9 Mr. President. On behalf of the
10 majority, there are no requests of leave
11 of absence today.

12 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
13 Chair thanks the gentleman.

14 The Chair now recognizes
15 Councilman O'Neill.

16 COUNCILMAN O'NEILL: Thank you,
17 Mr. President. On behalf of the
18 republicans, there are no requests for
19 leave of absence.

20 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
21 Chair thanks the gentleman.

22 At this time, I would like to
23 dispense with the regular order of
24 business and I would like to welcome
25 everyone who has come down today to

8 At this time, the Chair

10 present a resolution recognizing Mastery
11 Charter School North Women's Basketball
12 Team. Would Ayanna Mazyck and those
13 accompanying her please join the
14 Councilwoman at the podium.

15 (Councilmembers and guests
16 approached podium.)

17 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: And
18 joining Councilwoman Bass, we have
19 Councilman Oh, Councilman Jones,
20 Councilman Johnson, and Councilwoman
21 Blackwell and Councilwoman Reynolds
22 Brown.

23 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Good
24 morning. Well, let's give a round of
25 applause to our championship winning

3 Team.

4 (Applause.)

5 COUNCILWOMAN BASS: Because
6 everybody loves a winner.

7 Isn't that right, Councilman
8 Jones?

9 And so we have a resolution
10 that we'd like to read in honor of them
11 and the stellar work and the performance
12 that they've done, not just in their
13 academic studies but also in the field of
14 basketball and sports. And we want to
15 recognize our young people when they're
16 doing something great, don't we? So
17 let's celebrate them today.

18 The resolution reads:
19 Recognizing and honoring the Mastery
20 Charter School North women's basketball
21 team for winning the 2017 Philadelphia
22 Public League Championship title.

23 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL:
24 Whereas, on February 25th, 2017, Mastery
25 Charter School's "Lady Pumas" won the

3 title in a very close game by beating
4 Imhotep Charter 57 to 55; and

5 COUNCILMAN OH: Whereas, the
6 win was particularly meaningful for
7 Mastery Charter because they had lost to
8 Imhotep in the previous two years
9 playoffs; and

10 COUNCILMAN JONES: Whereas,
11 forward Jayme Byers was named the game's
12 Most Valuable Player for her aggressive
13 play, for scoring 12 points including a
14 critical steal. Byers was ably assisted
15 by her teammate Devia Terry who
16 contributed an impressive nine points, 18
17 rebounds and four assists; and

18 COUNCILMAN TAUBENBERGER:
19 Whereas, Mastery Charter North coach,
20 Damien Abrams, was overjoyed at the
21 effort of the entire team that never once
22 gave up. As a result on March 3rd,
23 Mastery Charter will go on to play
24 Archbishop Wood for the all-city title;
25 now, therefore, be it

10 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Further
11 resolved, that an engrossed copy of this
12 resolution be presented to Mastery
13 Charter North coach Damien Abrams as
14 evidence of the high esteem and deep
15 admiration of this legislative body.

16 And we would like to say
17 congratulations.

18 (Applause.)

19 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: And
20 the Chair recognizes Ms. Mazyck.

21 MS. REED: Hi, everyone. My
22 name is Nia Reed and I am a Ladies Puma
23 alum from the graduating class of 2016.

24 (Applause.)

25 MS. REED: I am currently

2 enrolled at Rosemont College, and I would
3 like to say a few words in front of you
4 guys today.

5 When I think about basketball,
6 I think about a sisterhood, stronger than
7 steel. Through hard work and dedication,
8 a bond forms that connects us together,
9 and it shows on and off the court.

10 My sisters here have shown what
11 our sisterhood can accomplish. I'm
12 extremely proud of them and our coaching
13 staff this year.

14 I have not always been the
15 confident young woman that stands before
16 you. I wasn't always truly accepted in
17 high school, but my sisters loved me for
18 me.

19 I commend young girls who
20 struggle through the stereotypes of being
21 a female athlete, because playing a sport
22 does not make you one of the guys. You
23 are playing like a girl, and that is
24 better than playing like one of the guys.

25 (Applause.)

2 MS. REED: There are no
3 limitations to what a determined woman
4 can do. Through the encouragement of my
5 many coaches, I have cycled, run track
6 and cross country, and even won a few
7 awards in triathlons, but all the sports
8 that I have played helped me not only
9 stay fit and healthy, but they helped me
10 create relationships that will last a
11 lifetime.

