 This issue is very damaging to
8 the Commonwealth's largest city,
9 Philadelphia. We need help and we need a
10 partnership on this particular issue.
11 We've been asking on liquor licenses,
12 we've been asking on gun laws. And there
13 is a connection between what happens in
14 our neighborhoods and how these things
15 are happening and, in fact, they've been
16 legalized, often without any sort of
17 public input, any sort of public comment,
18 and they just are happening in our
19 neighborhoods without folks knowing.

20 The latest thing that happened
21 overnight in Harrisburg was that there
22 was a vote taken in the State Senate to
23 amend some alcohol/liquor laws, which
24 would most notably allow beer
25 distributors to now sell smaller

2 quantities of beer, from a six pack to a
3 single can. So now they would be able,
4 if Governor Wolf signs this piece of
5 legislation, they would be able to
6 compete with stop-and-go's that sell
7 single cans of beer and malt liquor. And
8 so the question is, how many of these
9 establishments do we need in our
10 community?

11 As I had mentioned before, I
12 have 26 of these types of establishments,
13 stop-and-go's, in my community, in my
14 district, and this would clearly increase
15 the number of outlets where you would be
16 able to purchase single cans of beer,
17 alcohol. And with this increased
18 continuous exposure and consumption of
19 alcohol among a very vulnerable
20 population, I think that it's time for
21 all of us to call on Governor Wolf to say
22 we need help. We need for him to really
23 look at this piece of legislation and to
24 not sign it.

25 So I would urge that folks

2 would reach out and say we just really
3 cannot absorb any more of this in
4 Philadelphia. We have to understand that
5 Philadelphia is not the same as Cambria
6 County or Potter County. They really
7 have to understand that what we need is
8 so very different from what other folks
9 need. And, again, these stop-and-go's,
10 90 percent of those in my district sell
11 no food. They don't have restrooms
12 available for their customers. They
13 don't have the tables and chairs. All of
14 these are requirements to have their
15 restaurant license, and they don't have
16 any of it.

17 So we need some help on this
18 issue, and I just really want to urge
19 folks to pay attention and to reach out
20 to the Governor's Office as soon as
21 possible.

22 Thank you, Mr. President.

24 Thank you, Councilwoman. Thank you for
25 your diligence on that.

2 I do want to say, Councilwoman,
3 there was some discussion by members of
4 the Philly delegation about addressing
5 some of those issues. So we'll do a
6 follow-up and have a sit-down with them
7 over the next --

8 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Thank you,
9 Mr. President. I did speak with Senator
10 Hughes this morning about his particular
11 issue. So I did want to also acknowledge
12 and thank Senator Hughes, Williams, and
13 Kitchen for standing up and speaking out
14 against this and saying what a
15 detrimental effect it would have here on
16 the City of Philadelphia. So they really
17 clearly get it, and I want to acknowledge
18 them as well.

19 Thank you, Mr. President.

20 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

21 Thank you, Councilwoman. We will be on
22 it.

23 The Chair recognizes
24 Councilwoman Gym.

25 COUNCILWOMAN GYM: Thank you

2 very much, Council President. So last
3 night -- I wanted to bring up two things
4 very briefly, but last night we had an
5 education town hall, thanks to the
6 hosting of Councilman O'Neill and to my
7 colleagues Allan Domb and Councilman
8 Taubenberger for coming out to share in
9 it. And we'll be having another one in
10 November with Councilwoman Blackwell at
11 Paul Robeson High School.

12 But a number of the things that
13 have come out a little bit have been the
14 fact that the school year has opened up
15 with a lot of hopes and promises about
16 where we're going to be in terms of
17 staffing, but we have about 108 teacher
18 vacancies still impacting over 3,000
19 students across the School District. The
20 teacher vacancies, again, impact the fact
21 that we've outsourced our substitutes out
22 to Kelly Services. We are still waiting
23 to see what the fill rates are, but I
24 don't think anyone in this Chamber wants
25 to see a rehashing of what happened last

2 year with the Source4Teachers contract
3 and how thousands of students went to
4 summer school and are receiving
5 compensatory education because they
6 didn't have a teacher in the classroom
7 for the majority of the year.

8 But we still have severe
9 situations of overcrowding and split
10 grades. I would ask that if any of my
11 Council colleagues might reach out to
12 their network schools to find out and get
13 kind of an assessment of what's happening
14 within those schools, with a particular
15 attention to schools that are missing
16 essential core subjects. So Lincoln High
17 School, for example, is missing an
18 English teacher and a biology teacher,
19 and those are tested subjects. Those are
20 mandatory subjects. It's October 18 -- I
21 mean, I'm sorry. It's the end of
22 October, and students need to be in
23 classrooms with a full-time teacher
24 getting their education. School started
25 on September 18th. It's not starting

2 November 1st or any later.

3 So I would just urge my
4 colleagues to continue to reach out. And
5 we're working with the School District to
6 figure out how we're doing it, but at the
7 end of the day, we're over three and a
8 half years without a teachers contract.
9 We've got teachers who have eight years
10 with a Master's Degree earning what they
11 would receive at four years with a
12 Bachelor's, and this situation is pretty
13 untenable. It's been that way for a
14 while, but we need particular attention
15 to the teachers contract. But in the
16 meantime, if we could just take a look at
17 what's happening in our network schools
18 and just count overcrowding, vacancies,
19 split grades, and missing teachers in
20 core subject areas.