12 Thank you.

13 (Applause.)

14 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

15 Council will be at ease.

16 Hold on. We have one more
17 speaker.

18 COACH ABRAMS: How you doing?

19 My name is Coach Damien Abrams. On the
20 behalf of Mastery Charter School and the
21 Lady Pumas, I'd like to thank you for
22 this recognition.

23 Thank you.

11 (Councilmembers and guests
12 approached podium.)

13 COUNCILWOMAN BROWN: I'd like
14 to invite up the Chairman of the Board of
15 the Philadelphia Visitors and Convention
16 Bureau and the brilliant leadership of
17 Julie Coker Graham to the podium, please.
18 Chairman DeBenedictis, Patrick Paul to
19 the podium, please.

20 (Guests approached podium.)

21 COUNCILWOMAN BROWN: So how
22 many of us got a chance to enjoy the NFL
23 Draft festivities?

24 (Applause.)

25 COUNCILWOMAN BROWN: Councilman

2 Jones and Councilman Kenyatta Johnson, do
3 you look forward to the fall Army-Navy
4 game?

5 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: That's
6 right.

7 COUNCILWOMAN BROWN: Those type
8 of experiences don't happen because we
9 dream it or wish it. There is a think
10 tank of genius hospitality professionals
11 that make that happen.

12 A couple of facts about the
13 hospitality and tourism industry. We
14 need to know that hospitality and leisure
15 is the fastest growing sector of
16 employment in Philadelphia. Councilman
17 Green would know that very well. With
18 jobs up 23 percent since 2010. Just last
19 year, we all know that we had a chance to
20 enjoy the DNC, and ultimately the DNC and
21 all of the 19 conventions in our city
22 pushed attendance to one million people.
23 That happens because of this agency.

24 This year we're going to enjoy
25 23 convention and trade shows that are

6 This morning it's a wonderful

9 Humphrey said that one of the greatest
10 gifts of life is friendship, and I have
11 received it from Wanda Paul.

12 So this morning we are
13 recognizing and honoring Wanda D. Paul
14 for her extraordinary dedication,
15 tireless advocacy, and lifetime of
16 service to the citizens of Philadelphia.

17 Whereas, Wanda D. Paul was born
18 and raised in the City of Brotherly Love
19 and Sisterly Effectiveness and is the
20 proud graduate of the Temple University
21 Fox School of Business; and

22 Whereas, Mrs. Paul began her
23 career as an auditor with Deloitte
24 Haskins and Sells in 1979, and went on to
25 serve under the Administration of our

2 city's first African American Mayor, W.
3 Wilson Goode, from 1983 to 1985, before
4 transitioning to the Philadelphia
5 Convention and Visitors Bureau; and

6 COUNCILWOMAN BLACKWELL:

7 Whereas, Mrs. Paul has represented the
8 City of Philadelphia with distinction for
9 nearly 30 years as a leader with the
10 Philadelphia Convention and Visitors
11 Bureau, the official Tourism Promotion
12 Agency for the City of Philadelphia
13 across the globe. Mrs. Paul currently
14 serves as Senior Vice President, where
15 she is responsible for administration of
16 the Philadelphia Convention and Visitors
17 Bureau budget, oversight of the
18 organization's financial operations,
19 technological improvements, and personnel
20 administration, among many other
21 responsibilities; and

22 COUNCILMAN GREEN: Whereas,
23 Mrs. Paul used her time and talents to
24 improve the quality of life in the city
25 she loves. She serves on the boards of

3 Philadelphians, including Steppingstone

10 Community Service Partnership, the

15 Mrs. Paul has showed particular devotion
16 in advancing the cause of the Urban
17 League of Philadelphia, a historic civil
18 rights organization celebrating its
19 centennial year in 2017. Mrs. Paul is a
20 lifetime member of the League and the
21 first and only woman chairperson of its
22 Board of Directors. Mrs. Paul has
23 received the organization's Whitney M.
24 Young Community Service and Volunteer of
25 the Year awards and will be a Centennial

3 Empowerment Dinner; and

4 COUNCILWOMAN PARKER: Whereas,

5 the extraordinary contributions of

6 Mrs. Paul have led to the receipt of

7 numerous awards and accolades, including

8 the Philadelphia Business Journal's Women

9 of Distinction Award, the International

10 Visitors Council Citizens Diplomacy

11 Award, the Urban Education Gimper Award,

12 the Temple University Hall of Fame Award;