21 And then briefly I just wanted
22 to say thank you to my fellow
23 Councilwoman, Maria Quinones-Sanchez, who
24 helped lead an important conversation
25 about the Berks County Detention Center.

2 We may have some communication with some
3 of the Berks County Commissioners who are
4 unhappy about the fact that Philadelphia
5 is being very vocal about a family
6 detention center an hour away from us,
7 which is housing almost exclusively
8 refugee women and children in the
9 facilities who have been there beyond
10 ICE's required 20 days. Some of them
11 have been in there for more than a year.
12 No charges, no determination of when this
13 detention ends, no solution, and no
14 resolution in fact.

15 The detention center has been
16 recommended for closure by the
17 Pennsylvania Department of State.
18 Immigration and Customs Enforcement
19 agency has already made a statement and
20 recognized that there are troubling
21 issues when we detain children for more
22 than a year, and in particular, human
23 rights groups have started to come and
24 denounce family detention as being
25 abusive and inhumane.

2 And so I want to thank my
3 colleagues. If you have any questions or
4 need to reach out, we've been invited to
5 go visit the Berks County Detention
6 Center and so would be glad to work with
7 Councilwoman Quinones-Sanchez, myself and
8 others who are interested in this issue.
9 But our belief is that this is not a law
10 and order issue. This is an issue of
11 international human rights. It's worthy
12 of international investigation, and it's
13 going to take a firm calling to draw
14 attention on family detention in
15 Philadelphia, Pennsylvania and the
16 country overall.

17 Thank you.

18 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

19 Thank you, Councilwoman.

20 The Chair recognizes Councilman
21 Squilla.

22 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Thank you,
23 Mr. President. First of all, I'd like to
24 thank all the City Councilmembers that
25 joined on Friday last week to send an

2 opposition to House Bill 1280. That was
3 going to preempt all municipalities
4 throughout the Commonwealth for any type
5 of plastic bag fee or ban or use. And
6 the importance was not whether you were
7 in favor of the ban or a fee on plastic
8 bags, but just that the preemption of the
9 Commonwealth of all the municipalities
10 throughout the Commonwealth. And I'd
11 like to thank Council President, who was
12 up there last Friday too during this
13 vote, and also to our House delegation,
14 the Philadelphia delegation, that really
15 came on strong and helped support this --
16 or oppose this up in Harrisburg and got a
17 lot of other members throughout the
18 Commonwealth to oppose this bill. And I
19 think it was a good choice. Initially it
20 didn't look good, but it got turned
21 around at the very last minute.

22 So, Council President, thank
23 you for being up in Harrisburg, and thank
24 you to our Philly delegation, the State
25 Rep Donatucci and the leadership up

2 there, and we really appreciated all the
3 help we received in Harrisburg on this.

4 So it does show that we can
5 work together with our State
6 Representatives, and looking forward to
7 continue that great relationship.

8 Thank you.

10 Thank you, Councilman. Thank you for
11 organizing the Council effort as it
12 relates to the communication.

13 The Chair recognizes Councilman
14 Domb.

15 COUNCILMAN DOMB: Thank you,
16 Council President. I just wanted to
17 share some positive news, and, that is, a
18 recent chart came out on the 21 largest
19 cities in the country, and seven cities
20 of the 21 have recovered from the 2008
21 peak in the real estate market. Fourteen
22 of them are still below the 2008 peak,
23 14. Of the seven cities, for example,
24 San Francisco, Austin, Denver, and
25 Philadelphia is one of those seven, which

2 is amazing, which really sends a better
3 message to us and, that is, we really
4 need to focus on collecting delinquent
5 taxes and correctly assessing our
6 properties. But we're one of the seven,
7 which is phenomenal.

10 Thank you, Councilman.

11 That concludes our speeches.

12 Before I ask for a motion to adjourn, I
13 just want to remind everyone that there
14 is a briefing, an update by the Energy
15 Authority. If you recall, a few months
16 back somebody promised 10,000 jobs that
17 were going to be created. I don't know
18 who that was. But there is going to be a
19 very exciting briefing about the Energy
20 Authority and the work that's going to be
21 taking place, and it lays out a timeline.
22 So it's going to be a very important
23 meeting. The members and/or their staff
24 should come to the briefing in the Caucus
25 Room at 1:30 to get an update on where