13 now, therefore, be it

14 COUNCILWOMAN BROWN: Resolved,

15 that the Council of the City of

16 Philadelphia, does hereby honor,

17 recognize, celebrate and say thank you to

18 Wanda D. Paul for your extraordinary

19 dedication, tireless advocacy, and

20 lifetime of service to the citizens of

21 Philadelphia.

22 Further resolved, that an

23 engrossed copy of this citation be

24 presented to you as evidence of the

25 sincere sentiments of this legislative

3 Wanda D. Paul is an exceptional
4 human being. Let's salute her.

5 (Applause.)

6 MS. PAUL: Thank you. Thank
7 you, Blondell. Thank you,
8 Councilmembers.

9 I have the heart of
10 appreciation for three things, three
11 major things today. One is for City
12 Council for this honor. I really
13 appreciate it. Thank you so very much.
14 But, more importantly, thank you for
15 everything you do for this great city.
16 Philadelphia is the city it is because of
17 the tireless efforts of servants like
18 you, so thank you.

19 The Councilpeople that I'm
20 about to mention - Council President
21 Darrell Clarke, Councilwoman Marian
22 Tasco, Councilman Brian O'Neill, and my
23 personal friend, Councilwoman Blondell
24 Reynolds Brown - have all served on our
25 boards during my tenure. Thank you for

2 your leadership, for your service, and
3 for your support over the years.

4 I also have a heart of
5 appreciation for the Philadelphia
6 Convention and Visitors Bureau. I've
7 served under three CEOs during my 31 and

10 incomparable Nick DeBenedictis as
11 Chairman of the Board of the Philadelphia
12 Convention and Visitors Bureau.

13 I'm sorry.

14 Julie Coker Graham is the
15 incomparable CEO that I'm currently
16 serving under. Bill Giles, Bruce
17 Crawley, and Nick DeBenedictis are the
18 Chairmen that I served under. As you can
19 imagine, only three CEOs in 31 years and
20 three Chairmen in 31 years. They stick
21 around for a reason. They stick around
22 because it is, by far, the best
23 Convention and Visitors Bureau in the
24 country, and what helps make it the
25 best --

11 by thanking -- by saying that I've hit
12 the husband lottery. I married Patrick
13 Paul 20 years ago. He has been a rock
14 and an inspiration to me over those 20
15 years. So allow me, indulge me to thank
16 my husband, Patrick Paul, being a great
17 husband.

18 (Applause.)

19 MS. PAUL: Thank you all very
20 much.

21 COUNCILMAN HENON: The Council
22 will be at ease.

23 (Council at ease.)

24 COUNCILMAN HENON: The Chair
25 recognizes Councilman Johnson.

6 Can y'all stand up?

7 They're here observing us in

10 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: They are
11 the future of our city. So we just want
12 to acknowledge them.

13 Welcome to City Council,
14 everyone.

15 Thank you very much,
16 Mr. President.

17 COUNCILMAN HENON: Thank you.

18 Well, at this time, the Chair
19 recognizes Councilman Jones, who will
20 present a resolution recognizing Brent
21 "Rudy" Edwards. Would Brent "Rudy"
22 Edwards and those accompanying him please
23 join the Councilman at the podium.

24 (Councilmembers and guests
25 approached podium.)

3 recognizes Councilwoman Parker,
4 Councilman Green, Councilman
5 Taubenberger, Councilwoman Gym, and
6 Council Lady Blondell Reynolds Brown.

7 COUNCILMAN JONES: So as a
8 proud alumnus of Overbrook High School,
9 the school on the hill, we haven't seen a
10 basketball championship, Councilwoman
11 Bass, Councilman Green, in a minute. We
12 haven't seen a football championship in a
13 while from West. You know, they win the
14 Turkey Bowl. But what we do real well at
15 Overbrook is grow heroes. All right?
16 And let me just check, see if I see an S
17 on his chest or an O on his chest. It's
18 Overbrook, not Superman.

19 But I want to recognize
20 somebody that -- all too often if you
21 watch the media, they depict our young
22 people in a negative way. All too often
23 when you watch television, you only see
24 the negative side of what young people
25 represent. But what I'm showing you

2 today is the best of what we can expect
3 from our youth in this country and
4 definitely in this city. Because
5 everybody at some point in their life is
6 afraid. I don't care what you say. At
7 some point in life, you had to look
8 yourself in the mirror and find out where
9 courage lives. And at that time when
10 you're afraid, what you do next
11 determines the measure of the person.

12 I want to introduce to some and
13 reacquaint to others and recognize the
14 heroism of Brent "Rudy" Edwards that
15 occurred on the morning of Saturday, May
16 27th, 2017 when he rescued his 1-year-old
17 nephew from a fire in the Overbrook
18 section of Philadelphia.

19 Whereas, on Saturday, May 27,
20 2017, at approximately 10:30 a.m., a fire
21 started inside a toaster oven at a row
22 home on the 1000 block of Flanders Road
23 in the Overbrook section of Philadelphia.
24 Eight family members were inside the
25 residence at the time; and

2 COUNCILWOMAN BROWN: Whereas,
3 as the family escaped, they realized
4 their 1-year-old relative, Bryce, was
5 still inside as flames billowed out of
6 the window. That is when Brent "Rudy"
7 Edwards, a sophomore at Councilman Jones'
8 alma mater, Overbrook High School, ran
9 into the house to rescue his 1-year-old
10 nephew; and

11 Whereas, the house was overcome
12 with smoke as Edwards ran in. He
13 couldn't see anything as he searched
14 frantically for his nephew, then suddenly
15 he heard a sound, a baby's cough.
16 Edwards reached out, grabbed the tiny
17 arm, and scooped up his nephew Bryce.
18 Holding him close to his chest, Edwards
19 staggered back outside, where he gave the
20 baby to his mother and collapsed on the
21 landing; and

22 COUNCILMAN TAUBENBERGER:
23 Whereas, overcome by smoke inhalation,
24 Edwards was taken to Children's Hospital
25 of Philadelphia. He was released the

16 often, Philadelphia's "everyday heroes"
17 go unacknowledged when they step up and
18 act on someone else's behalf. More often
19 these days, we hear about the selfishness
20 of young people. The actions of Brent
21 "Rudy" Edwards is an example of altruism,
22 selflessness, compassion and bravery;

23 COUNCILWOMAN GYM: Whereas, it
24 is a pleasure and a great privilege to be
25 able to acknowledge a City of

10 COUNCILWOMAN GYM: Thank you
11 very much, Mr. Chair. This week a great
12 light for peace and justice went out in
13 the world and in our city. Baltazar
14 "Bal" Pinguel was a great freedom fighter
15 in his home country of the Philippines.
16 He was -- he not only was one of the
17 leaders of the largest youth and student
18 organization in the Philippines that at
19 one point gathered 75,000 members in
20 1971, he is also a founding officer of
21 Bayan, which was People's Movement, that
22 eventually toppled the Ferdinand Marcos
23 regime that had imposed martial law in
24 the Philippines.

25 Bal went to prison for his

2 beliefs. He was tortured in prison and
3 came out and kept organizing. He kept
4 organizing to demand that authoritarian
5 regimes could not have a place or a voice
6 in a rising democracy and that the best
7 counter to authoritarianism and
8 oppression within a democracy were the
9 voices of ordinary people, including our
10 youth.

11 Bal did not stop his work and
12 in his belief in revolutionary ideas and
13 ideals. We were fortunate that he came
14 to the United States, raised his three
15 sons here, devoted his life to peace and
16 justice, worked through the American
17 Friends Service Committee, and continued
18 to speak out about his experiences. He
19 demanded a better -- he demanded
20 demilitarization. He called for
21 anti-war. He wanted to see immigrant
22 groups and immigrant movements rise to
23 the forefront, and he always used his
24 incredible intellect, passion, humor, and
25 warmth to train and nurture many

2 activists in the tools and habits of
3 resistance.

4 He was a hero to everybody who
5 knew him. He was a champion of Asian
6 America, and he was a champion to
7 countless other activists around the
8 globe who believed that there is a voice

10 that at this time as we ask questions
11 about ourselves every day in a democracy
12 where we have the privilege to speak out,
13 we have a true commitment to continue
14 Bal's legacy, and I hope that this
15 resolution will be considered by my
16 members for their co-sponsorship.

15 disabled with use of aides and services

19 demonstrate a lack of transparency, and
20 this raises numerous questions regarding

22 we celebrate Disability Pride, let's not

25 urge the SRC to reject this proposal.
